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## SAR

This device meets applicable national SAR limits of 1.6 W/kg. When carrying the device or using it while worn on your body, either use an approved accessory such as a holster or otherwise maintain a distance of 15 mm from the body to ensure compliance with RF exposure requirements. The device contains magnets which may interfere with other devices and items (such as credit card, pacemakers, defibrillators, etc.). Please maintain at least 150 mm of separation between your phone and the devices/items mentioned above.

# 1 Your device .....

## 1.1 Keys and connectors.....



### ☰ Recent apps

- Tap to view applications you've recently accessed.

### ○ Home

- While on any application or screen, tap to return to the home screen.
- Press and hold to open Google Assistant.

### < Back

- Tap to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the Notifications Panel, etc.

## Power/Lock

- Press: Lock the screen or light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from **Power off/Restart/Airplane mode**.
- Press and hold the **Power/Lock** key for at least 8 seconds to force restart.
- Press and hold the **Power/Lock** key and Volume down key to capture a screenshot.

## Volume up/down

- Adjust the earpiece or headset volume during a phone call.
- Adjusts the media volume while listening to music or a video, or streaming content.
- Adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.
- While using the Camera app, press Volume up or down key to take a photo or press and hold to take several photos.

## 1.2 Getting started.....

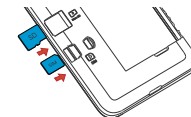
### 1.2.1 Setup

#### Install a SIM/microSD™ Card

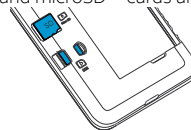
1. With the phone face down, remove back cover by gently pulling up on the indentation on the bottom left of the cover.



2. Insert the SIM card and microSD™ card\* with gold contacts facing down.



3. Ensure that SIM and microSD™ cards are properly secured.



A **NANO SIM card** is required to make phone calls and use cellular networks. Insert your SIM card before setting up your new phone. Inserting other SIM card types may damage your phone.

**NOTE:** microSD™ card sold separately.

## Charging the battery

You are advised to fully charge the battery. Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, disconnect your charger when the battery is fully charged, and switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or apps running in the background when not needed.

### 1.2.2 Power on your phone

To turn your phone on, hold down the **Power/Lock** key. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. If you've set a screen lock in Settings, unlock your phone (Swipe, Pattern, PIN, Password or Face) and display the Home screen.

### 1.2.3 Power off your phone

To turn your phone off, hold down the **Power/Lock** key until the phone options appear, then select **Power off**.

## 1.3 Home screen.....

Bring all your favorite icons (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) to your home screen for quick access. Tap the **Home** key anytime to return to the Home screen.



### Status bar

- Status/Notification indicators.

### Favorite applications tray

- Tap to open the application.
- Press and hold to remove applications.

The home screen extends on the right side of the screen to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets. Slide the home screen horizontally left to get a complete view of the home screen. The white dot at the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

### 1.3.1 Using the touch screen

#### Tap



To access an application, tap it with your finger.

#### Press and hold



Press and hold any item to view available actions or to move the item. For example, select a contact in **Contacts**, press and hold this contact, an option list will appear.

#### Drag



Place your finger on any item to drag it to another location.

#### Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down on applications, images, web pages, and more.

#### Pinch/Spread



Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

#### Rotate



Change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the device sideways.

**NOTE:** Auto-rotate is disabled by default. To turn on/turn off auto-rotate, go to **Settings > Display**

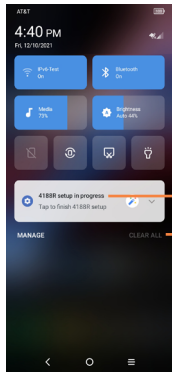
### 1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Swipe down the status bar to view notifications and swipe down again to enter the Quick settings panel. Swipe up to close it.

#### Notification panel

Swipe down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read the detailed information.

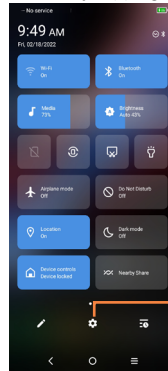


Tap on the notification to view it.

Tap **CLEAR ALL** to remove all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain)

### Quick settings panel

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel where you may enable or disable functions or change modes by tapping the icons.

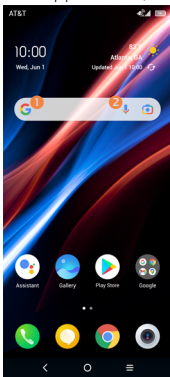


Tap to access the full Settings menu, where you can manage other items.




### 1.3.3 Search bar


The device provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the device or the web.



#### 1 Search by text

- Tap the Search bar from the home screen.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find, then tap  on the keyboard to search.

#### 2 Search by voice

- Tap  from Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Say the text or phrase you want to find. A list of search results will display for you to select.

### 1.3.4 Personalize your Home screen

#### Add


To add an app to your home screen, swipe up on the home screen to access all the applications on the phone. Press and hold the desired app, and drag it to the home screen. To add an item to the extended home screen, drag and hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen.

To add a widget to your home screen, press and hold an empty place on the home screen, then tap Shortcuts.

#### Reposition

Tap and hold an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

#### Remove

Tap and hold the item and drag it up to the top of the  remove icon, and release after it turns red.

#### Create folders

To improve the organisation of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and tap the folder's title bar to input the new name.

#### Wallpaper customization

Press and hold the empty area in the home screen, then tap **Wallpapers** to customize wallpaper.

### 1.3.5 Widgets and recently-used applications

#### View widgets

Press and hold the empty area in the home screen, then tap



to display all widgets.

Press and hold the selected widget and drag it to your preferred screen.

