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
Getting Started

Installing the nano-SIM Card and the microSDXC Card

You do not need to power off your tablet before installing or replacing the nano-SIM card or before installing or removing the microSDXC card (not included). You need to unmount the microSDXC card before removing it (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage).

WARNING! To avoid damage to the tablet, please only use a standard nano-SIM card. You can obtain a standard nano-SIM card from your service provider.

- Open the nano-SIM/microSDXC card cover on the back of the tablet.
- Insert the nano-SIM card into the nano-SIM card slot or the microSDXC card (not included) into the microSDXC card slot with the contacts facing down.
- 3. Close the cover.



Charging the Battery

Your tablet's battery should have enough power for the tablet to turn on and find a signal. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.

If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen. As you charge your tablet, the screen will tell you the exact battery level each time you wake up your tablet. **WARNING!** Use only ZTE-approved chargers and cables. The use of unapproved accessories could damage your tablet or cause the battery to explode.

Important: Do not change the built-in rechargeable battery in your device by yourself. The battery can only be changed by ZTE or ZTE authorized service provider.

- Plug the USB Type-C connector into the charging/USB Type-C jack on the left of your tablet...
- Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet. If the tablet is on, you'll see a charging icon, such as or , appear in the Status Bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged. **NOTE**: If the battery is extremely low, you may be unable to power on the tablet even when it is being charged. In this case, try again after charging the tablet for at least 20 minutes. Contact customer service if you still cannot power on the tablet after prolonged charging.

Extending the Battery Life

Active applications, screen brightness levels, Bluetooth and Wi-Fi usage, and GPS functionality can drain your battery. You can follow the helpful tips below to conserve your battery power:

- Reduce the screen backlight time.
- Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn auto-sync, Wi-Fi, and Bluetooth off when not in use.
- Disable the GPS function when not in use. Most applications using this function will periodically query the GPS satellites for your current location; each query drains your battery.

Powering Your Tablet On/Off

- Press and hold the Power/Lock key to power on your tablet.
- To turn it off, press and hold the Power/Lock key to open the options menu. Tap Power off.

NOTE: If the tablet freezes or takes too long to respond, press and hold the **Power/Lock** key for about 10 seconds to restart the tablet.

Setting Up Your Tablet for the First Time

To set up the tablet, follow the on-screen prompts when you first power on your tablet after you purchase it or after performing a factory reset (see Settings – Device – Backup & reset).

 Tap the language field to select the language you want, and tap LET'S GO. 2. Follow the prompts to set up your Wi-Fi connection, Google account, Google services, and other options.

Locking/Unlocking the Screen and Keys

Your tablet allows you to quickly lock the screen and keys (put the tablet into Sleep mode) when not in use and also to turn the screen back on and unlock it when you need it.

Locking the Screen and Keys

To quickly turn the screen off and lock the keys, press the **Power/Lock** key.

NOTE: To save battery power, the tablet automatically turns off the screen after a certain period of time when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive notifications while the tablet screen is off.

Unlocking the Screen and Keys

- 1. Press the Power/Lock key to turn the screen on.
- 2. Press and hold a blank area of the screen.

NOTE: If you have set an unlock pattern, PIN, or password for your tablet (see Personalizing – Protecting Your Tablet With Screen Locks), you'll need to draw the pattern or enter the PIN/ Password to unlock your screen.

Using the Touch Screen

Your tablet's touch screen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

- Tap When you want to type using the on-screen keyboard, select on-screen items (such as application and settings icons), or press on-screen buttons, simply tap them with your finger.
- Press and Hold To open the available options for an item (for example, a message or link in a web page), press and hold the item.
- Swipe or Slide To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.
- Drag To drag, press and hold your finger with some pressure before you start to move your finger. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.
- Pinch In some apps (such as Maps and Gallery), you can zoom in and out by placing two fingers on the screen at once and pinching them together (to zoom out) or spreading them apart (to zoom in).
- Rotate the Screen For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the tablet sideways.

NOTE: You can access the screen rotation control by sliding down the Status Bar twice and tapping **Auto-rotate**.

Getting to Know Your Tablet



Key Functions

| Key | Function |
|------------------------|---|
| Power key | Press and hold to turn Airplane mode on or off, to restart, or to power off. Press to change your tablet to Sleep mode. Press to wake up your tablet. |
| Home key | Press to return to the home screen from any application or screen. Press to access TV Mode from the home screen. Press and hold to access Google Search™. |
| Back key | Press to go to the previous screen. |
| Recent apps key | Press to see recently used applications. When in an app, press and hold to split the screen. |
| Volume key | Press or hold to turn the volume up or down. |
| Quick Launch button | Press for quick access to TV Mode, or any other selected app. |

NOTE: Not all apps support split screen.

Getting to Know the Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your tablet's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your home screen by adding shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more.



Extending the Home Screen

The home screen extends beyond the screen width, giving you a lot more space to add more shortcuts and widgets. Simply swipe your finger on the screen to see the extended home screen panels. You can add or remove home screen panels or adjust the order.

Adding a New Home Screen Panel

- From the home screen, press and hold an empty area of the home screen, and then tap Widgets.
- Slide the home screen thumbnails left until you see on the screen.
- 3. Tap 🔠 and a new home screen will be automatically added.

Deleting a Home Screen Panel

- Press and hold an empty area of the home screen, and then tap Home.
- 2. Slide the home screen thumbnails left or right. Tap X on the top right corner of a thumbnail.
- 3. Tap **OK**. The items on the panel will also be removed.

NOTE: Your tablet cannot have less than two home screens.

Adjusting the Order of a Home Screen Panel

- Press and hold an empty area of the home screen, and then tap Home.
- 2. Slide left or right to view the home screen thumbnails.
- Press and hold a thumbnail and drag it left or right to the place you need.

NOTE: Tap \bigcap at the bottom of a home screen thumbnail to set it as the main home screen.

Personalizing

Changing the System Language

- From the home screen, tap > Settings > Languages & input > Languages.
- To add a system language, tap Add a language and then tap the language you need.
- 3. Press and hold a language and move it to the top to switch to that language.

Setting the Date and Time

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Date & time.
- 2. Set the date, time, time zone, and date/time format.
 - To adjust the date and time automatically, tap to toggle on Automatic date & time
 - To adjust the date and time manually, tap to toggle off Automatic date & time and tap Set date / Set time to change the date and time.
 - To adjust the time zone automatically, tap to toggle on Automatic time zone.
 - To adjust the time zone manually, tap to toggle off Automatic time zone and tap Select time zone to set the correct time zone.
 - To adjust the format of time and date, tap to toggle on Use 24-hour format.

Changing Ringtone and Notification Sound

You can customize the default phone ringtone and notification sound, and the default alarm ringtone.

- From the home screen, tap

 > Settings > Sound.
- Tap Phone ringtone, Default notification ringtone, or Default alarm ringtone.
- 3. Select the ringtone you want to use.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Turning System Sounds On/Off

- From the home screen, tap
 => Settings > Sound > Other sounds.
- Tap Screen locking sounds, Charging sounds, Touch sounds, Vibrate on tap, or Power up tone to toggle on and off.

Adjusting Volumes

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Sound.
- Drag the sliders below Media volume, Alarm volume, Ring volume, and Notification volume to adjust the volume for each type of audio.

NOTE: You can adjust the media volume when a media application is in use by pressing the **Volume** key. If no media application is active, press the **Volume** key to adjust ringtone volume (or the earpiece volume during a call).

Using Do Not Disturb Mode

You can limit interruptions with Do not disturb mode. This mode silences your tablet so that it doesn't make sounds or vibrate when you don't want it to.

- From the home screen, tap

 Settings > Sound > Do not disturb.
- 2. Tap **Do not disturb** and select **On** or **Scheduled** as you need.
 - Tap On to turn on Do not disturb mode immediately. It will remain on until you turn it off.
 - Tap Scheduled to select time periods for Do not disturb mode to be turned on automatically.
- 3. Set the detailed settings.
 - If you have selected Scheduled, tap Days, Start time, and End time to specify the time periods during which Do not disturb mode is on.
 - Tap Disturb rules to choose whether you'd like to allow certain notifications or not.
 - Priority only: Only notifications you have marked as priority are allowed.
 - ► Alarms only: Only alarms are allowed.
 - ▶ Total silence: No notifications are allowed.
 - If you have selected Priority only, you can customize
 the types of allowed sounds or vibrations under Priority
 interruptions. Tap the switches next to the items you want
 to allow. Tap Messages or Calls to set preferences for
 which messages and calls will be allowed.

NOTES:

- To turn off Do not disturb mode quickly, press the Volume key and tap END NOW.
- Do not disturb mode will not silence your alarms unless you select Total silence.
- To set exceptions based on apps, from the home screen, tap ::: > Settings > Notifications. Select an app and tap to switch on Override Do Not Disturb.

Using the Weather Widget

When you first power on your tablet after you purchase it or after performing a factory reset, the weather widget will not automatically update if **Use Google's location service to help apps** and **Improve location accuracy** are turned off during set up.

Adding Cities

- From the home screen, tap the weather widget > * > Manage city.
- Tap 4 and enter the city name or tap an option from the Top cities list.
- 3. Tap the city you want from the list to add the city.

