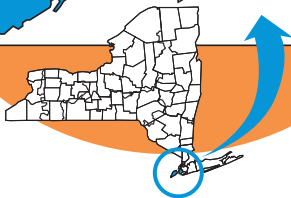
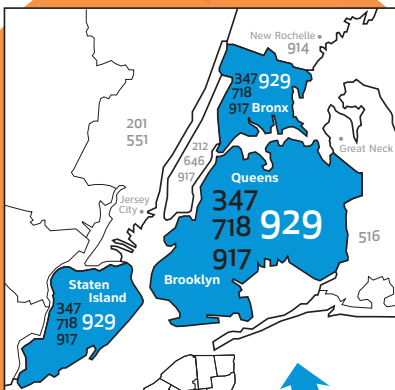

Area Code 929



## New area code 929 will overlay the 718/347 area code region of Brooklyn, Queens, Bronx and Staten Island in New York.

### **You won't have to change telephone numbers.**

Effective **April 16, 2011**, new area code 929 will be available to be assigned to new numbers in the area code region. Therefore, you will not have to change your present number.

As is currently required, 1+10-digit dialing – one plus the appropriate area code and the seven-digit telephone number – will be necessary for local and expanded local calls to be completed. Local calling areas and rates will not be affected by this change. Special services that use three-digit numbers, such as 911 and 411, as well as 1+ 10-digit long distance remain unchanged. If other three-digit numbers are currently available in your community or from your provider, such as 211, 311, 511, 611, 711 or 811, these will remain unchanged.