#### View recently-used applications

To view recently-used applications, tap the **Recent apps** key. Tap a thumbnail in the window to open the application.

To close the recently-used application, slide the thumbnail up.

### 1.3.6 Volume adjustment

#### Using volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the Media volume.

Tap the to adjust Alarm, Ring and Notification volume.

#### Using Settings menu

Swipe up on the Home screen to access the app tray, then tap **Settings** > **Sound & vibration** to set volume of media, notification, and more.

### 1.4 Lock screen.....

#### 1.4.1 Enable lock screen method

Enable an unlock method to keep your phone secure. Select Swipe, Pattern, PIN, Password or Face Unlock. \*

1. Swipe up on the home screen > **Settings** > **Security & biometrics** > **Screen lock**.
2. Tap Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password.
  - Tap **None** to disable screen lock.
  - Tap **Swipe** to enable screen lock.

**NOTE:** you will not need a pattern, PIN, password to access the phone

- Tap **Pattern** to create a pattern you must draw to unlock the screen.
- Tap **PIN** or **Password** to set a numeric PIN or an alphanumeric password that you must enter to unlock your screen.
- Face Unlock will unlock your phone by using the front camera to register your face.

1. From the app list, tap **Settings** > **Security & biometrics** > **Face unlock**. Before using the face key, you need to set a pattern/PIN/password.
2. Hold your phone 20-50 cm from your face. Position your face in the square shown on the screen. For best results, we suggest that the face key is enrolled indoors and away from direct sunlight.
3. Enable Face unlock when your screen turns on, otherwise you will have to swipe up on the screen first of all.

\* Face unlock may not be as secure as Pattern, PIN, or Password locks. We may use Face unlock methods only for the purpose to unlock the phone. The data collected from you through such methods will be stored in your device and will not be disclosed to any third-party. You may delete your data anytime.

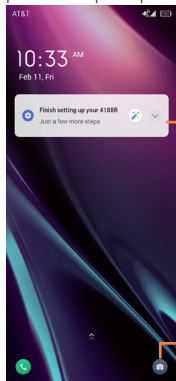
### 1.4.2 Lock/unlock your screen.

Lock: Press the **Power/Lock** key once to lock the screen.  
Unlock: Press the **Power/Lock** key once to light up the screen, then swipe up. Enter your Screen unlock key (Pattern, PIN, Password, Face unlock), if applicable.

### 1.4.3 Lock screen shortcuts \*

- View notifications on your lock screen by double tapping the notification. Your device will then open that application with the notification.
- Access the applications Google Assistant, Messages, Camera, Flashlight or Settings by double tapping on the icons.

**NOTE:** Before opening the notification or application, your phone will prompt the unlock method, if enabled.



Double tap to enter the detailed screen

Swipe left to enter **Camera**

\* Modify how notifications appear on your lock screen: **Settings > Notifications > On the lock screen.**

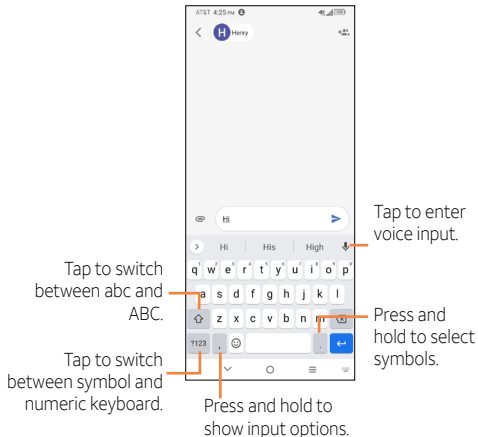
## 2 Text input.....

### 2.1 Using onscreen keyboard.....

#### Onscreen Keyboard settings

From the home screen, swipe up to view app tray, and then tap **Settings > System > Languages & input > Virtual keyboard**, tap the keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

### 2.2 Google keyboard.....



## 2.3 Text editing .....

- Press and hold or double-tap within the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the selection.
- The following options will show: **Cut**, **Copy**, **Paste**, **Share**, **Select all**.



- To exit from the selection and editing without making changes, tap an empty place in entry bar or words that haven't been selected.

### You can also insert new text

- Tap where you want to type, or press and hold a blank space in the entry bar. The cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have used **Cut** or **Copy** on any selected text, tap the tab to show **Paste**.



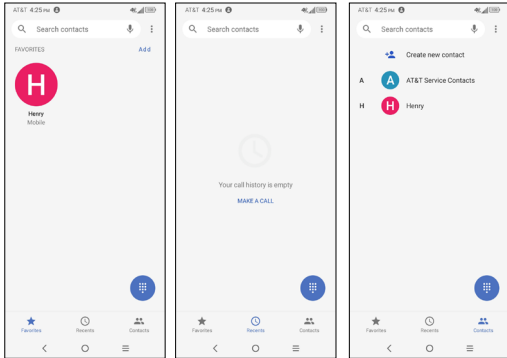

## 4 Phone and Contacts.....

### 4.1 Phone.....

#### 4.1.1 Making a call

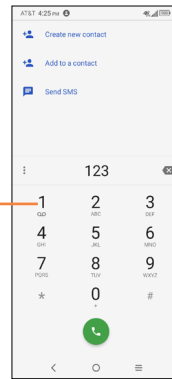
Tap **Phone**  on the home screen to access the **Phone** application. Click icon to access **Favorites**, **Recents** and **Contacts**. Tap  to view keypad for number search or entry.







Favorites

Press and hold to access voicemail.

- Open the keypad and dial the number to call, select a saved number from **Contacts**, or select a contact or number from **Recent**.
- Tap  to delete any incorrect digits.
- Tap  **Create new contact** to save the dialed number to **Contacts**.
- Tap  to place the call.
- Tap  to end a call.

