



# **USER MANUAL**

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### SAR

This device meets applicable national SAR limits of 1.6 W/kg. When carrying the device or using it while worn on your body, either use an approved accessory such as a holster or otherwise maintain a distance of 15 mm from the body to ensure compliance with RF exposure requirements. Note that the product may be transmitting even if you are not using it.




To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods. Exercise caution when holding your device near your ear while the loudspeaker is in use.




The device contains magnets which may interfere with other devices and items (such as credit card, pacemakers, defibrillators, etc.). Please maintain at least 150 mm of separation between your tablet and the devices/items mentioned above.

# 1 Your device.....

# 1.1 Keys and connectors.....





#### Recent apps

- · Tap to view applications you've recently accessed.
- 0

#### Home

- While on any application or screen, tap to return to the Home screen.
- · Press and hold to open Google Assistant.



#### Back

Tap to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the Notifications Panel, etc.

#### Power/Lock

- · Press: Lock the screen or light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from Power off/Restart/Airplane mode/Cast.
- Press and hold the Power/Lock key for at least 10 seconds to force restart.
- Press and hold the Power/Lock key and Volume down key to capture a screenshot.

#### Volume up/down

- Adjusts the media volume while listening to music or a video, or streaming content.
- While using the Camera app, press Volume up or down key to take a photo or press and hold to take several photos.

# 1.2 Getting started .....

## 1.2.1 Setup

#### Install a SIM/microSD<sup>™</sup> Card

1. With the tablet face down, use the SIM tool provided in the box to access the SIM tray.



- 2. Remove the Nano SIM card/microSD<sup>™</sup> card tray.
- Position the SIM card and/or microSD<sup>™</sup> card in the tray correctly, aligning the cutout tab and gently snap into place. Be sure the edges are aligned.



- Slide the tray slowly into the SIM tray slot. It only fits one direction. Do not force into place. Keep the SIM tool in a safe place for future use.
- NOTE: microSD<sup>™</sup> card sold separately.

#### Charging the battery

You are advised to fully charge the battery. Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen while the tablet is powered off. The percentage increases as the tablet is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, disconnect your charger when the battery is fully charged, and switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or apps running in the background when not needed.

### 1.2.2 Power on your tablet

To turn your tablet on, hold down the **Power/Lock** key. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. If you've set a screen lock in Settings, unlock your tablet (Swipe, Pattern, PIN, Password or Face) and display the Home screen.

### 1.2.3 Power off your tablet

To turn your tablet off, hold down the **Power/Lock** key until the tablet options appear, then select **Power off**.

# 1.3 Home screen .....

Bring all your favorite icons (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) to your Home screen for quick access. Tap the **Home** key anytime to return to the Home screen.



The Home screen extends on the right side of the screen to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets. Slide the Home screen horizontally left to get a complete view of the Home screen. The white dot at the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

### 1.3.1 Using the touch screen

Tap To access an application, tap it with your finger.

### Press and hold



Press and hold any item to view available actions or to move the item. For example, select a contact in **Contacts**, press and hold this contact, an option list will appear.

**Drag** Place your finger on any item to drag it to another location.

# Slide the screen to scroll up and down on applications, images, web pages, and more.



#### Pinch/Spread

Slide/Swipe

Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.



Rotate

Change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the device sideways.

NOTE: Auto-rotate is enabled by default. To turn on/turn off auto-rotate, go to Settings > Display

### 1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both device status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Swipe down the status bar to view notifications and swipe down again to enter the Quick settings panel. Swipe up to close it.

#### Notification panel

Swipe down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read the detailed information.



#### Quick settings panel

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel where you may enable or disable functions or change modes by tapping the icons.



Tap to access the full Settings menu, where you can manage other items.

### 1.3.3 Search bar

The device provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the device or the web.



#### Search by text

- Tap the Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find, then tap **Q** on the keyboard to search.

#### 2 Search by voice

- Tap I from Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Say the text or phrase you want to find. A list of search results will display for you to select.