Updating the Weather Widget

The weather displayed on the widget will not automatically update.

To manually update:

From the home screen, tap on the weather widget.

To automatically update:

- 1. From the home screen, tap the weather widget > : > Settings.
- 2. Tap On the Update automatically switch.
- 3. In the Update plan section, choose to update only the default city or to update the weather for all added cities.
- Tap Update schedule, select a time from 1 to 12 hours for automatic updates, and tap OK.

Applying New Wallpapers

You can set the wallpaper for the home screen and lock screen.

- 1. Press and hold any blank area of a home screen.
- 2. Tap Wallpapers.
- 3. Tap Lock screen or Home screen.
- Swipe left or right on the wallpaper panel to select a wallpaper, or tap PHOTOS or LIVE WALLPAPER to choose the image or animation you want to use as the wallpaper.

NOTE: In addition, from the home screen, you can tap > Settings > Display > Wallpaper to pick an image from Photos, Wallpapers, or an animation from Live Wallpapers.

Changing the Screen Brightness

 From the home screen, tap > Settings > Display Brightness level. 2. Drag the slider to manually adjust the screen brightness. **NOTE**: With the proximity and light sensor, your tablet can automatically adjust the screen brightness for available light. Tap **Adaptive brightness** in the Display settings screen to turn the feature on or off.

Setting the Theme

You can change the icon style by changing themes.

- 1. Press and hold any blank area of a home screen.
- 2. Tap Themes.
- 3. Select the theme you like.

Setting the Home Screen Transition Effect

- 1. Press and hold any blank area of a home screen.
- 2. Tap Home.
- Tap an effect, and the tablet will demonstrate how it works.Tap other effects until you find your favorite one.

Protecting Your Tablet With Screen Locks

You can protect your tablet by creating a screen lock. When enabled, you need to swipe up on the screen, and then draw a pattern or enter a numeric PIN or password to unlock the tablet's screen and keys.

- 2. Tap None, Long press, Pattern, PIN, or Password.
 - Tap **None** to disable screen lock protection.
 - Tap Long press to enable screen lock and allow unlocking with a "press and hold" gesture. You can unlock the screen by pressing and holding a blank area on the lock screen.
 - Tap Pattern to create a pattern that you must draw to unlock the screen.
 - Tap **PIN** or **Password** to set a numeric PIN or a password that you must enter to unlock the screen.
- For Pattern, PIN, or Password lock, select either Require pattern/PIN/password to start device or No thanks. NOTE: When this feature is enabled, your tablet cannot receive calls, messages, or notifications, including alarms until it starts up.
- 4. For Pattern, PIN, or Password lock, select how you would like notifications and their contents to show when the tablet is locked, and then tap **DONE**.

Protecting Your Tablet With Screen Pinning

You can use the screen pinning feature to keep an app in view, so others cannot switch to other apps or access your personal information.

Turning On Screen Pinning

- From the home screen, tap
 Settings > Security > Screen pinning.
- 2. Tap the On/Off switch.
- If you want to ask for the unlock pattern, PIN or password before unpinning the screen, switch on Ask for unlock pattern/PIN/password before unpinning.

Pinning a Screen

- 1. Ensure that screen pinning is turned on.
- 2. Open the app you want to keep in view.
- 3. Tap the **Recent apps** key.
- If there are many app tabs, swipe up to find ① on the frontmost tab.

Unpinning the Screen

To unpin the screen and return to normal use, press and hold the **Back** key.

If you have turned on **Ask for unlock pattern/PIN/password before unpinning**, press and hold on the lock screen and draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password.

Knowing the Basics

Monitoring the Tablet Status

The Status Bar at the top of the home screen provides notification icons on the right side. Below are some of the icons you may see.

Managing Notifications

The Status Bar at the top of the home screen provides notification icons on the left side. Below are some of the icons you may see.

Opening/Closing the Notification Panel

Notifications report the arrival of new messages, calendar events, and alarms, as well as ongoing events. You can open the Notification Panel to view the details of notifications.

- To open the Notification Panel, swipe your finger down from the top of the screen.
- To close the Notification Panel, swipe your finger up from the bottom of the screen or press the Back key.

Managing and Removing Notifications

In the Notification Panel, you can respond to a notification or remove the notifications. The Notification Panel also supports expandable notifications that let you perform additional actions right from the notification itself.

- Slide down with one or two fingers to expand certain notifications. You can also pinch or spread two fingers on a notification to collapse or expand certain notifications.
- To remove a notification, swipe it left or right.
- To remove all notifications, tap CLEAR ALL.
- To manage notifications you have received, press and hold a notification. You can then tap Show notifications silently
 DONE to hide future notifications from this app, or tap MORE SETTINGS to configure other notification options for this app.

NOTE: If you turn off notifications for an app, you may miss its important alerts and updates. The notifications of some apps cannot be turned off.

Using Quick Settings

The Quick Settings in the Notification Panel make it convenient to view or change the most common settings for your tablet. Swipe down with two fingers from the top of the screen, or open the Notification Panel and drag the panel downward to view the following Quick Settings:

 Brightness: Uncheck AUTO and drag the brightness slider to adjust the screen brightness.

- **Wi-Fi**: Tap to turn on or off Wi-Fi. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- **Bluetooth**: Tap to turn on or off Bluetooth. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- TV MODE: Tap to turn on or off TV mode. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- Sound / Vibrate / Silent: Tap to switch among silent mode, vibrate mode, and sound mode.
- Dolby On/Dolby off: Tap to turn Dolby on or off.
- Location: Tap to turn on or off the GPS function. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- Airplane mode: Tap to turn on or off the airplane mode.
- **Data**: Tap to enable or disable data access over the mobile network. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- Auto-rotate/Portrait: Tap to turn on or off the auto-rotate screen feature.
- **Battery Saver**: Tap to turn on or off the battery saver. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- Do not disturb/Priority only/Alarms only/Total silence: Tap to access the Do not disturb menu and change its settings.
- **Sync:** Tap to turn on or off auto-sync of accounts data. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- Data Saver: Tap to turn on or off data saver mode. This
 helps to reduce the data usage. Press and hold to get to the
 settings screen.

- Night Light: Tap to turn on or off night light. This makes it easier to look at your screen or read in dim light, and may help you fall asleep more easily. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- Cast: Connect to Wi-Fi display screens and project the tablet onto a larger screen. Press and hold to get to the settings screen.
- Invert colors: Tap to turn the Color inversion feature on or off. Press and hold to open the Accessibility menu.

NOTE: In the Quick Settings screen, tap ***** at the top to get to the Settings menu; tap **(S)** to switch between owner and guests; tap **(Z)** to change control switch position.

Managing Shortcuts and Widgets

Adding Shortcuts and Widgets

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) to view apps.
- 2. Or, to view widgets, press and hold an empty area of the home screen and select **Widgets**.
- 3. Swipe to browse the available apps or widgets.
- Press and hold a widget or an app icon and drag it to a home screen panel.

NOTE: While holding the item, you can drag it to the right edge of the screen to create a new home screen panel.

Moving Shortcuts and Widgets

- 1. Press and hold a shortcut or widget on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to the place you need.

NOTE: To move icons to another home screen panel, drag them to the right or left edge of the screen and release them when the display shows the adjacent panel.

Removing Shortcuts and Widgets

- 1. Press and hold a shortcut or widget on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to it to remove it.

Adjusting Widget Size

- Press and hold a widget on the home screen and then release it
- An outline appears around the widget. Drag the outline to resize the widget.

NOTE: Not all widgets can be resized.

Organizing With Folders

You can create folders on the home screen and add several shortcuts to a folder. You can move or remove folders the same way as moving or removing shortcuts.

- 1. Press and hold an icon on a home screen until appears.
- 2. Drag the icon to and release it. A new folder will be created and the icon is put into the folder.
- 3. To add more shortcuts into the folder, press and hold each icon and drag it over the folder before releasing it.

NOTE: Tap the folder and then tap the name field to rename the folder.

Rearranging the Primary Shortcuts

The home screen includes a customizable primary shortcuts area at the bottom of all home screens. You can keep up to six items in addition to Apps in the primary shortcuts area. Drag shortcuts or folders in or out of the area to rearrange the area.



Entering Text

You can enter text using the on-screen keyboard. Some apps open it automatically. In others, you open it by tapping where you want to type. You can press the **Back** key to hide the onscreen keyboard. You can also enter text by speaking with the Google voice typing feature.

Changing Input Methods

- 1. When you use the on-screen keyboard to enter text, appears at the bottom.
- 2. Tap and select the input method you need.

Google Keyboard

The Google keyboard provides a layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. Turn the tablet sideways and the keyboard will change from portrait to landscape. The landscape keyboard is not supported in all applications.



Tap the alphabetic keys to enter letters. Press and hold some specific keys to enter associated accented letters or numbers. For example, to enter È, press and hold E and the available accented letters and number 3 appear. Then slide to choose È.

- Tap

 to use uppercase. Double-tap

 to lock uppercase.
 This key also changes to indicate the current case you are using:

 for lowercase,

 for uppercase, and


 when locked in uppercase.
- Tap X to delete the text before the cursor.
- Tap ?123 to select numbers and symbols. You can then tap
 to find more.
- Tap
 to select symbols and expressions.
- Tap \$\bigset\$ to use Google voice typing.
- Press and hold, to change the input language or set up the Google Keyboard

Gesture Typing

The Google keyboard supports the gesture-typing feature. Use this feature to input a word by sliding from letter to letter on the keyboard.