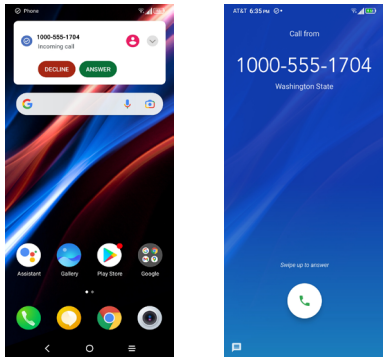
#### International call

To dial an international call, press and hold to enter + then enter the international country prefix, followed by the full phone number, and tap .




#### Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and tap  to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without unlocking the phone.

#### 4.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call


- Swipe up  or tap **ANSWER** to answer.
- Swipe down  or tap **DECLINE** to reject.
- Tap  to reject the call and send a preset text message.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the **Volume up/down** key.

#### 4.1.3 Calling your voicemail

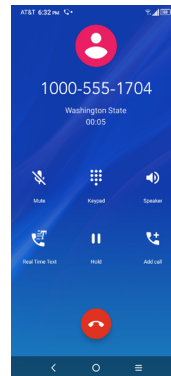
Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.








To access your voicemail, press and hold 1.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon  appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and tap **New voicemail**.

#### 4.1.4 Using options during a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.



- Tap  to place a second call, separate from the first call, which is put on hold. You can then merge  the calls to create a conference call.
- Tap  to put the call on hold.
- Tap  to turn the speaker on or off.
- Tap  to open the dial pad.
- Tap  to mute or unmute your microphone.
- Tap  to end the current call.




To avoid accidental operation of the screen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the phone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the phone is taken away from your ear.

### 4.1.5 Managing multiple calls





When call waiting and three-way calling features are available, you can switch between two calls or set up a conference call.

#### Swap calls


When you accept two calls, tap the  icon to switch between the two lines. The current call will be put on hold and you are able to join the other call.

#### Conference calls \*

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Tap  to add a call, then dial the number or choose from Contacts or Recent.
- Tap  to place the call.
- Tap  to join the calls and start the conference.
- Tap  to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

### 4.1.6 Adjusting your phone settings

Tap  from the Phone screen, then tap **Settings**. The following options are available:

#### PHONE SETTINGS

##### Display options

- **Sort by**  
Set the contacts display by First name or Last name.
- **Name format**  
Set the name format by First name first or Last name first.

\* Depending on your network carrier.

**Sounds and vibrate:** Adjust volume of Ring, media, notification, and more.

**Quick responses:** Edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with a text message.

#### Calls

- **Call forwarding**  
Configure how unanswered calls are forwarded.
- **Call barring**  
Select calls to be barred, cancel call barring, or change barring password.
- **Additional settings**  
Configure how your number displays for outgoing calls and your call waiting settings.

#### Blocked numbers

Block calls from unidentified callers.

#### Voicemail

Access voicemail service and number settings.

#### Accessibility:

- **RTT call button**  
RTT allows you to use text to communicate during a call. The other person will see each letter typed in real time.  
Tap RTT operation mode to set Always visible or Visible during calls.
- **Hearing aids**  
Enable hearing aid compatibility.

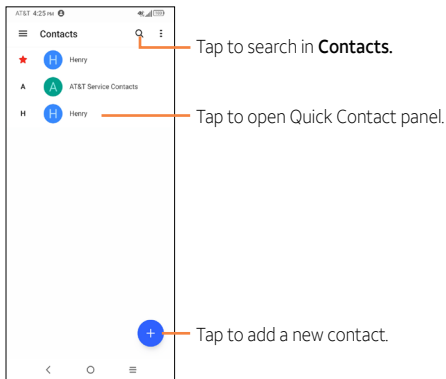

## 4.2 Contacts.....

Add contacts on your phone and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing. Swipe up on the home screen >


### Contacts

#### 4.2.1 Consult your contacts




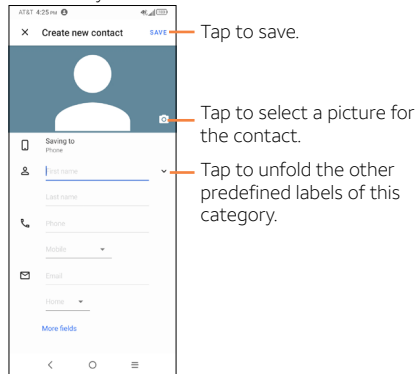
#### Delete a contact

To delete a contact, tap and hold the contact you want to delete. Then tap  and **DELETE** to delete the contact.

 Contacts deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

#### 4.2.2 Adding a contact



Tap  in the contact list to create a new contact. Enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.




When finished, tap **SAVE** to save.


To exit without saving, tap **Back** and select **DISCARD**.

#### Add to/remove from Favorites

To add a contact to Favorites, tap a contact to view details then tap  (the star will turn .

To remove a contact from favorites, tap  on contact details screen.

#### 4.2.3 Editing your contacts


To edit contact information, tap on the contact to open contact details. Tap  on top of the screen. When finished editing, tap **SAVE** to save the edits.



#### 4.2.4 Communicating with your contacts


From the contacts list, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To place a call to a contact, tap the contact to enter the detail screen, then tap the number.

To send a message to a contact, tap the contact to enter the detail screen, then tap the  icon on the right side of the number.

#### 4.2.5 Share Contacts

Share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard via Bluetooth, Gmail, and more.

Select a contact you want to share, tap  from Contact details screen and select **Share**, then select the application to perform this action.

#### 4.2.6 Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your device.

To add an account, swipe up on the home screen then **Settings > Users & accounts > Add account**.