## 1.3.4 Personalize your Home screen

#### Add

To add an app to your Home screen, swipe up on the Home screen to access all the applications on the tablet. Press and hold the desired app, and drag it to the Home screen. To add an item to the extended Home screen, drag and hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen.

To add a widget to your Home screen, press and hold an empty place on the Home screen, then tap Shortcuts.

#### Reposition

Tap and hold an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the App dock. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

#### Remove

Tap and hold the item and drag it up to the top of the  $\Theta$  remove icon, and release after it turns red.

#### Create folders

To improve the organization of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the App dock, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and tap the folder's title bar to input the new name.

#### Wallpaper customization

Press and hold the empty area in the Home screen, then tap **Wallpaper & style** to customize wallpaper.

# 1.3.5 Widgets and recently-used applications

#### View widgets

Press and hold the empty area in the Home screen, then tap to display all widgets. Press and hold the selected widget and drag it to your preferred screen.

#### View recently-used applications

To view recently-used applications, tap the **Recent apps** key. Tap a thumbnail in the window to open the application.

To close the recently-used application, slide the thumbnail up.

### 1.3.6 Volume adjustment

#### Using volume key

Press the Volume key to adjust the Media volume.

Tap the 🗸 to adjust Alarm and Notification volume.

#### Using Settings menu

Swipe up on the Home screen to access the app tray, then tap **Settings () > Sound** to set volume of media, notifications, and more.

# 1.4 Lock screen .....

### 1.4.1 Enable lock screen method

Enable an unlock method to keep your tablet secure. Select Swipe, Pattern, PIN, Password or Face unlock.

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen > Settings > Security & biometrics > Screen lock.
- 2. Tap Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password.
- Tap None to disable screen lock.
- Tap Swipe to enable screen lock. NOTE: Enabling Swipe to unlock does not use a pattern, PIN, or password to access the device.
- Tap Pattern to create a pattern you must draw to unlock the screen.

- Tap PIN or Password to set a numeric PIN or an alphanumeric password that you must enter to unlock your screen.
- Face unlock will unlock your tablet by using the front camera to register your face.
  - From the app list, tap Settings > Security & biometrics > Face unlock. Before using the face key, you need to set a pattern/PIN/password.
  - Hold your tablet 8-20 inches from your face. Position your face in the square shown on the screen. For best results, we suggest that the face key is enrolled indoors and away from direct sunlight.
  - 3. Enable Face unlock when your screen turns on, otherwise you will have to swipe up on the screen first.

Face unlock may not be as secure as Pattern, PIN, or Password locks. The tablet uses Face unlock methods only for the purpose of unlocking the tablet. The data collected from you through such methods will be stored in your device and will not be disclosed to any third-party.

### 1.4.2 Lock/unlock your screen

Lock: Press the **Power/Lock** key once to lock the screen. Unlock: Press the **Power/Lock** key once to light up the screen, then swipe up. Enter your Screen unlock key (Pattern, PIN, Password, Face unlock), if applicable.

### 1.4.3 Lock screen shortcuts \*

View notifications on your lock screen by double tapping the notification. Your device will then open that application with the notification.

**NOTE:** Before opening the notification or application, your tablet will prompt the unlock method, if enabled.



\* Modify how notifications appear on your Lock screen: Settings > Notifications > On the lock screen

# 2 Text input.....

# 2.1 Using onscreen keyboard ...

#### Onscreen Keyboard settings

From the Home screen, swipe up to view the app tray, and then tap **Settings > System > Languages & input > Virtual keyboard**, tap the keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.



# 2.3 Text editing.....

- Press and hold or double-tap within the text you would like to edit.
- · Drag the tabs to change the selection.
- The following options will show: Cut, Copy, Paste, Share, Select all.



 To exit from selection and editing without making changes, tap an empty place in the entry bar or words that haven't been selected.

#### You can also insert new text

- Tap where you want to type, or press and hold a blank space in the entry bar. The cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have used Cut or Copy on any selected text, tap the tab to show Paste.

# 3 AT&T Services .....



#### myAT&T

Keep track of your wireless and Internet data usage, upgrade your device or plan, and view/pay your bill in the app.



