



## How to Recycle Your Wireless Phone

1. Turn off the phone's power.
2. Remove your phone's SIM card, if it has one. Phones that operate on GSM networks use SIM cards. If you are not sure if your phone uses a SIM card or if you need assistance removing your SIM card, contact your wireless provider.
3. Clear the phone's memory of contacts, photos, messages and other stored information. You can go to [www.att.com/recycle](http://www.att.com/recycle) and click through to the Data Eraser tool to get instructions for doing this on your particular device.
4. Go to [www.att.com/recycle](http://www.att.com/recycle) to find the store nearest to you for recycling, download a free prepaid shipping label, request a free prepaid mailing envelope, and learn more about the importance of recycling wireless phones.