Select the kind of account you are adding, such as Google. Enter the username and password, and follow the remaining prompts to continue setup.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the phone. Tap the account you want to delete, then tap **Remove Account** to remove it.

#### 4.2.7 Turn on/off auto-sync

In the **Accounts** screen, turn on/off the **Automatically sync data** to activate/deactivate this function. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized with each other.

## 5 Messaging

Create, edit, send and receive text and multimedia messages with Messaging.

From the home screen, tap

### 5.1 Create a message

- Tap to view the message thread.
- Press and hold to delete.



Tap to create a new message.

### 5.2 Sending a text message

1. From the Messaging screen, tap to begin a new message.
2. Add recipients by one of the following ways:
  - Tap the **To** field and type the recipient's name, number, or email address. If the recipient is saved in Contacts, their contact information will appear.
  - Tap to enter a number not saved in contacts, or without searching Contacts .
  - Tap Favorites or All Contacts to select a presaved contact.

**Note:** Messages sent to email addresses are multimedia messages.

3. Tap **Add text** field and enter your text.
4. Tap to insert emojis and graphics.
5. Tap to send the message

An SMS message of more than 160 characters will be sent as several SMS. A character counter is displayed on the right of the text box.


Specific letters (accented) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

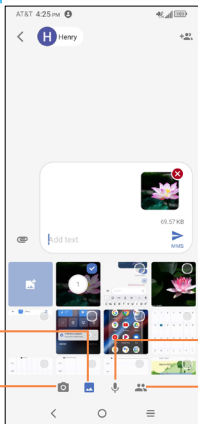
### 5.3 Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible devices and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides) are attached or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number or email address in the **To** bar and tap the **Add text** bar to enter text. Tap to attach a picture, video, audio and more.

When finished, tap  to send the multimedia message.

## 5.4 Manage messages.....

When you receive a new message,  will appear in the Status bar advising of the notification. Swipe down from the status bar to open the Notification panel, tap the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and tap the message to open it.


Messages are displayed as conversations in the order received. Tap a message thread to open the conversation.

- Tap  to call the number
- To reply to a message, enter text in the **Add text** bar. Tap  to attach a media file. Tap  for more options.

• Press and hold a message to access the following actions:

- Copy text 
- Forward 
- Delete 
- More options 

## 5.5 Adjust message settings.....

You can adjust a range of message settings. From the Messaging application screen, tap  and tap **Settings**.

### Default SMS APP

Change your default SMS app.

### Notifications

Mark the checkbox to display message notifications in the status bar.

### Advanced

#### • Phone number

Select to see your phone number.

#### • Delete old messages

Select to delete old messages when the maximum number of stored messages is reached. Messages older than 90 days will be deleted automatically.

#### • Messages time limit

Set the maximum number of text messages to be saved per conversation.

#### • Wireless Emergency Alerts

Set emergency alert and find emergency alert history.

#### • MMS Group messaging



Messages sent to multiple recipients in a conversation thread will be converted to MMS messages.

## 6 Calendar, Clock & Calculator....

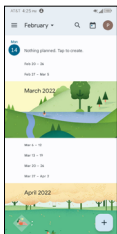
### 6.1 Calendar.....

Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, and more.

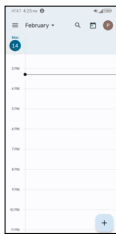
#### Multimode view

To change your Calendar view, tap  next to the month title to open the month view, or tap  and select Schedule, Day, 3 days, Week or Month to open different views.

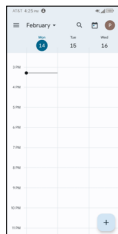

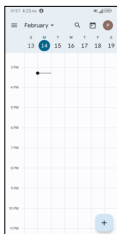
Day view



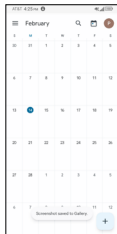



#### To create new events

- Tap .
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All-day**.
- If applicable, enter the email addresses of the guests and separate with commas. All guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, tap **Save** from the top of the screen.

#### To delete or edit an event

Tap an event to open details, then tap  to change the event or tap  > **Delete** to remove the event.

#### Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon  will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Swipe down from the Status bar to open the notification panel, tap event name to view detailed information.

## 6.2 Clock

Swipe up from the home screen and select **Clock** from the app tray, or tap time on the Home screen to access it.

### 6.2.1 Alarm

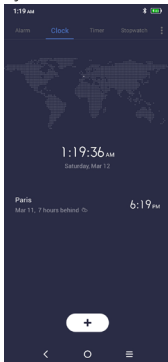
From the Clock screen, tap **Alarm** to enter.

- Tap to enable the alarm.
- Tap to add a new alarm, tap to save.
- Tap a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.
- Tap **DELETE** to delete the selected alarm.

### 6.2.2 World clock

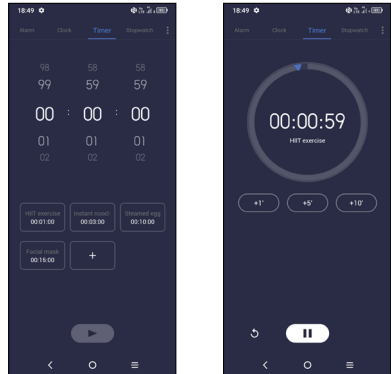
To view the date and time, tap **Clock**.

- Tap to add a city from the list.



### 6.2.3 Timer

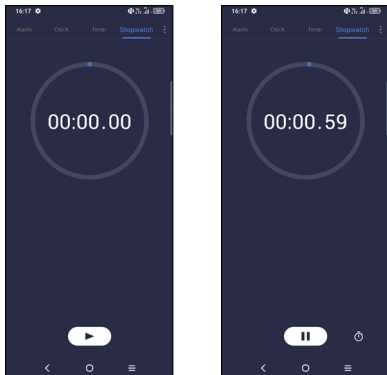
From the Clock screen, tap **Timer** to enter.