#### AT&T Cloud

Securely backup, sync, access and share your important content across operating systems & devices anytime and anywhere.



#### AT&T Device Help

The Device Help app is a one-stop-shop to help you get the most out of your device. Keep your tablet running smoothly with device health status alerts, troubleshooting, quick fixes, interactive tutorials, videos and more.

# 4 AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup>.....

Your child's tablet opens up a whole new world of possibilities! AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> connects families to each other and provides you the peace of mind to safely connect with your children while allowing them independence.

AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> is a free service that connects you to your kids' tablet with location services, parental controls, and communication features. You can get real time location information and set safe zones to receive notices when your child enters or leaves the safe zone. Communication features include messaging, voice calls, and video calling through the AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> platform.

Parents will manage and communicate with the tablet by using the AT&T amiGO<sup>TM</sup> application on your smartphone downloaded via the Google Play Store<sup>TM</sup> or the Apple App Store<sup>®</sup>. First, you will set up an AT&T amiGO<sup>TM</sup> account for yourself and then pair the tablet to that account during tablet setup. Then, you will be able to invite approved contacts and grant them the ability to communicate with and locate the tablet.

# 4.1 The parent app.....

Parents, you will use the AT&T amiGO™ app to communicate with your child's tablet.

- 1. Download the app to your smartphone.
- Launch the app and create a new parent account if you don't already have one. Your AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> account is separate from your AT&T Service Account.
  - Enter your first and last name, email address, and accept the Terms of Service and Privacy Policy.
- 3. Log in using your AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> credentials.

### 4.1.1 Parental Controls

From the parent app on your phone, tap = to access the Main menu then tap Parental Controls. Through this menu on the parent's device, you can see how your children spend their time on their devices and manage their activity remotely.

- Location: Enable location tracking on your child's tablet and get notified whenever your child arrives or leaves a predetermined location.
- Control: Remotely lock child's device, set time restrictions on apps, and set content restrictions. Login to your Google account to access Family Link™ directly on the AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> app.



## 4.1.2 Inviting Contacts

Contacts can only be added or approved from the parent's AT&T amiGO<sup>TM</sup> app on their device. Since all communication with the tablet will be within the AT&T amiGO<sup>TM</sup> app, invited contacts will need to download the AT&T amiGO<sup>TM</sup> app onto their device.

- 1. Select the Menu = and then All contacts.
- 2. Tap the Add Contact button.
- 3. Enter the contact's name, phone number, and email.
- Select devices this new contact will be able to access. Be sure to select "Kid Tablet" if you want them to contact your child's tablet.
- 5. Select the contact's permissions to manage location and communicate with the child's tablet.



## 4.1.3 Setting SafeZones

A SafeZone is a specific geographic area that is used by both the device and the app for location fencing. The app automatically notifies you when the device has entered or exited a defined SafeZone.

- 1. Select the Menu = and then Add SafeZones
- 2. Long press on the map to jump to a location.
- 3. Enter the location name and tap Save.



# 4.2 Pair tablet with AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> parent app......

There are two ways to pair:

- 1. During the tablet setup after Google Kids Space™ configuration.
- 2. If the screen is skipped, enter AT&T amigGO<sup>™</sup> from Google Kids Space.
  - Tap Play (🛤)
  - Select My Stuff
  - Tap AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> 🔤

When the QR code appears, use the AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> parent app on your device to scan the QR code, or type in the 8-digit activation code, and pair the tablet to your account.



Note: Pairing the tablet to the parent app is required to benefit from the features of AT&T amiGO<sup>TM</sup>.


Use AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> app on your tablet to communicate with approved contacts. From Google Kids Space, follow these steps:

- 1. Tap Home (🏠
- 2. Select My apps

3. Tap AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> and then select Call or Chat.



Note: Call can make video or voice calls.



# 5 Google Kids Space<sup>™</sup>.....

Your device comes with Google Kids Space™, a custom library of quality content designed for kids.