To enable and use gesture typing:

- Press and hold , on the Google keyboard, and then tap Google Keyboard Settings.
- Tap Gesture typing > Enable gesture typing if this feature is turned off.
- On the Google keyboard, slide your finger from letter to letter to trace a word without lifting your finger until you reach the end of the word.



NOTES:

- Tap to type when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, simply tap the key once.
- Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to trace the next word.

Google Voice Typing

Google Voice typing uses the Google voice recognition service to convert speech to text. You must have a data connection on a mobile or Wi-Fi network to use it.

- Tap \$\bullet\$ to access the voice-type feature when you are using the Google keyboard.
 - -or-
 - Tap : Soogle voice typing when you are using other input methods.
- 2. When you see the microphone image, speak what you want to type.
- 3. You can continue entering text to keep it or to delete it. **TIP:** Say "comma," "period," "question mark," "exclamation mark," or "exclamation point" to enter punctuation.

TouchPal Keyboard

TouchPal Keyboard offers three layouts: **FULL**, **PHONEPAD** and **T+**. You can tap ∰ to select a layout or an input language. You can also use **Curve®** and **Wave™** to speed up text input by moving your finger from letter to letter or word from word without lifting the finger.

The FULL Layout



The FULL layout offers an input experience similar to a computer keyboard.

- The alphabetic keys: Tap the keys to enter letters. Tap a key and slide if necessary to choose more characters.
- Word prediction: Press and hold or and tap the prediction switch to turn on or off prediction.
- Pre-defined texts: Tap 12# to enter digits, symbols, and other pre-defined texts. You can tap the arrow keys to turn pages, or tap ≤ to go back to the alphabetic keys. Slide up on the space key or tap (a) to enter Emoji and emoticons.

- The delete key: Tap to delete text before the cursor.
 You can also slide left on the key to delete an entire word.
- More options: Tap to access additional functions of TouchPal, use voice input, edit text, change keyboard themes, and more.

The PHONEPAD Layout

The layout in this mode is similar to a phonepad.



Tap an alphabetic key repeatedly until the desired letter appears. You can also press and hold the key and slide left or right to choose the letter or number you need.

If word prediction is enabled (), just tap the keys once and choose the right word.

The T+ Layout



Tap to enter the left letter on the key; double-tap or flick right to enter the right letter/symbol on the key. You can also tap and hold a key and slide left or right to choose more letters and symbols.

If word prediction is enabled (), just tap the keys and choose the right word.

Curve Word Gesture

Curve allows you to enter text by moving your finger on the screen from letter to letter to enter each word.

To enable and use Curve:

 On the TouchPal keyboard, tap > Settings > Smart input and check Curve® - Word gesture.

- 2. Tap the **Back** key to return to the text field. Open the TouchPal keyboard and switch to the Full layout.
- Move your finger from letter to letter on the keyboard to trace a word without lifting the finger, until you reach the end of the word.



NOTES:

- Curve is only available in the Full layout.
- Tap when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, go ahead and tap.
- Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to trace the next word.

Wave Sentence Gesture

Wave allows you to enter words by dragging candidate words to the space key.

To enable and use Wave:

- On the TouchPal keyboard, tap > Settings > Smart input and check Wave - Sentence gesture.
- Tap the Back key to return to the text field. Open the TouchPal keyboard and switch to the Full layout.
- Tap or use Curve to enter the first word. As the first word appears on the text field, candidate words appear on the keyboard for you to choose from as the following word.
- 4. Drag the correct candidate word to the space key to add the word to the text field. If no candidate word is correct, you can go on enter the words normally.



NOTE: Wave is only available in the Full layout.

Editing Text

- Move the insertion point: Tap where you want to type. The cursor blinks in the new position, and a tab appears below it. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- Select text: Press and hold or double-tap within the text.
 The nearest word highlights, with a tab at each end of the selection. Drag the tabs to change the selection.
- Cut or copy: Select the text you want to manipulate. Then tap CUT or COPY.
- Replace text with the clipboard text: Select the text you want to replace. Then tap PASTE.
- Share text: Select the text you want to share, tap SHARE, and select a method.

Opening and Switching Apps

Opening an App

- 1. From the home screen, tap 🐽 .
- 2. Tap an app to open it.

Switching Between Recently Opened Apps

- Press the Recent apps key. A list of the names and thumbnails of apps you've recently used opens. If you've been using more apps recently than can fit on the screen, you can scroll the list up and down.
- 2. Tap a thumbnail to open that app.

NOTE: You can swipe a thumbnail left or right or tap **M** on the tab to remove it from the list.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

Connecting to Mobile Networks

Controlling Mobile Data Use

To enable or disable data access:

- From the home screen, tap
 => Settings > Mobile networks > Mobile Networks.
- 2. Slide the **Mobile Data** switch to enable or disable mobile data use.

To get data services when roaming:

- From the home screen, tap > Settings > Mobile networks
 International Data Roaming.
- Slide the Mobile Data switch to enable or disable roaming. NOTE: Data roaming may incur significant roaming charges.

Select Preferred Network Type

From the home screen, tap > Settings > Mobile networks
 Preferred network type.

Setting Access Point Names

You can use the default Access Point Names (APNs) to connect to the Internet. To add a new APN, you may need to contact your service provider for the required information.

From the home screen, tap :: > Settings > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.

- 2. Tap 🕀 .
- 3. Tap each item to enter the required information.
- 4. Tap : > Save.

NOTE: To set the APN to default settings, tap : > **Reset to** default > **CONTINUE**.

Connecting to Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that can provide Internet access at distances of up to 328 feet (100 meters), depending on the Wi-Fi router and your surroundings.

Turning Wi-Fi On and Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On oposition to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Tap a network name to connect to it.
- If the network is secured, enter the password and tap CONNECT.

NOTE: Your tablet automatically connects to previously used Wi-Fi networks when they are in range.

Getting Notified of Open Networks

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On oposition.
- 3. Tap 🌣 .

4. Slide the **Network notification** switch to the On position. When Wi-Fi is on, you will receive notifications in the Status Bar when your tablet detects an open Wi-Fi network. Slide the Network notification switch to the Off position to turn off notifications.

Adding a Wi-Fi Network

You can add a Wi-Fi network if the network does not broadcast its name (SSID) or add a Wi-Fi network when you are out of range.

To connect to a secured network, you first need to get the security details from the network's administrator.

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On oposition.
- 3. Tap Add network.
- 4. Enter the network SSID (name). If necessary, enter security or other network configuration details.
- 5. Tap SAVE.

Connecting to a WPS Network

Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) is a feature that makes it easy to add your tablet to the access points which supply WPS. You can use one of the following methods to connect your tablet to a wireless network using WPS.

Method One: WPS Button (Recommended)

- 1. From the home screen, tap (:::) > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- Tap > Advanced > WPS Push Button.
- 4. Press the WPS button on the wireless router and the access point will recognize your tablet and add it to the network.

Method Two: PIN

- 1. From the home screen, tap (::) > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On oposition.
- Tap > Advanced > WPS Pin Entry.
- 4. The WPS PIN displays on the screen. Enter the PIN into the access point's setup page.

After entering the PIN, your tablet automatically finds the access point and configures the connection.

NOTE: For detailed information about the WPS feature of the access point, please refer to its documentation.

Forgetting a Wi-Fi Network

You can make your tablet forget the details of a Wi-Fi network that you added — for example, if you don't want the tablet to connect to it automatically or if it is a network that you no longer use.

- 1. From the home screen, tap (:::) > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On oposition.
- Tap x > Saved networks.
- 4. Tap the Wi-Fi network name and then tap **FORGET**.

Adjusting Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Tap : > Advanced to adjust the following settings.
 - Install certificates: Install certificates needed for connecting to certain Wi-Fi networks.
 - · Wi-Fi Direct: Use the Wi-Fi Direct feature.
 - WPS Push Button: Connect to a WPS network via the push button method.
 - WPS Pin Entry: Connect to a WPS network via the tablet PIN method.
 - Connect to AT&T Wi-Fi spot: Enable to automatically connect to an available AT&T Wi-Fi hotspot.
 - Connect to AT&T Wi-Fi spot: Enable or disable your tablet to automatically connect to an available AT&T Wi-Fi spot.

Using Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows Wi-Fi devices to connect to each other without the need for wireless access points (hotspots).

Connecting to another device via Wi-Fi Direct:

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. If Wi-Fi is off, slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On oposition.
- Tap : > Advanced > Wi-Fi Direct. Your tablet will search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct connections.

- 4. Tap a device name under Peer devices to connect with it. The other device will receive a Wi-Fi Direct connection prompt and need to accept the request for connection. Both devices may need to enter a common PIN. If prompted, tap ACCEPT.
- 5. Once connected, the device is displayed as "Connected."

Sending data via Wi-Fi Direct:

- Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- Select the option for sharing via Wi-Fi Direct. The method may vary by application and data type.
- 3. Tap a device the tablet has connected with.