- Set the time.
- Tap to start the countdown.
- Tap to pause.
- Tap to reset.


### 6.2.4 Stopwatch

From the Clock screen, tap **Stopwatch** to enter.




- Tap  to start the Stopwatch.
- Tap  to show a list of records according to the updated time.
- Tap  to pause.
- Tap  to reset.
- Tap  to share.

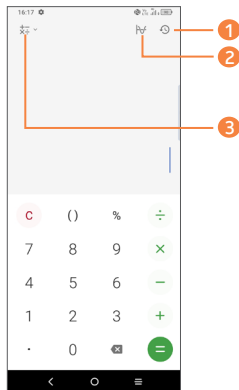
### 6.2.5 Adjust Clock settings




Tap  to access Clock and Alarm settings.

### 6.3 Calculator .....



To solve mathematical problems with **Calculator**, swipe up from the home screen, then tap .



- 1 Tap  to view calculation history.
- 2 Tap  to switch between Basic calculation and scientific calculation.
- 3 Tap  to view other calculation options, including Currency and Unit conversion.

## 7 Getting connected.....

To connect to the internet with this device, you can use your cellular network or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

### 7.1 Connecting to the Internet.....

#### 7.1.1 Cellular network

Your mobile data connection can be enabled/disabled manually. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Connections > Data usage** and enable/disable Mobile data.

#### To activate/deactivate data roaming


Connect/disconnect to a data service while roaming\*.

Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Mobile network** and enable/disable International Data Roaming. When roaming is disabled, you can still perform data exchange via a Wi-Fi connection.

#### 7.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your device is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your device even without a SIM card inserted.

#### To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Tap **Settings > Wi-Fi**.
- Turn on .
- Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you should contact the network operator for details). When finished, tap **CONNECT**.

\* Additional rates may apply.

#### To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Wi-Fi > + Add network**.
- Enter the network SSID and required network information.
- Tap **CONNECT**.

When successfully connected, your device will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

#### To forget a Wi-Fi network


Prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, press and hold the name of the saved network.
- Tap **Forget** in the dialog box that opens.

### 7.2 Connecting with Bluetooth \* .....

#### To turn on Bluetooth


To exchange data or connect with a Bluetooth device, you need to enable Bluetooth and pair your phone with the preferred device.

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Bluetooth**.
2. Tap  to enable Bluetooth. Your device and **Pair new device** will show on the screen once your Bluetooth is activated.
3. To make your phone more recognizable, tap **Device name** to change your device name.


\* You are recommended to use Bluetooth devices and accessories tested and proved compatible with your phone.

### To exchange data/connect with a device

To exchange data with another device

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Bluetooth**.
2. Tap  to enable Bluetooth. Your device and **Pair new device** will show on the screen once your Bluetooth is activated.
3. Tap on the name of the device to initiate pairing. Tap **Pair** to confirm.
4. If the pairing is successful, your phone will connect to the device.

### To disconnect/unpair from a device

1. Tap  after the device name you want to unpair.
2. Tap **FORGET** to confirm.

## 7.3 Connecting to a computer.....

With a USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between microSD card/internal storage and computer.


### To connect/disconnect your device to/from the computer:

- Use the USB cable that came with your device to connect the device to a USB port on your computer. There is a notification of **“Use USB to”**. You can choose **Charging, Choose Transfer files** or **Transfer photos(PTP)**.
- When transfer is complete, use the eject action on your computer to disconnect your device.

## 7.4 Sharing your cellular data connection.....

You can share your device's cellular data connection with other devices by turning your device into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.



### To share your device's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings  > Connections > Hotspot & tethering > Mobile hotspot**.
- Tap  to turn on/off your device's mobile hotspot.
- Follow the instructions on your device to share your device's internet connection with other devices.

## 7.5 Connecting to virtual private networks.....

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.


### To add a VPN

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings  > Connections > VPN** and tap .
- Follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



### To connect/disconnect to/from a VPN

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings**  > **Connections > VPN**.
- Tap the VPN you want to connect with.


**Note:** VPNs previously added are listed as options.

- Enter any requested credentials and tap **Connect**.
- To disconnect from the VPN, tap on the connected VPN and then select **Disconnect**.

### To edit a VPN:

- Tap **Settings > Connections > VPN**. The VPNs you have added are listed. Tap the  next to the VPN you want to edit.
- After editing, tap **SAVE**.

### To delete a VPN:

- Tap the icon  next to the selected VPN, then tap **FORGET** to delete it.

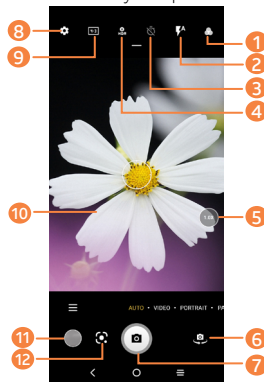
### 8.1 Camera.....



#### Launch Camera

There are multiple ways to open the Camera app.

- From the home screen, tap Camera .
- When the screen is locked, press the Power key once to light up the screen, then swipe left on the camera icon in the lower right corner to open the camera.
- Double-press the **Power** key to open the camera.

Google Lens is a free tool that uses Google to help you:




- Copy and translate text
- Search for similar products
- Identify plants and animals
- Discover books & media
- Scan barcodes

### To take a photo

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, tap the screen to focus if necessary. Tap  to capture. The photo will be automatically saved. You can also press and hold  to take burst shots.