# 5.1 Getting started with Google Kids Space<sup>™</sup>.....

 Tap the Kids Space icon single and a Kids Space screen will appear as shown below, then tap Get started to continue.



**Note:** You need to sign in with your child's account to begin. If your device has been connected to a network, you can continue. Otherwise, swipe down from the status bar twice to find the Settings icon, and then connect your device to the network.

- Enter your child's email account and password, then choose a parent account to set up the device, the chosen parent can supervise this device once the child signs in.
- Edit your child's Google Kids Space settings and manage other pre-loaded apps that may not be designed for children, you can make these apps available or unavailable for your child.

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**Note:** During setup, do not unselect the AT&T amiGO<sup>TM</sup> app. Keep it checked so the app appears in Google Kids Space<sup>TM</sup> and is ready for your child to use.

 After the following screen appears, work with your child to choose their interests and customize their experience by creating their own special character.



5. Tap Done and Kids Space setup is complete.



# 5.2 Use Google Kids Space<sup>™</sup>.....

When your child opens Kids Space, they will find recommended apps, games, books and videos organized by 5 tabs at the bottom of the screen.

Home (🛞): Google Kids Space activities and suggestions for exploration.

Play (A constant): Game and app suggestions. Note: Parents can install apps beyond those recommended by Google Kids Space through the Google Play store. Open the Parent Menu, and tap Add more apps.



Read 💭 : Free books selected especially for your kids.







Make (): Recommended videos about activities sourced from YouTube Kids.



### 5.2.1 YouTube Kids™

YouTube Kids<sup>™</sup> is a safer and simpler video and music experience for your kids. You must set up YouTube Kids to access Watch and Make content.

During setup, you can select your child's age range for content setting and enable or disable "Search" within YouTube Kids. With Search turned off, you limit videos to channels that are verified by YouTube Kids.

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# 6 Google Family Link<sup>™</sup>.....

Google Family Link™ helps parents manage their child's device and monitor their device activity remotely. You can access Family Link on the parent phone or on the tablet.

To access Family Link on the parent's phone:

- Tap AT&T amiGO<sup>™</sup> =
- 2. Select the Menu and then Parental Controls.



To access Family Link on the tablet:

- Long press Å from Google Kids Space<sup>™</sup>.
- 2. Select Parental Controls.



# Google Applications.....

Google apps are preinstalled on your tablet to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces these apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to eniov all the functions.

## Play Store<sup>™</sup> >

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or available for purchase.

In the Play Store<sup>™</sup>, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

## Chrome<sup>™</sup>



Surf the web using the Chrome browser<sup>™</sup>. Your bookmarks. browsing history, and settings across all devices with Chrome installed can be synchronized with your Google account.

To get onto the Web, go to the Home screen and tap Chrome o in the App dock. While browsing, tap for settings or more options.

# Gmail™ M

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail™ is configured when you first set up your tablet. Gmail on your tablet can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account on the web. With this application, you can receive and send emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, and more.

### Maps™ (

Google Maps<sup>TM</sup> offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for traveling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can get your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

### YouTube™ 🝺

YouTube<sup>™</sup> is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

### Drive<sup>™</sup> (△)

Store, share, and edit files in the cloud.

### YT Music™ 🜔

A music streaming service and online music locker operated by Google.

You can upload and listen to a large number of songs for free. In addition to offering music streaming for Internet-connected devices, the YT Music app allows music to be stored and listened to offline. Songs purchased through YT Music are automatically added to the user's account.

### Google TV™ 🔲

Watch movies and TV shows purchased or rented on Google TV.



Automatically back up your photos and videos to your Google account.




Tap **Assistant** to quickly ask for help, check the news, write a text message, and more.

## 8 Contacts .....

Add contacts on your tablet and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing. Swipe up on the **Home screen** > **Contacts** 

#### Consult your contacts




#### Delete a contact

Ø

- 1. Tap and hold the contact you want to delete.
- Tap ind Move to Trash to delete the contact.
  - Contacts deleted will also be removed from other applications on the device or web the next time you synchronize your tablet.