Connecting to Bluetooth Devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology. Tablets or other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information wirelessly within a distance of about 32 feet (10 meters). The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed, and you can stream to two Bluetooth devices at once.

Turning Bluetooth On/Off

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On or Off position. When Bluetooth is on, the ≱ icon will appear in the status bar. Your tablet will be visible to nearby devices while Bluetooth

Settings is open.

Changing the Device Name

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > Bluetooth.
- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position if Bluetooth is off.
- 3. Tap : > Rename this device.
- 4. Edit the name and tap RENAME.

Pairing With Another Bluetooth Device

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Bluetooth.
- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position if Bluetooth is off.
 - Your tablet automatically scans for and displays the IDs of all available Bluetooth devices in range. You could tap :> Refresh if you want to scan again.
- 3. Tap the device you want to pair with.
- Confirm that the Bluetooth passkeys are the same between the two devices and tap PAIR. Alternately, enter a Bluetooth passkey and tap PAIR.
 - Pairing is successfully completed when the other device accepts the connection or the same passkey is entered.

NOTE: The Bluetooth passkey may be fixed for certain devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits. You can try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common passkeys), or refer to the

documents for that device.

Unpairing From a Bluetooth Device

You can make your tablet forget its paired connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the device again, you may need to enter or confirm a passkey again.

- From the home screen, tap :: > Settings > Bluetooth and make sure Bluetooth is turned on.
- In the list of paired devices, tap to beside the Bluetooth device you want to unpair from.
- 3. Tap FORGET.

Sending Data via Bluetooth

- Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- 2. Select the option for sharing via Bluetooth. The method may vary by application and data type.
- 3. Tap a Bluetooth device the tablet has paired with or wait for search to discover new devices and tap one of them.

Receiving Data via Bluetooth

- Turn Bluetooth on before trying to receive data via Bluetooth.
 - **NOTE**: If the tablet has not been paired with the sending device, you may need to tap your tablet's device name in the Bluetooth menu in Settings to keep the tablet detectable through Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap ACCEPT when the file sharing prompt appears, or swipe

down on the status bar and tap ACCEPT.

Depending on whether a microSDXC card is installed, received files are stored automatically in a dedicated folder (Bluetooth, for instance) in the tablet storage or microSDXC directory. You can access them in the File Manager. Received contacts (vCard files) are automatically imported to your contact list.

Connecting to Your Computer via USB

You can connect your tablet to a computer with a USB cable and transfer music, pictures, and other files in both directions. Your tablet stores these files in internal storage or on a removable microSDXC card

Connecting Your Tablet to a Computer via USB

- 1. Connect your tablet to the PC with a USB cable.
- 2. Choose one of the following options:
 - · Charge only: Charge your tablet via USB.
 - **Install driver**: Select this option when features are enabled for the first time or when they're unavailable.
 - Media device (MTP): Transfer media files on Windows® or Mac®.

NOTE: For Windows XP, please install the drivers and Media® Player 11 (or later version) when you use Media device (MTP) for the first time.

• Camera (PTP): Transfer photos using camera software.

NOTE: To make your tablet connect to the computer automatically using the selected connection type, check **Don't**

ask me again.

Connecting With Windows Media Player

You can sync music with your tablet and your computer installed with Windows Media Player.

- Connect the tablet with your computer via USB and choose Media device (MTP).
- 2. Open Windows Media Player and synchronize music files.

Disconnecting Your Tablet From the Computer

To disconnect the tablet from the computer, simply unplug the USB cable when you're finished.

Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage

You can use your microSDXC card as portable storage for photos, media, and other files so that you don't lose them, or you can format the card for use as internal storage.

Setting Up the microSDXC Card as Portable Storage

When you install a microSDXC card that has not been used on your tablet before, the tablet will mount the card as portable storage by default.

You can also open the Notification Panel and tap the microSDXC card name, select **Use as portable storage** and then tap **NEXT >**

DONE.

Removing the microSDXC Card From Your Tablet

If you need to remove the microSDXC card while the tablet is on, you should unmount it first.

- From the home screen, tap

 > Settings > Storage.
- Tap ≜ next to the card name in the Portable storage section.
- When the screen prompts the card is safely ejected, you can remove it from the tablet.

Erasing and Formatting the microSDXC Card

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Storage.
- 2. Tap the card name in the Portable storage section.
- 3. Tap Format > ERASE & FORMAT.

CAUTION: The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

Setting Up the microSDXC Card as Internal Storage

If your microSDXC card is new or doesn't have content you want to keep, you can format the card and use it as part of the internal storage. If you move the microSDXC card to another device, it must be formatted before it can be used.

- 1. From the home screen, tap 🐽 > Settings > Storage.
- 2. Tap the card name in the Portable storage section.
- 3. Tap Format as internal.
- 4. Tap ERASE & FORMAT.
- CAUTION: The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the files CANNOT be

retrieved.

 The tablet will prompt you to move your photos, files and other data from the internal storage to the microSDXC card.
 Select Move now or Move later and tap NEXT. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.

CAUTION: As part of the internal storage, the microSDXC card may have data on it that is necessary for some apps to function normally. Therefore, do not remove or replace the card randomly.

Moving data between the internal storage and the microSDXC card

With the microSDXC card as part of the internal storage, you can move your photos, files and other data between the internal storage and the card any time.

- 1. From the home screen, tap ::: > Settings > Storage.
- 2. Tap Tablet in the Device storage section.
- 3. Tap Migrate data.
- 4. Tap **MOVE**.

NOTE: Whenever you move data between the internal storage and the microSDXC card, the destination is used to save new apps and personal data (such as photos and videos) and this

destination is only accessible from a computer.

Reformatting the microSDXC card as portable storage:

If you no longer want to use your microSDXC card as internal storage, you can reformat the card as portable storage.

NOTE: Before the formatting, ensure that you have moved data and apps to the internal storage.

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > Storage.
- 2. Tap your card name below Device storage.
- 3. Tap Format as portable.
- 4. Tap FORMAT.

CAUTION: The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which files CANNOT be retrieved.

Connecting to Virtual Private Networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions to let people access local network resources when not on campus, or when connected to a wireless network.

Depending on the type of VPN you are using, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your VPN. You can get this information from your network administrator.

NOTE: You need to set a lock screen pattern, PIN, or password

before you can use credential storage.

Adding a VPN

- From the home screen, tap
 Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Tap 十.
- Enter the VPN name and server address and other information provided by your network administrator.
- 4. Tap SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN screen.

Connecting to a VPN

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Tap the VPN that you want to connect to.
- When prompted, enter any requested credentials and then tap CONNECT.

Modifying a VPN

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > More > VPN.
- Tap period be side the VPN that you want to modify.
- 3. Tap a field to edit the information.
- 4. Tap **SAVE**.

TV Mode

With TV Mode you can select an immersive entertainment experience, and to manage your favorite TV series and movies.

Setting Up TV Mode

- Tap SET UP TV MODE on the screen after you finish the setup for the first time.
- 2. Tap (→).
- 3. Select your favorite video app to drive TV Mode and tap 🕥 .
- 4. Tap **→**.
- 5. If you are prompted, log in to your account.

Turning TV Mode On/Off

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > TV mode.
- 2. Tap / to enable or disable it.

NOTE: You can also open the Notification Panel and tap **TV MODE** to turn on or off.

Starting TV Mode

You can use one of the following methods to launch the TV Mode:

- Swipe right from the home screen.
- Press and hold I from the lock screen.
- Press the Quick Launch button.
- Press the Home key from the home screen.

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Switching Between Different Apps

In addition to the default video apps on your tablet, you can also download your favorite video apps from the Play Store. And then switch between different apps.

- 1. Swipe down with two fingers from the top of the screen and tap **TV Mode**.
- 2. Tap the video app you need.
- or -
- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > TV mode.
- 2. Tap Other available apps and select the video app you need.

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Phone Calls

You can place calls from the Phone app, the Contacts app. You need login your NumberSync account before you can make calls.

Placing and Ending Calls

Placing a Call by Dialing

- 1. From the home screen, tap 🌉 .
- 2. Log in to your NumberSync account and tap >
- 3. Enter the phone number with the on-screen keypad. Tap 3. to delete incorrect digits.
- 4. Tap \$\forall \text{ below the keypad to dial.}

You can also tap $\mathbb Q$ at the top of the Phone app screen and enter the phone number or contact name you want to call. Tap the matching contact or number to place the call.

NOTES:

- To make an international call, press and hold the 0 Key to enter the plus (+) symbol. Next, enter the country code, followed by the city/area code and then the phone number.
- To redial the last call you made, press the Home key >
 \$\square\$ and tap \$\square\$ again.

End a Call

During a call, tap 🐔 on the screen.

Video Calling

Your tablet allows you to make and receive video calls. Your smartphone must be video call-capable to make and receive video calls on your secondary device using NumberSync. The Video call settings must be enabled before you can place or receive video calls. (See Phone Calls - Adjusting Your Call Settings

- Turning Video Call On or Off)

Placing a Video Call

- 1. From the home screen, tap **> ...**.
- 2. Enter the phone number with the on-screen keypad. Tap 8 to delete incorrect digits.
- 3. Tap 🛂 to place the call.

End a Call

During a call, tap on the screen.

