Overview

U.S. Olympic Team partner AT&T is providing a \$3 million technology upgrade to U.S. Olympic Training Centers (OTCs), giving athletes, coaches, medical personnel and staff access to world-class communications technology.

The program is designed to support athletes during the training, recovery, and rest and relaxation phases during their time at the OTCs.

Wireline and Wireless Services

AT&T is providing wireline and wireless infrastructure, including AT&T voice, data and video services at the three primary OTCs:

- **Colorado Springs, Colorado**
- **Chula Vista, California**
- **Lake Placid, New York**

AT&T wireline and wireless services in dorm rooms, gyms, and on playing fields give coaches, athletes, medical personnel and support staff a competitive edge on and off the field, including:

- Providing **distance e-learning capabilities** to athletes pursuing academic degrees.

- Allowing athletes to get **immediate feedback**, no matter the coaches' location within the facilities, whether they're a thousand feet or a thousand miles away.
