



AT&T *Access* for the Underserved

AT&T Foundation Fact Sheet

- The AT&T Foundation's new signature giving program is a landmark three-year, **\$100 million philanthropic initiative** that connects families and communities with technology tools that can improve lives.
- The new signature giving program is the largest single philanthropic commitment in AT&T's history and the nation's largest-ever program to provide in-home technology access.
 - The program will provide **technology access, tools and training** to low-income families, underserved communities and the organizations that work to strengthen communities.
 - The program builds on the AT&T Foundation's existing investment in technology for the underserved, which totals nearly \$83 million.
- AT&T and the AT&T Foundation will announce additional components of the signature program in coming months.
- On June 14, AT&T and the AT&T Foundation launched the key component of the initiative, a collaboration with One Economy Corporation and Habitat for Humanity affiliates that will provide technology packages, including Internet access, **to 50,000 low-income families over the next three years.**
 - Nearly half of the initiative funding will be directed through One Economy Corporation:
 - In conjunction with One Economy Corporation, the initiative will help equip **35,000** low-income households in single- and multifamily developments with technology resources.
 - The program will also help underwrite the cost of technology resources for up to **15,000** Habitat for Humanity households. All 589 Habitat affiliates in the AT&T service territory are eligible for the program.
- Participating families will receive the following:
 - **Internet Access.** AT&T Inc. will provide 24 months of AT&T Internet service, provided in kind.
 - **Technology Training.** Families will receive one-on-one computer and Internet instruction. Members of the AT&T Pioneers, the company's volunteer organization consisting of active and retired AT&T employees, will provide training in many locations. Additional Web-based curriculum and resources also will be provided.
 - **Technology Equipment.** This includes a desktop PC, monitor, modem, printer, keyboard and mouse. Habitat families will receive a technology package at no cost, and other low-income families will have access to a low-cost technology package.