Answering or Rejecting Calls

When you receive a phone call, the Incoming Call screen opens, displaying the Caller ID or the information about the caller that you've entered in the Contacts app. You can answer or reject

the call.

Answering a Call

Voice call

When you receive a voice call, tap 📞 to answer the call.

NOTE: To silence the ringer before answering the call, press the **Volume Up/Down** key.

Video call

When you receive a video call, tap \(\square\) to accept the call as voice call, or tap \(\square\) to answer the video call.

Rejecting a Call

When you receive a voice or video call, tap to reject the call.

Working With the Call Log

The call history is a list of all the calls you've placed, received, or missed. It provides a convenient way to redial a number, return a call, or add a number to your Contacts.

To open the call history, tap the **Home** key > **\bigsimes > \lambda**.

Placing a Call From the Call History

- 1. Open the call history.
- 2. Tap a number for more information about the call, or tap igstyle igstyle igstyle

or 🛂 beside it to call back.

Adding a Call History Number as a Contact

- 1. Open the call history.
- 2. Press and hold a number in the call log.
- 3. Tap Add to contact.
- To add the number to an existing contact, tap Add to existing contact, select a contact in the list and tap OK. To add a new contact, tap Create contact.

Delete Call History

- 1. Open the call history.
- 2. Press and hold a number in the call log.
- 3. Tap Delete all calls from this number.

Calling Your Contacts

- 1. From the home screen, tap > to display your contacts.
- Tap a contact and then tap \(\sqrt{a} \) or \(\sqrt{a} \) beside a contact to make a call.

Using Options During a Call

During a call, you will see a number of on-screen options. Tap an option to select it.

Voice call

 Tap + to make another call separately from the first call, which is put on hold.

- Tap \$\bigsledge\$ to mute or unmute your microphone.
- Tap to switch to the keypad when you need to enter a code (for example, the PIN for your voicemail or bank account) during the call.
- Tap to hold the current call.
- Tap to turn the speakerphone on or off.
- Tap to show your image.
- Tap \(\frac{1}{164} \) to add video to this call.
- Tap \$\bigce^*\$ to end the current call.

Video call

Tap + to make another call separately from the first call, which is put on hold.

- Tap to end the current call.
- Tap to hide/show your image or switch to voice call.
- Tap II to hold the current call.
- Tap to mute or unmute your microphone.

WARNING! Because of higher volume levels, do not place the

tablet near your ear during speakerphone use.

Managing Multi-party Calls

When the call waiting and three-way call features are available, you can switch between two calls or set up a conference call. **NOTE**: The call waiting and three-way call features need network support and may result in additional charges. Please contact your service provider for more information.

Switching Between Current Calls

When you're on a call, your tablet screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller ID.

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a voice call:

- Tap Answer & Hold Call | to answer the call. This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.
- Tap Answer & End Call
 to answer the call. This ends the first
 call and answers the second call.
- Tap Accept as voice call to answer the voice call as voice call.
- Tap Decline to reject the second call.

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a video call:

- Tap Accept as video call to answer the video call.
- Tap Accept as voice call to answer the video call as voice call.
- Tap Accept as voice call to answer the voice call.

Tap Decline to reject the second call.

To switch between two calls:

Tap ↑↓.

Setting Up a Conference Call

With this feature, you can talk to two people at the same time.

- 1. Place the first call.
- Once you have established the connection, tap + and dial the second number. This puts the first caller on hold.
- 3. When you're connected to the second party, tap 1. If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected. To end the conference call, tap 2.

Adjusting Your Call Settings

Setting Your Device Name

You can edit device name displayed in the My Device menu.

- 1. From the home screen, tap **> * > My Devices**.
- 2. Tap / and edit the device name.
- 3. Tap Save.

Changing the E911 address

You can edit or add emergency 911 address. If you call 911using NumberSync on the tablet and emergency services can't locate

you, they'll go to the address you enter.

- Tap / to edit a default address or tap + to add a new address.
- 3. Set the address options, such as name of address, house number, street name, city, and others.
- 4. Tap Verify Address.

Caller ID

Choose whether your number is displayed when someone receives your outgoing call.

- 1. From the home screen, tap Z > 🗘 > Caller ID.
- 2. Tap an available option (Network Default, Hide Number, Show Number).

Forwarding Incoming Calls

Call forwarding feature allows you to forward your incoming calls to another phone number.

Enabling forwarding incoming calls

- 2. Tap an available option (Always forward, Forward when unreachable, Forward when busy, Forward when unanswered).

3. Enter a phone number and tap **Enable** to enable it.

Updating or disabling Call Forwarding

- 1. From the home screen, tap **> > Call Forwarding**.
- 2. Tap an available option (Always forward, Forward when unreachable, Forward when busy, Forward when unanswered).
- Edit the phone number and tap Update to update it, or tap Disable.

Setting Sound

Adjust different types of volume (see Personalizing – Adjusting Volumes), set Do not disturb options (see Personalizing – Using Do Not Disturb Mode), set up ringtone and notification sound (see Personalizing – Changing Ringtone and Notification Sound), select system sounds (see Personalizing – Turning System Sounds On/Off).

Setting Call Waiting

This option allows you to get notified of incoming calls during a call.

- From the home screen, tap
- 2. Tap the **Call Waiting** switch to enable or disable this feature. **NOTE**: Please contact your service provider to check whether the Call waiting feature is available.

Turning Video Call On or Off

Your tablet supports video calling. You can turn this feature on or off.

- 1. From the home screen, tap **>**
- 2. Tap the Enable Video Call switch to turn it on or off.

Changing the NumberSync Settings

- From the home screen, tap > NumberSync Setting.
- In the Accounts section, tap the account category and then the account. Make the changes and tap the Back key when you're finished.

Checking NumberSync Information

You can check the NumberSync important information.

- From the home screen, tap > > About NumberSync.
- 2. Swipe up or down to check the information.

Contacts

You can add contacts on your tablet and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing.

From the home screen, tap > Contacts to see your contacts. From there, you can tap the tabs on the top of the screen to quickly switch to contact groups or favorite contacts.

Checking Contact Details

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Scroll through the list to view all your contacts.
- 3. Tap a contact to view its details.

NOTE: If you have a lot of contacts stored, you'll see a slider on the right side of the screen. Drag the slider to the letter initial you need.

Adding a New Contact

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap 💿 to add a new contact.
- 3. Enter the contact name, phone numbers, and email addresses. Tap **More Fields** to enter other information. If you have multiple account types associated with your tablet, tap the contact account field at the top and select a contact type. If a sync account is selected, the contacts will be synced automatically with your account online.

4. Tap \checkmark to save the contact.

Setting Up Your Own Profile

You can create your own name card in your tablet.

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- Edit your profile information. Tap More Fields to add more information if desired.
- 4. Tap \checkmark to save.

Importing, Exporting, and Sharing Contacts

You can import/export contacts from/to your nano-SIM or microSDXC card. This is especially useful when you need to transfer contacts between different devices. You can also quickly share contacts using Bluetooth, Save to Drive, Email, Gmail, or Wi-Fi Direct.

Importing Contacts From the nano-SIM Card

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap > Import/Export > Import from SIM card.
- 3. Check the contacts you want to import, and then tap 💟 .
- 4. If you have added contact accounts other than the tablet, select an account in which to save the contacts.

Importing Contacts From the microSDHC Card or Tablet Storage

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- Tap > Import/Export > Import from storage.
- 3. Choose to import one, multiple, or all vCard files, and then tap **OK**.
- 4. If necessary, choose the vCard file(s) you would like to import, and then tap **OK**.

Exporting Contacts to the nano-SIM Card

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap : > Import/Export > Export to SIM card.
- 3. Tap the contacts you want to export, and then tap ...

Exporting Contacts to the microSDXC Card or Tablet Storage

- 1. From the home screen, tap :: > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- Tap > Import/Export > Export to storage.
- The tablet will prompt you with the name of the vCard file.Tap OK to create the file.

Sharing Contacts

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap : > Multi-Select.
- Tap the contacts you want to share to select them, and then tap .

4. Choose how to share the contacts. The options available depend on the applications and services installed.

NOTE: You can also share your contacts by choosing **Share** visible contacts in the Import/Export contacts menu.

Working With Favorite Contacts

You can add the contacts you use frequently to **FAVORITES** so that you can find them quickly.

Adding a Contact to Favorites

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap a contact and then tap $\stackrel{\wedge}{\curvearrowright}$ at the top of the screen.

Removing a Contact From Favorites

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Contacts > FAVORITES.
- 2. Tap a favorite contact and then tap ★ .

Working With Groups

Viewing Your Contact Groups

- 1. From the home screen, tap :: > Contacts > GROUPS.
- Scroll through the list to view the preset groups and any groups you have created.
- 3. Tap a group to view its members.

NOTE: To send messages or emails to selected group member, tap a group > • > Send Group email and select group members to include.

Setting Up a New Group

- 1. From the home screen, tap (::) > Contacts > GROUPS.
- 2. Tap 😑 to create a new group.
- 3. If you have added contact accounts other than the tablet, tap to choose an account for the new group.
- 4. Tap Group's name and enter a name.
- Tap Add member and select the contacts you wish to be the group members.
- 6. Tap 🗸 .
- 7. Tap \checkmark to save the group.