### To take a video

Tap **VIDEO** to change the camera mode to video. Tap  to start video recording. While the recording is in progress, you can tap  to save the frame as a separate photo.

Tap  to pause video recording and tap  to continue. Tap  to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.



\* Your phone must also be connected to a network.

### Further operations when viewing a photo/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Tap  then Gmail/Bluetooth/MMS/etc. to share the photo or video.
- Tap **Back button**  to return to **Camera**.

### Modes and settings

Slide left or right on the camera screen to switch between modes.











- **AUTO:** The default camera mode will automatically adjust the focus, lighting, and more.
- **VIDEO:** Shoot and record videos.
- **PORTRAIT:** Create a depth of field effect. You can capture an image that highlights your subject while producing a gorgeously blurred background.
- **PANO:** Use pano to capture a panoramic photo, an image with a horizontally elongated field of view. Tap the shutter button and move the phone steadily along in the direction indicated on the screen. The photo will be saved when all the slots are filled, or when pressing the shutter button again.
- **MORE:** Select  to access more modes. These modes can be moved to the main screen by tapping .
- **STOP MOTION:** Capture a number of photos of a certain scene, then convert them into a sped-up video.
- **LIGHT TRACE:** Capture creative movements of light using a long exposure photograph.

## Working with pictures


You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Find the picture you want to work on, and tap the picture in the full-screen picture view.



- Tap  to share the picture.
- Tap  to edit the picture.
  -  Choose picture effect.
  -  **Crop**, **Rotate**, or **Mirror** the picture.
  -  Draw on the picture.
  -  Enter text in the picture
  -  Adjust the picture colors, brightness, saturation, and more.
- Tap  to set the picture as your favourite.
- Tap  to delete the picture.
- Tap  > **Set as** to set the picture as a Contact photo or Wallpaper.

## Settings

Tap  to access Camera settings:

- **Photo size**  
Set the photo MP size and screen ratio. You can quickly change this setting by tapping  from Camera screen.
- **Face beauty**  
Tap to turn on/off Face beauty.
- **Video quality**  
Set the video FPS (frames per second) and screen size ratio.
- **Volume button function**  
Select function of pressing Volume key while using Camera: Shutter, Zoom or Change volume.
- **Storage**  
Save photos to your phone or microSD™ card.
- **Save location information**  
Tap the switch to activate/deactivate the function of tagging photos and videos with your location. This option is available when GPS location services and wireless network are enabled and permission is granted.
- **Shutter sound**  
Tap the switch to enable/disable shutter sound when taking a photo or video.
- **Mirror camera**  
Tap to turn on/off Mirror camera.
- **Reset settings**  
Reset camera to factory default settings.

### 9.1 Other applications \* .....

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your device. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, please refer to the leaflet provided with the device. You can also download thousands of 3rd party applications by going to Google Play Store on your device.

## 10 Google applications \* .....

Google apps are preinstalled on your phone to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces these apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy all the functions.


### 10.1 Play Store .....


Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or available for purchase.

In the Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

### 10.2 Chrome .....

Surf the web using the Chrome browser. Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with Chrome installed can be synchronized with your Google account.

To get onto the Web, go to the home screen and tap Chrome  in the Favorites tray.


While browsing, tap  for settings or more options.

\* Availability depends on phone variants.


## 10.3 Gmail.....

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account on the web. With this application, you can receive and send emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, and more.




### 10.3.1 To open Gmail


From the home screen, tap **Gmail**  in the Google apps folder. Gmail displays emails from accounts you've synced to your phone.


#### To add an account


1. From the home screen, tap **Gmail**  in the Google apps folder.
2. Select **Got It > Add an email address**, then select an email provider.
3. Enter your account credentials, tap **Next**.
4. Confirm email account settings, tap **Next**.
5. Enter your name which will be displayed on outgoing emails, tap **NEXT**.
6. Tap **I agree** when setup is complete. To add additional accounts, repeat the above steps.

#### To create and send emails


1. Tap **TAKE ME to GMAIL**
2. Tap **Compose** from the Inbox screen.
3. Enter the recipient's email address in **To** field.
4. If necessary, tap **Add Cc/Bcc**  to copy or blind copy a recipient to the message.
5. Enter the subject and the content of the message.
6. Tap  and select **Attach file** to add an attachment.
7. Tap  to send.


If you do not want to send the email right away, tap  and then **Save draft** or tap the **Back** key to save a draft. To view the draft, tap your account name to display all labels, then select **Drafts**.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, tap  and then tap **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, tap  > **Settings > Select account > Mobile signature**. This signature will be added to your outgoing emails for the selected account.

### 10.3.2 To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, an icon  will appear on the Status bar.

Swipe down on the screen to display the Notification panel and tap the new email to view it. Or open the Gmail app  and tap the new email to read it.

## 10.4 Maps.....

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for traveling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can get your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

## 10.5 YouTube .....

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

## 10.6 Drive.....

Store, share, and edit files in the cloud.

## 10.7 YT Music.....

A music streaming service and online music locker operated by Google.

You can upload and listen to a large number of songs for free. In addition to offering music streaming for Internet-connected devices, the YT Music app allows music to be stored and listened to offline. Songs purchased through YT Music are automatically added to the user's account.

## 10.8 Google Play Movies & TV.....

Watch movies and TV shows purchased or rented on Google Play.

## 10.9 Duo.....

A video chat mobile app.

With phone numbers verified, users can easily video call people from their contact list.

## 10.10 Photos.....

Automatically back up your photos and videos to your Google account.


## 10.11 Assistant.....

Tap **Assistant** to quickly ask for help, check the news, make a phone call, and more.

## 10.12 Google Pay.....

Google Pay is a simple and fast secure payment service that provides the necessary functions for checkout, allowing you to settle your bills online and in stores with ease.

