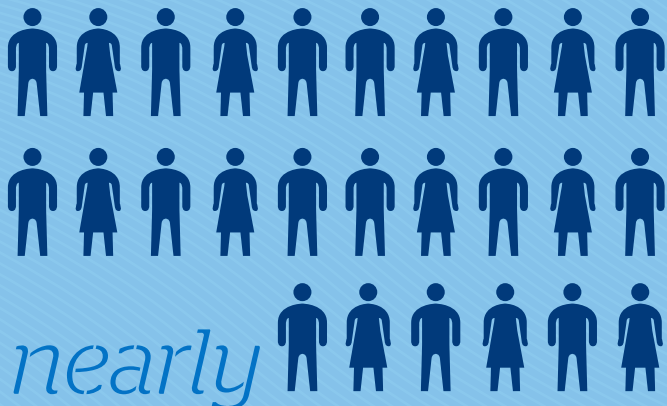


The State of Diabetes in the U.S.

Diabetes affects us all



nearly **26 M** *live with*
Diabetes

26.9% are over 65 years old

An estimated **79M** American adults aged 20 years or older with pre-diabetes.¹

Diabetes is the seventh leading cause of death in the United States¹



In 2006,

Hispanics were 1.5 times as likely as non-Hispanic Whites to die from diabetes.

Prevalence is highest among Mexican Americans and Puerto Ricans; 11.9% and 12.6%, respectively.²



One of every five health care dollars is spent caring for someone with diabetes.³

14.7% of black adults have diabetes

1 in 4 black women over 55 years of age has diabetes⁴



Medical expenses for people with diabetes are more than **two times higher** than for people without diabetes.³