Deleting a Group

- 1. From the home screen, tap :: > Contacts > GROUPS.
- 2. Tap a group and then tap : > Delete group.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Editing a Group

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Contacts > GROUPS.
- 2. Tap a group > : > Edit group.
- Tap the group name to edit it, or tap the field below MEMBER to add more members.

NOTE: To remove group members, tap a group and then tap > Multi-Select and choose the members you would like to remove. Tap = > OK.

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Searching for a Contact

- Input the contact name you want to search for. The contacts matched will be listed.

Editing Contacts

Editing Contact Details

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap a contact and then tap /.
- 3. Edit the contact and tap \checkmark .

Deleting Several Contacts

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- Tap > Multi-Select.
- Tap to select the contacts you want to remove, and then tap.
- 4. Tap **OK** to confirm.

Linking Contacts

As your tablet synchronizes with multiple online accounts, you may see duplicate entries for the same contact. You can merge all the separate information of a contact into one entry in the Contacts list.

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- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap a contact to display the contact's details.
- Tap the contact whose information you want to join with the first entry.
- 5. Tap 🗸 .

NOTES:

- The information from the second contact is added to the first, and the second contact is no longer displayed in the CONTACTS list.
- You can repeat these steps to join another contact to the main contact.

Unlinking Contact Information

If contact information from different sources was joined in error, you can separate the information back into individual contacts on your tablet.

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Contacts > CONTACTS.
- 2. Tap a contact you want to separate.
- 4. Tap **UNLINK** to confirm.

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Accounts

Adding or Removing Accounts

You can add multiple Google accounts and Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync® accounts. You may also add other kinds of accounts, depending on the apps installed on your tablet.

Adding an Account

- From the home screen, tap
 => Settings > Accounts > Add account.
- 2. Tap the type of account you want to add.
- Follow the on-screen steps to enter the information about the account. Most accounts require a user name and password, but the details may vary. You may also need to obtain some information from IT support or your system administrator.

When the account is successfully added, it is displayed in the Accounts section in the Settings menu.

Removing an Account

Removing an account will delete it and all information associated with it from your tablet, such as emails and contacts.

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. In the Accounts section, tap the account category and then tap the account you'd like to remove.
- Tap > Remove account > REMOVE ACCOUNT.

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Configuring Account Sync

Configuring Auto-sync Settings

- Swipe down on the Notification Panel with two fingers to open the Quick Settings menu.
- 2. Tap **Sync** to enable or disable the auto-sync feature.
 - When automatic sync is turned on, changes you make to information on your tablet or on the web are automatically synced with each other.
 - When automatic sync is turned off, you need to sync manually to collect emails, updates, or other recent information.

Syncing Manually

- 1. From the home screen, tap : > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. In the Accounts section, tap the account category and then the account you want to sync.
- 3. Tap : > Sync now. Or tap the types of information you want to sync.

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Changing an Account's Sync Settings

- 1. From the home screen, tap ::: > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. In the Accounts section, tap the account category and then the account. The Sync settings screen appears, showing a list of information the account can sync.
- When auto-sync is enabled, check or uncheck items as you need. Checked types of information on the tablet and the web will be kept in sync when auto-sync is turned on. When auto-sync is disabled, tap an item in the list to sync that type of information between the tablet and the web.

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Email

From the home screen, tap . Use it to read and send emails from Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync, Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo!®, and others.

Setting Up the First Email Account

- When you open Email for the first time, tap an email type and then enter your email address and password.
- Tap Next to let the tablet retrieve the network parameters automatically.
 - **NOTE:** You can also enter these details manually by tapping Manual setup or if automatic setup fails.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish setup. Your tablet will show the inbox of the email account and start to download email messages.

Writing and Sending an Email

- Open your email Inbox and tap .
 NOTE: If you have more than one email account added on the tablet, tap the sender line to select the account you want to use for sending the message.
- Enter a contact name or email address in the To field.
 Separate each recipient with a comma. You can also tap + to select recipients from your contacts, groups or call history.

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- 3. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
- Tap to add audio files, images, videos, and other types of files as attachments.
- 5. Tap > at the top of the screen to send the message.

Checking Your Emails

Your tablet can automatically check for new emails at the interval you set when setting up the account.

You can also manually check for new emails by dragging down on the message list.

Responding to an Email

You can reply to or forward a message that you receive. You can also delete messages and manage them in other ways.

Replying to or Forwarding an Email

- Open the email you want to reply to or forward from the Inbox.
- 2. Choose one of the following:
 - ► To reply to the sender, tap 🧄 .

 - ► To forward the message, tap ⇒.

3. Edit your message and tap > .

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Marking an Email as Unread

You can return a read email to the unread state— for example, to remind yourself to read it again later. You can also mark a batch of emails as unread.

- While reading a message, tap :> Mark unread.
- While in a message list (for instance, the Inbox), tap the sender image before the message and then tap

Deleting an Email

You can delete an email from its folder. You can also delete a batch of emails.

- While in a message list (for instance, the Inbox), tap the sender image before the message and then tap

Deleting an Email Account

- 1. Open Email app.
- 2. Tap == > Settings and tap the account you want to remove.
- Tap Remove account from this device > OK to confirm. All email messages in the account will be deleted.

Changing General Email Settings

General settings apply to all email accounts you add.

- 1. Open **Email** app.
- Tap == > Settings > General settings.
- 3. Make the changes and tap the **Back** key when you're finished.

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Browser

Use Browser to view web pages and search for information.

Opening the Browser

To open Browser, from the home screen, tap 💰 .

If Browser is recently used, the last web page you were viewing is displayed. If you have not used Browser recently, your home page opens.

Browser also opens when you tap a web link – for example, in an email or a text message.

- 1. From the home screen, tap 💰 .
- 2. Tap the address box at the top of the web page.
- Enter the address (URL) of a web page. Or, enter terms you want to search for.
- 4. Tap a URL or search suggestion or tap → on the keyboard to open the web page or search results. You can also tap ↓ to search by voice.

Using Multiple Browser Tabs

You can open several web pages at the same time (one page in each tab) and switch between them freely.

Opening a New Browser Tab

Tap: > New Tab. A new browser tab opens.

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Switching Between Tabs

- Tap (2) (the number in the icon indicates the number of opened tabs).
- 2. Swipe vertically to scroll through the list of opened tabs.
- 3. Tap the thumbnail of the tab you want to open.

NOTE: Tap \boxtimes or swipe left or right to close a tab.

Downloading Files

Press and hold an image or a link to a file or to another web page. In the menu that opens, tap **Save link** or **Save image**. The downloaded files are saved to your tablet or the memory card. You can view or open them in the Downloads app.

Changing Browser Settings

You can configure a number of Browser settings to customize the way you browse the web, including several that you can use to control your privacy.

To open the Browser settings screen, tap : > Settings.

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Camera

You can take photos and record videos. Photos and videos are stored to the tablet's memory card or to the tablet's internal storage.

Capturing a Photo

- 1. From the home screen, tap .
- 2. Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustments. AUTO camera mode is used by default.
- Tap the area on the screen where you want the camera to focus, or let the camera autofocus on the center of the image.
- 4. Tap 💿 .



| Number | Function |

NOTE: You can pinch or spread your fingers on the screen or press the **Volume** key to zoom in or zoom out before taking a picture.

Recording a Video

- 1. From the home screen, tap 💽 .
- Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustments. You can tap any area on the screen that you want the camcorder to focus on before and during recording.

NOTE: You can pinch or spread your fingers on the screen or press the **Volume** key to zoom in or zoom out before and during recording.

Tap to start and to stop recording. You can also tap to pause or resume recording.

NOTE: While recording is in progress, you can tap **o** to save the frame as a photo.

Using Manual Camera Mode

You can use manual camera mode to adjust more camera options for your photo, such as ISO, white balance, exposure, etc.

- 1. From the home screen, tap .
- 2. Tap MANUAL.
- Aim the camera at the subject and you can make the following adjustments.
 - Drag the white circle to any area on the screen that you want to focus on.
 - Drag the green square to any area on the screen where you want the camera to meter exposure so as to adjust the photo brightness.
 - Tap to show the grid or the golden spiral, or hide grid overlays.
 - Tap to turn gradienter on or off.
 - Tap on to change white balance scenario or leave it at Auto

- Tap so to select ISO level or leave it at Auto.
- Tap to adjust the photo exposure.
- 4. Tap o to take the photo.

Using Other Camera Modes

Besides capturing photos and videos in the traditional way, your Camera app offers other creative and entertaining camera modes. Switch to the rear-facing camera and tap **CREATIVE** to find them all.

- SPECIAL EFFECTS: Apply warm, cool, sepia, fisheye, or other special effects to the photo.
- HDR: Turn on the HDR feature.
- PANORAMA: Capture panorama pictures.
- SMILE: Capture pictures automatically when a smile is detected.
- INTERVAL: Capture pictures according to the time interval you choose (0 to 60 seconds).

Customizing Camera and Video Settings

Before capturing a photo or video, you can tap to open the following camera setting options:

CAMERA

 Picture size: Set the image size for your photo. Available on front-facing camera only.

Shutter tone: Turn the shutter tone on or off.