## 11 Settings

To access this function, swipe up from home screen and then tap the **Settings** .

### 11.1 Wi-Fi .....

Use Wi-Fi to surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your device to the wireless network.

### 11.2 Bluetooth.....

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

For more information on Bluetooth, refer to “7.2 Connecting with Bluetooth”.

### 11.3 Mobile network.....

Go to **Settings > Mobile network** to enable data roaming, check the network connection you are using or create a new access point, etc.

### 11.4 Connections .....

#### 11.4.1 Airplane mode

Turn on **Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

#### 11.4.2 Hotspot & tethering

To share your phone's data connection via Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and USB, or as a mobile hotspot, go to **Settings > Connections > Hotspot & tethering** to activate these functions.

##### To rename or secure your mobile hotspot

When your mobile hotspot is activated, you can rename your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Tap **Settings > Connections > Hotspot & tethering > Mobile hotspot**.
- Tap **Hotspot name** to rename the network SSID or tap **Security** to set your network security.
- Tap **OK**.



Hotspot and tethering may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

#### 11.4.3 Data usage

The first time you turn on your phone with your SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure your network service: 2G, 3G or 4G.

If the network is not connected, you can turn on mobile data in **Settings > Connections > Data usage**.

#### 11.4.4 Data saver

By enabling Data saver, you can reduce data usage by preventing some apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

#### 11.4.5 Mobile data

If you do not need to transmit data on mobile networks, turn off **Mobile data** to avoid incurring significant charges for data use on local operator mobile networks, particularly if you do not have a mobile data agreement.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your operator may count differently.

### 11.4.6 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks.

For more information on VPN, refer to “7.5 Connecting to virtual private networks”.

### 11.4.7 Private DNS

Tap to select private DNS mode.

### 11.4.8 USB

With a USB cable, you can charge your device, transfer files or photos (MTP/PTP) between your phone and a computer.

#### To connect your phone to the computer

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and choose the way which you want to transfer files or tap **Settings > Connections > USB** to select. By default, **Charge this device** is selected.



Before using MTP, make sure that the driver (Windows Media Player 11 or higher version) has been installed.

### 11.4.9 Printing

Tap **Printing** to activate **Print services**. You can select your **Default print service**.

### 11.4.10 Chromebook

Link your phone to a Chromebook so that you can text from your computer, share your phone’s Internet connection and simplify unlocking.

### 11.4.11 Nearby Share

The device location setting need to be on for Bluetooth and Wi-Fi to detect nearby devices.

### 11.4.12 Android Auto

Use apps on your car screen, if compatible with your car.

## 11.5 Home screen & lock screen .....

With this menu, set your home apps, change your home and lock screen wallpaper, and more.

## 11.6 Display.....

### 11.6.1 Brightness level

Adjust screen brightness manually.

### 11.6.2 Adaptive brightness

Optimize brightness level for available light.

### 11.6.3 Dark mode

Set the display to darker colors, making it easier to look at your screen or read in dim light.



#### 11.6.4 Eye comfort mode

**Eye comfort mode** can effectively reduce blue light radiation and adjust the color temperature to relieve eye fatigue. You can also create a custom schedule to turn it on.

#### 11.6.5 Sleep

Set the inactivity duration before the screen turns off automatically.

#### 11.6.6 Color mode & temperature

Change display gamut based on display content.

#### 11.6.7 Font size

Adjust font size manually.

#### 11.6.8 Font Style

Adjust font style manually.

#### 11.6.9 Auto-rotate screen

Select whether the screen rotates automatically or not.

#### 11.6.10 Status bar & Notch

Set the style of the status bar:

- Show or remove the network speed
- Allow notification icons to group in a folder
- Change how the battery percentage is displayed

Turn on the notch for full screen apps to get the best experience on the phone.

## 11.7 NXTVISION .....

#### 11.7.1 Image enhancement

Automatically enhance image contrast, sharpness, and dark details.

#### 11.7.2 Video enhancement

Enhance the color, contrast and depth of details of video to bring a cinema-grade visual experience.

#### 11.7.3 Game enhancement

Improve the shadow detail and enhance overall gaming graphics.

#### 11.7.4 Reading mode

Optimize the screen display to make the reading experience as comfortable as physical books.

#### 11.7.5 Eye comfort mode

Filter out blue light and adjust the color temperature of your display to reduce eye strain.

#### 11.7.6 Sunlight display mode

Increase readability under sunlight

## 11.8 Sound & vibration.....

Use the Sound settings to configure many aspects of call ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

### 11.8.1 Phone ringtone & vibrate

Set your incoming call ringtone or opt for the phone to vibrate only.

### 11.8.2 Notification ringtone


Set the default sound for notifications.

### 11.8.3 Alarm ringtone


Set your alarm ringtone.

### 11.8.4 Do Not Disturb

If you do not want to be disturbed by your phone or information ringtones during work or rest, you can set the **Do Not Disturb** mode.

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel and tap  to turn on Do Not Disturb.

### 11.8.5 Headset mode

Tap  to open, ringtone will only be heard from headset if it is connected.

### 11.8.6 More sound settings

Set dial pad tones, screen locking sounds, tap sounds, etc.

## 11.9 Notifications .....

Tap to manage apps notification. You can set permission of apps notification, the authority to show the notifications on the lock screen, etc.

## 11.10 Button & gestures .....

### 11.10.1 System navigation

Select your favorite navigation button layout.

### 11.10.2 Gestures

Set gestures for convenient use, such as flip device to mute, swipe 3 fingers to take a screenshot, enable split-screen apps, and more.

### 11.10.3 Power key

Configure the **Power/Lock** key to Quick launch camera, enable power button to end a call, and Power key menu.