- Geo-tagging: Select whether to store the GPS location in your captured photos.
- Review: Select whether to review the picture after you took it. You can also set the review time.
- Storage location: Tap Save location to change the storage location for captured photos.
- Restore defaults: Restore default camera settings.

NOTE: Some camera options will change in different camera modes.

VIDEO

- Video quality: Set the quality for your video.
- Time lapse: Set the time interval between each frame when recording videos using the rear-facing camera.
- Focus lock when recording: Select whether to lock the focus point on the center of the screen when recording videos using the rear-facing camera.
- Geo-tagging: Select whether to store the GPS location in your captured videos.
- Storage location: Tap Save location to change the storage location for captured videos.
- Restore defaults: Restore default camcorder settings.

NOTE: Some video options will change in different camera modes.

Music

From the home screen, tap (iii) > Music to play audio files stored on your tablet. Music supports a wide variety of audio formats, so it can play music you purchase from online stores, music you copy from your CD collection, and so on.

Copying Music Files to Your Tablet

Before using Music, you need to copy or download audio files to your tablet.

Copy From a Computer

- 1. Connect your tablet and the computer with a USB cable.
- Tap Media device (MTP) or USB mass storage as the connection mode (See Connecting to Networks and Devices-Connecting to Your Computer via USB-Connect Your Tablet to a Computer via USB).
- Copy the music file from the PC and paste it to the tablet storage or microSDHC card.

Download From the Internet

You can download music files when browsing web pages (See Browser-Downloading Files).

Receive via Bluetooth

You can receive music files from other devices via Bluetooth. (See Connecting to Networks and Devices-Connecting to Bluetooth® Devices-Receive Data via Bluetooth).

Viewing Your Music Library

From the home screen, tap (iii) > Music and your music library is displayed. All your audio files are cataloged according to the information stored in the files.

- · Tap All Songs to view all music files on your tablet.
- Tap Favorites to browse music files you have marked as favorites.
- Tap Playlists to view all music playlists you have created.
- Tap Artists/Albums to browse music files on your tablet organized by the artist or album name.
- Tap Folders to find music files through the folders they are stored in.

NOTES:

If an audio file is being played, its name and player controls are displayed at the bottom of the screen. Tap the area to open the playback screen.

Playing Music

Tap a song in the music library to listen to it. The following playback screen appears.

Managing Playlists

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs, so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer.

- Tap next to a song and select Add to playlist to add it to a
 playlist or create a new playlist.
- Tap next to a playlist in the Playlists screen of the music library and select Rename or Delete to rename or delete the playlist.
- Tap a playlist to view its content. You can tap > Remove to select the songs you want to remove.

NOTE:

The above options may not be available for certain automatically created playlists, such as **Recently Added**.

Video Player

Use the Video Player to manage your video library and to watch videos

Opening the Video Library

From the home screen, tap $\textcircled{\ }$ > Video Player to view your video library. Swipe up or down to find the video you want. You can also tap $\textcircled{\ }$ to search for video files, or tap $\textcircled{\ }$ > View by or Sort by to change the display mode or sort the list.

Playing and Controlling Videos

Tap a video in the video library to play it. Tap the screen to show the playback controls. You can control the video and audio or carry out other operations.

Managing Video Files

Deleting Videos

1. In the video library, tap > Multi-Select.

- 2. Tap the videos you want to delete.
- 3. Tap **> OK**.

Sharing Videos

- 1. Press and hold a video in the video library.
- 2. Tap the videos you want to share.
- 3. Tap < and select how you want to share them.

Renaming a Video

- 1. Tap ≡ next to the video you want to rename.
- 2. Tap Rename.
- 3. Type the new video name and tap OK.

Trimming a Video

- 1. Tap a video to start playing it.
- 2. Tap : > Trim.
- Drag the two tabs on the progress bar to select the portion you want to keep. You can tap to preview the selected portion.
- 4. Once the preview ends, tap . The trimmed video is saved as a new video file.

Viewing Details of a Video

- 1. Tap ≡ next to a video you want to view the details of.
- 2. Tap Details.
- Check the file title, time, duration, file size, and path. Tap CLOSE when you finish.

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FM Radio

With the FM Radio, you can search for radio channels, listen to them, and save them on your tablet. Note that the quality of the radio broadcast depends on the coverage of the radio station in your area. The wired headset works as an antenna, so always connect the headset while using the radio.

Scanning and Saving Channels

- Tap > Scan > OK. Your tablet scans for all available channels and saves them to the All channels list.

NOTE: When you open the FM Radio app for the first time, it will automatically scan for channels and show the All channels list. You can also tap All channels to view the list.

Listening to FM Radio

- 2. Tap > All channels and select a channel.

You can also drag left or right on the frequency display at the bottom of the screen or tap or bottom to switch to other channels.

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NOTES:

- Tap to add the first channel to favorites, which will be listed at the bottom of the FM Radio main screen. Tap to add more channels to favorites. Favorite channels are accessible from the FM Radio main screen. When more than four channels have been added to the favorites list, slide up to view all favorite channels.
- You can save up to 16 channels to favorites.

Editing a Saved Channel

- Open the FM Radio app and tap > All channels to display the list of saved channels.
- Press and hold a channel and select Rename or Delete, or tap the star to the right of a channel to add it to or remove it from favorites.

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Turning Off FM Radio

Turning Off Automatically

From the FM Radio main screen, tap > Sleep Timer and select the time you want to turn off the radio.

A countdown clock will appear and the radio will be turned off when the clock reaches 0:00.

Turning Off Immediately

From the FM Radio main screen, tap the ____ switch at the top of the screen.

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Sound Recorder

Sound Recorder enables you to record voice memos and listen to them whenever you like.

Recording a Voice Memo

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Sound Recorder.
- 2. Tap no turn on or off high-quality recording.
- Tap to start recording. Tap to pause and to continue recording.
- 4. Tap 🔾 to stop recording. The memo is automatically saved.

Playing a Voice Memo

Playing a Memo You Just Recorded

Tap D at the bottom of the screen.

Playing any Saved Memo

- 1. Tap = at the top right of the screen to see all recordings.
- 2. Tap the title of a memo to play it.

NOTE: You can also tap is to delete, share, rename, tag, trim, check file information, or set it as your notification ringtone.

More Apps

Calculator

From the home screen, tap (iii) > Calculator to use the tablet's convenient built-in calculator for some basic as well as advanced mathematical equations.

Clock

From the home screen, tap ::: > Clock. The Clock app allows you to check local time in places around the world, set alarms, and use timers.

Setting a New Alarm

- 1. Open the Clock app and tap 🚫 .
- 2. Tap a default alarm to configure it, or tap at the bottom of the screen to create a new alarm.
- Set up the alarm options, such as time, alarm days, snooze, alarm ringtone and label.
- 4. Tap Save to save and exit.

NOTES:

- To enable or disable existing alarms directly, tap On or Off on the right side of each alarm.
- Tap to configure alarm settings, including ringtone volume, alarm duration, vibrate when ringing, volume crescendo, and alarm in silent mode.

Using World Time

- 1. Open the Clock app and tap 🕓 .
- 2. World time lets you check local times for cities around the world. Tap 1 to add a new city.

Using Stopwatch and Countdown

- 1. Open the Clock app and tap $\overline{\mathbf{O}}$ or \mathbf{X} .
- 2. Stopwatch allows you to record lap times while countdown allows you to set a time and count down to zero.

Downloads

The Downloads app keeps a record of the files you have downloaded using apps such as Email.

From the home screen, tap :: > Downloads.

- Tap a file to open it with the appropriate application.
- Press and hold a file to delete or share it.

File Manager

Quickly access all of your images, videos, audio clips, and other files on your internal storage and the microSDXC card.

From the home screen, tap (:::) > File Manager. You can find the file you need by category in the CATEGORY tab, or tap LOCAL to browse folders and files on the tablet storage or the microSDXC card.

Tap folders and files to access stored items.

- Press and hold an item to access option icons such as copy, move, share, or delete.
- To copy or move an item, navigate to a new location and tap PASTE.
- Tap to create a new folder in the current directory.
- Tap > View by or Sort by to change the view of the list or the order of the items in the list.
- Tap > Show hidden files to show files that are hidden by default.
- Tap > Multi-Select to select multiple items for deletion, sharing, copying, moving, or compression.
- Tap > Exit to exit the File Manager app.

Google Apps

Open the Google apps to use Google services. Some apps are put in the Google folder on the home screen.

NOTE: Some content or Google services may not be available in your region.

- Chrome™: Use the Chrome app to browse the Internet and get your bookmarks, browsing history, and more synced with your Google account.
- Docs: Create, edit, and collaborate with others on documents from your tablet.
- Drive™: Store files on Google servers for free after you sign in to your Google account. You can access them on your

computers, tablets, and other devices then share them or collaborate with other users.