## 11.11 Advanced features .....

### 11.11.1 Smart App Recommend

After connecting headset or speakers, recommend suitable applications on the launcher according to your habits.

### 11.11.2 Screen Recorder

Set the video resolution, Sound and Record tap interactions.

To activate Screen Recorder, tap the  icon in the Quick Settings panel.

## 11.12 Smart Manager .....

**Smart Manager** ensures your phone is operating in top form by automatically scanning and optimising data usage to preserve battery levels, manage storage and protect against security threats.

Restricting auto-start apps can make the system run faster and extend battery life.

## 11.13 Security & biometrics.....

### 11.13.1 Screen lock

Enable an unlock method to keep your phone secure. Select one method such as **Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password** to unlock the screen.

### 11.13.2 Face unlock

**Face Unlock** will unlock your phone by using the front camera to register your face. For more information, review section 1.4 Lock screen.

**NOTE:** Another screen lock method must be enabled before configuring Face unlock.

### 11.13.3 Smart Lock

With a Screen lock method enabled, your phone will detect when it's safe with you, such as is your pocket or at your home.

### 11.13.4 Others

You can also set **Device admin apps, SIM card lock, Encryption & credentials, Screen pinning**, etc. in **Settings > Security & biometrics**.

## 11.14 Location.....

Tap to set whether to allow an app to access your device's location. You can set to allow continual access, or only while the app is in use.

## 11.15 Privacy.....

To protect your privacy, you can set an app to be allowed or forbidden access to your location, contacts, and other information available on your phone.

## 11.16 Safety & emergency.....

Access **Settings > Safety & emergency > OPEN EMERGENCY INFORMATION** to set medical information and emergency contacts.

Adding medical information and emergency contacts can help first responders in an emergency.

Anyone can read this information from your lock screen and dial your contacts by tapping their names, without unlocking your phone.

You can also set **Emergency SOS, Emergency Location Service** or **Emergency alerts** in this interface.

## 11.17 Apps .....

Tap to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data usage or force them to stop.

In the **Permission manager** menu of an application, you can grant permissions for the app, such as allowing the app to access your **Camera, Contacts, Location**, etc.

In the **Special app access** menu, you can set **Device admin apps, Notification access, Picture-in-picture, Display over other app, Wifi control**, etc.

## 11.18 Storage .....

Enter **Settings > Storage** to check the usage of storage space and free up more when necessary.

## 11.19 Users & accounts .....

Tap to add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control the options for how all applications send, receive and synchronize data; i.e. if this is done automatically, according to a schedule for each app, or not at all.

## 11.20 Digital Wellbeing & parental controls .....

### 11.20.1 Digital Wellbeing

Use app timers and other tools to keep track of your screen time and unplug more easily.

### 11.20.2 Parental controls

Add content restrictions and set other limitations to help your child balance their screen time.

## 11.21 Google .....

Tap to configure your Google account and service settings.

## 11.22 Accessibility .....

Use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

## 11.23 System .....

### 11.23.1 About phone

View basic information for your phone such as model name, CPU, camera, resolution, etc.

You can also check legal information, build number, status and other specs.

### 11.23.2 AT&T Software Update

Tap AT&T Software Update > Check for Updates, and the phone will search for the latest software. Your phone will automatically download the update package. You can choose to install or ignore the updates.

**Note:** All personal information will be saved following the update process. We recommend you back up your personal data using Smart Suite before updating.

### 11.23.3 Update apps

Tap to update apps


### 11.23.4 Languages & input

Tap to configure language settings, the on-screen keyboard, voice input settings, pointer speed, etc.

### 11.23.5 Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

### 11.23.6 Backup

Turn on  to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new phone when you sign in with your Google account.

### 11.23.7 Reset

Tap to reset all network settings and app preferences, you won't lose your data with these settings.

If **Factory data reset** is selected, all data in your phone's internal storage will be erased, please back up your data before reset.

### 11.23.8 Users

Share your phone by adding new users. Each user has a personal space on your phone for custom Home screens, accounts, apps, settings, and more.

### 11.23.9 Regulatory & safety

Tap to view product information such as **Product model**, **Manufacturer name**, **IMEI**, **CU reference**, **Bluetooth Declaration ID**, etc.

## 12 Accessories.....

Included accessories:

1. Micro-USB cable
2. Safety and warranty information
3. Pre-installed SIM card
4. Wall charger
5. Lithium-ion battery

Only use your device with the charger and accessories in your box.

## 13 Safety information .....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your device. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY

Given that studies show that using a device while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their device when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your device or headphones to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas. When switched on, your device emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

## 16 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the service center, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to fully charge ( ) the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your device as this may affect its performance.
- Use **Erase all data** and the upgrade tool to perform device formatting or software upgrading. ALL User device data: contacts, photos, messages and files, downloaded applications will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully backup the device data and profile via Android Manager before doing formatting and upgrading.

### **My device cannot be switched on or is frozen**

- When the device cannot be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed, then try to switch on again.
- When the device falls into a loop during power on-off animation and the user interface cannot be accessed, long press the **Power/Lock** key and then long press **Power off** option to enter Safe Mode. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by 3rd party apps.
- If neither method is effective, please format the phone by pressing the **Power/Lock** key and **Volume up** key at the same time when device is powered off.

### **My device has not responded for several minutes**

- Restart your device by pressing and holding the **Power/Lock** key.
- Remove the battery and reinsert it, then restart the phone.
- Long press the **Power/Lock** key for 10 seconds or more to reboot.

### **My device turns off by itself**

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your device, and make sure the **Power/Lock** key is not mis-contacted due to unlocked screen.
- Check the battery charge level.