- Gmail: Use the Gmail service to send and receive emails.
- Google: Use Google search or get information when you need it with Google Now.
- Hangouts™: Chat with Google+ friends or send text or multimedia messages.
- KeepTM: Create, share, and collaborate notes quickly and easily.
- Maps™: Find your place and find your way in the world.
- Photos™: Manage photos on the tablet and on your Google account.
- Play Movies & TV: Purchase, download and watch the latest and your favorite movies and TV shows.
- Play Music: Play music on the tablet and on your Google account.
- Play™ Store: Buy and download apps, games, and other content from the Google Play Store.
- Sheets™: Create, edit, and collaborate with others on spreadsheets from your tablet.
- SlidesTM: Create, edit, and collaborate with others on slide presentations from your tablet.
- Voice Search™: Search for information with your voice.
- YouTube™: Watch video clips from YouTube .com, or upload your own and share with the world.

Settings

From the home screen, tap (...) > Settings. Settings contains most of the tools for customizing and configuring your device.

Wireless & networks

Wi-Fi

Turn Wi-Fi on or off and configure your Wi-Fi connections (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Wi-Fi). When Wi-Fi is on, tap * > Advanced > Wi-Fi Direct in the Wi-Fi menu to share data between two devices via Wi-Fi directly (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Wi-Fi – Using Wi-Fi Direct).

Bluetooth

Turn Bluetooth on or off and configure your Bluetooth connections (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Bluetooth Devices).

Mobile networks

Control mobile data use and data roaming (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Mobile Networks).

Data usage

Tap the **Cellular data** switch to turn on or off mobile data. You can check how much data has been used during the time cycle you set, set mobile data limit and warning, see what apps have been using mobile data, or restrict background data for individual apps.

NOTES:

- The data usage is measured by your tablet, and your carrier's s data usage accounting may differ.
- Tap Network restrictions to select Wi-Fi networks that are mobile hotspots. Data usage on recognized mobile hotspots will be restricted to avoid high mobile data bills.

Airplane mode

In the Settings app, tap More > Airplane mode to turn Airplane mode on or off. When Airplane mode is on, Wi-Fi and cellular connections are turned off

VPN

In the Settings app, tap **More > VPN** to set up and connect to virtual private networks (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Virtual Private Networks).

Network Settings Reset

In the Settings, tap More > Network settings reset > RESET SETTINGS > RESET SETTINGS to reset all your network settings, including Wi-Fi, cellular data, Bluetooth, APN, Airplane mode, and data roaming.

Device

TV Mode

Turn on or off TV Mode and switch between different video apps (see TV Mode).

Quick Launch Button

Press the **Quick launch** button to quick access to the selected app. You can also change the selected app.

- From the home screen, tap
 Settings > Quick Launch button.
- 2. Tap the app you need.

Display

- Brightness level: Set the brightness of the display.
- Adaptive brightness: Automatically adjust screen brightness.
- Night Light: Night Light tints your screen amber. This makes it easier to look at your screen or read in dim light, and may help you fall asleep more easily.
- Wallpaper: Select a background image for the home screen and the lock screen.
- Lock screen and settings: Set the shortcut on the lock screen.
- Sleep: Set the length of time of inactivity before the screen turns off automatically.
- Screen saver: Manage the Screen saver function. When this

feature is enabled, photos or animations will be displayed as a screensaver.

- Ambient display: Tap to enable/disable this feature, which causes the screen to wake when you receive notifications.
- Font size: Set the font size of the text on the screen.
- Display size: Set the size of the items on the screen.
- When device is rotated: Select whether the screen contents should rotate when the tablet is rotated.
- Pulse notification light: The indicator flashes to notify you of missed calls, new messages, and other events.

Notifications

Control the display of notifications.

Tap an app to control its notifications. You may turn off its notifications, allow it to sound in Do not disturb mode, allow it display notifications as a pop-up for quick view, or hide content in lock screen. The available options are dependent on the app. **NOTE:** The notifications of some apps cannot be turned off. Content hiding is only available if you have set a pattern, a PIN or a password as the screen lock.

Sound

Adjust different types of volume (see Personalizing – Adjusting Volumes), set Do not disturb options (see Personalizing – Using Do Not Disturb Mode), set up ringtone and notification sound (see Personalizing – Changing Ringtone and Notification Sound), select system sounds (see Personalizing – Turning System Sounds On/Off).

Apps

See apps installed on your tablet and manage them.

Tap an app to see its information. The following options may be available:

- FORCE STOP: Stop the app.
- UNINSTALL: Uninstall the app.
- DISABLE/ENABLE: Disable or enable the app.
- Storage: Check its storage information, clear its data or cache.
- Data usage: Check how much data has been used by the app during the time cycle you set and restrict background data for the app.
- Permissions: Check or change the app permissions.
- Notifications: Manage the app notifications in the notification panel and the lock screen. You can set the priority, sensitivity, and more.
- Open by default: Check the app's supported links and set whether to open the links in the app, and clear the app's defaults.
- Battery: Check the battery use details of the app since last full charge.
- Memory: Check how much memory has been used by the app.

NOTE: Not all options are available for the apps.

Storage

Check memory information for your external memory card and internal storage. You can choose the default location for new data, such as downloaded files and captured photos.

- Save location: Select Tablet or SD card to select the default location for new data, such as files downloaded, photos captured, and voice recorded.
- Tablet: You can install apps into the internal storage. When you connect your tablet to your computer, only the internal SD card is accessible from your computer
- SanDisk SD card: The external SD card storage options let you view the microSDXC card's size and available space, unmount the card for safe removal from the tablet, and format (erase) the card (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Your Computer via USB – Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage).

Battery

View remaining battery power and check which items have been using the battery.

Tap an app or setting to adjust battery saving options. For example, tap **Screen > Reduce the screen brightness and/or screen timeout** to change the brightness level and sleep timer.

Tap • Battery optimization. Battery optimization helps prolong battery standby time when you're not using the tablet. If there are apps that you don't want battery optimization enabled, you can turn the feature off in those apps. Just tap Not optimized > All apps, tap the app name and then tap Don't optimize > DONE.

Memory

Monitor the average memory use and performance of your tablet. You can also check which apps use the most memory.

Users

Manage the user accounts of your tablet.

You can share your tablet with other people by creating additional user accounts. Each user with a separate account has his/her own storage space, wallpaper, screen lock and so on. Users can also adjust device settings like Wi-Fi that affect everyone and update apps for all other users.

Location

- 1. From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Location.
- 2. Slide the Location switch to the On position to turn on location access.
- When location access is enabled, tap Mode to select location modes you want to use.
 - High accuracy: Get accurate location using GPS, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, or mobile networks.
 - Battery saving: Use Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, or mobile networks to get your approximate location. This will drain less power from your battery than using GPS in High accuracy mode.
 - Device only: Use GPS to pinpoint your location.

Security

- Screen lock: Lock the screen with long press, pattern, PIN, or password (see Personalizing – Protecting Your Tablet With Screen Locks), or select None to disable the screen lock.
- Smart Lock: Keep the tablet unlocked when connected to trusted devices, in trusted places, or unlocked by a trusted face, voice, or when you carry it on you.

NOTE: You need to sign in to your Google account on the tablet to use the Smart Lock feature.

- Encrypt tablet: Your tablet is already encrypted.
- Set up SIM card lock: Lock the SIM card and change the SIM PIN.
 - ► Lock SIM card: Activate or deactivate the PIN lock to require PIN before accessing the nano-SIM card.
 - Change SIM PIN: Change the PIN used to access the nano-SIM card.

NOTE: Put all your confidential passwords in a safe place for future use. If you enter the wrong SIM PIN more times than allowed, your nano-SIM card will be locked and you cannot access the mobile network. Contact your operator for a PIN Unlock Key (PUK) to restore the nano-SIM card.

- Make passwords visible: Display passwords as you enter them.
- Device administrators: View or deactivate apps you have authorized to be device administrators.
- Unknown sources: Permit installation of apps from sources other than the Play Store.
- Storage type: Check the credential storage type.
- Trusted credentials: Display trusted CA certificates.
- User credentials: View and modify stored credentials.
- Install from SD card: Install certificates from the memory card.

- Clear credentials: Delete all certificates.
- Trust agents: View or deactivate trust agents.
- Screen pinning: Keep a screen of your choice in view so others cannot switch apps and access personal information (see Personalizing – Protecting Your Tablet With Screen Pinning).
- Apps with usage access: Turn on or off some apps' access to your tablet usage information.

Accounts

Manage your accounts and synchronization. Tap Accounts to sign in to or create accounts on your tablet.

Tap an account type to see that type of accounts you have added and adjust the account's settings.

Google

Manage settings for Google apps and services that are installed on your device.

Languages & input

- Language: Select a language for your system.
- Spell checker: Use Google Spell Checker to check for spelling errors when entering text and change its settings.
- Personal dictionary: Add new words to the tablet's dictionary or remove words from the dictionary. The words you add are used for spelling check and word suggestion.
- · Virtual keyboard: Choose your preferred virtual keyboard.
- · Physical keyboard

System

Date & time

Set date, time, time zone, and how date and time are displayed. You can also use network-provided data (see Personalizing – Setting the Date and Time).

Accessibility

Configure the system accessibility options and accessibility plug-ins on your tablet, such as using Color inversion and TalkBack for low-vision users.

Printing

Configure Cloud printing service options, manage print jobs, and more

AT&T Software Update

Check for available software updates for your device.

About Tablet

View tablet status, legal information, and other information. You can also tap **Additional system updates > Storage card updates** to install updates from update packages copied to the storage card.