#### Adding a contact

- 1. Tap + in the contact list to create a new contact.
- Enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.



3. When finished, tap Save to save.

To exit without saving, tap Back and select Discard

#### Add to/remove from Favorites

To add a contact to Favorites, tap a contact to view details then tap  $\bigwedge$  (the star will turn  $\bigstar$ ).

To remove a contact from favorites, tap 🔶 on contact details screen.

#### Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, tap on the contact to open contact details. Tap on top of the screen. When finished editing, tap **SAVE** to save the edits.

#### Communicating with your contacts

From the contacts list, you can communicate with your contacts by exchanging messages.

To send a message to a contact, tap the contact to enter the detail screen, then tap the  $\bigcirc$  icon on the right side of the number.

#### Share Contacts

Share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard via Bluetooth, Gmail, and more.

Select a contact you want to share and then select < , then select the application to perform this action.

#### Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your device.

- 1. To add an account, swipe up on the home screen then Settings > Accounts > Add account.
- 2. Select the kind of account you are adding, such as Google.
- 3. Enter the username and password, and follow the remaining prompts to continue setup.
- 4. You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the tablet.
- 5. Tap the account you want to delete, then tap **Remove** Account to remove it.

#### Turn on/off auto-sync

In the **Accounts** screen, turn on/off the **Automatically sync data** to activate/deactivate this function. When activated, all changes to information on the tablet or online will be automatically synchronized with each other.

## 9 Messages..... 🤜

Text on your tablet by pairing your phone through Messages.

To open Messages, tap 🤝 from the Home screen, or within the app drawer.

#### Pairing

- 1. Open Messages by tapping 🗢 on the Home screen, or within the app drawer.
- 2. There are two ways to pair
- Tap Pair with QR code on your tablet, then scan the QR code with your phone to pair.
- Tap Sign In to connect your Google account with Messages.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to confirm successful pairing.

#### Sending a Message

- 1. From the Messaging screen, tap 오 🔤 to begin a new message.
- 2. Add recipients by one of the following ways:
- Tap the To field and type the recipient's name, number, or email address. If the recipient is saved in Contacts, their contact information will appear.
- Tap 👯 to enter a number not saved in contacts, or without searching Contacts.
- Tap contacts that have been saved in Top Contacts.

Note: Messages sent to email addresses are multimedia messages.

- 3. Tap Text message field and enter your text.
- 4. Tap 😉 to insert emojis and graphics.
- 5. Tap 🔁 to attach pictures or video, and more.
- 6. Tap 💫 to send the message.

An SMS message of more than 160 characters will be sent as several SMS. A character counter is displayed on the right of the text box. Specific letters (accented) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

**NOTE:** Data charges will apply when sending and receiving picture or video messages. International or roaming text charges may apply to those messages outside of the United States of America. See your carrier agreement for more details about messaging and related charges.



#### Manage messages

When you receive a new message, a will appear in the Status bar advising of the notification. Swipe down from the status bar to open the Notification panel, tap the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and tap the message to open it. Messages are displayed as conversations in the order received.

- 1. Tap a message thread to open the conversation.
- 2. To reply to a message, enter text in the Text message bar.
- 3. Tap 🔁 to attach a media file or more options.

#### Adjust message settings

You can adjust a range of message settings. From the Messaging application screen, tap **•** and tap **Settings**.

#### Notifications

Check the Notification checkbox to display message notifications in the status bar. Check the Message preview to show message content in notification.


## Calendar™ 🛂



Use Google Calendar<sup>™</sup> to keep track of important meetings, appointments, and more.

#### Multimode view

To change your Calendar view, tap 🔷 next to the month title to open the month view, or tap  $\equiv$  and select Schedule, Day, 3 days, Week or Month to open different views.



#### To create new events

- 1. Tap + .
- 2. Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All-day**.
- 3. If applicable, enter the email addresses of the guests and separate with commas. All guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- 4. When finished, tap **Save** from the top of the screen.

#### To delete or edit an event

Tap an event to open details, then tap 2 to change the event or tap 2 > **Delete** to remove the event.

### Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon  $\boxed{31}$  will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Swipe down from the Status bar to open the notification panel, tap event name to view detailed information.



Swipe up from the Home screen and select **Clock** from the app tray, or tap time on the Home screen to access it.

#### Adjust Clock settings

Tap to access settings.

#### Alarm

From the Clock screen, tap Alarm to enter.

- Tap 

   to enable the alarm.
- Tap + to add a new alarm, tap Ok to save.
- Tap a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.
- Tap Delete to delete the selected alarm.



#### World clock

To view the date and time, tap Clock.

• Tap + to add a city from the list.

#### Timer

From the Clock screen, tap **Timer** to enter.



- 1. Set the timer.
- 2. Tap **b** to start the countdown.
- 3. Tap 🔳 to pause.
- 4. Tap 🏠 to reset.

#### Stopwatch

From the Clock screen, tap **Stopwatch** to enter.



- 1. Tap 🜔 to start the Stopwatch.
- Tap ot to show a list of records according to the updated time.
- 3. Tap 🔳 to pause.
- 4. Tap () to reset.

## Calculator 🧲



To solve mathematical problems with **Calculator**, swipe up from the Home screen, then tap Caculator



1 Tap 🔨 to view other calculation options.

2 Tap INV to switch between Basic calculation and scientific calculation.

## 11 Getting connected.....

To connect to the internet with this device, you can use your cellular network or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

### Connecting to the Internet Cellular network

Your mobile data connection can be enabled/disabled manually.

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Settings > Connections > Data usage
- 3. Select to enable or disable Mobile data.

#### To activate/deactivate data roaming

Connect/disconnect to a data service while roaming \*.

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Settings > Mobile network.
- 3. Select to enable or disable International Data Roaming.

**Note:** When roaming is disabled, you can still perform data exchange via a Wi-Fi connection.

#### Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your device is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your device even without a SIM card inserted.

#### To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- 1. Tap Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Turn on 🥌
- 3. Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- 4. Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you should contact the network operator for details). When finished, tap CONNECT.
- \* Additional rates may apply.

#### To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen, tap Settings > Wi-Fi > + Add network.
- 2. Enter the network SSID and required network information.
- 3. Tap CONNECT.

When successfully connected, your device will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

#### To forget a Wi-Fi network

Prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- 1. Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- 2. In the Wi-Fi screen, press and hold the name of the saved network.
- 3. Tap Forget in the dialog box that opens.

### Connecting with Bluetooth \*

#### To turn on Bluetooth

To exchange data or connect with a Bluetooth device, you need to enable Bluetooth and pair your tablet with the preferred device.

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen, tap Settings > Bluetooth.
- Tap to enable Bluetooth. Your device and Pair new device will show on the screen once your Bluetooth is activated.
- 3. To make your tablet more recognizable, tap **Device name** to change your device name.
- \* You are recommended to use Bluetooth devices and accessories tested and proved compatible with your tablet.

#### To exchange data/connect with a device

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen, tap Settings > Bluetooth.
- Tap D to enable Bluetooth. and tap Pair new device, the detected devices will show on the screen.
- 3. Tap on the name of the device you want to connect to initiate pairing. Tap **Pair** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your tablet will connect to the device.

#### To disconnect/unpair from a device

- 1. Tap 🏟 after the device name you want to upair.
- 2. Tap FORGET to confirm.

### Connecting to a computer

With a USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between microSD<sup>™</sup> card/internal storage and computer.

#### To connect/disconnect your device to/from the computer:

- 1. Use the USB cable that came with your device to connect the device to a USB port on your computer.
- A notification of "Use USB to" will appear on device. Select the function: Charging this device, Supply power, Transfer files, or Transfer photos(PTP).
- When transfer is complete, use the eject action on your computer to disconnect your device.

### Sharing your cellular data connection

You can share your device's cellular data connection with other devices by turning your device into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

## To share your device's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen.
- Tap Settings > Connections > Hotspot & tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 3. Tap D to turn on/off your device's mobile hotspot.
- Follow the instructions on your device to share your device's internet connection with other devices.

### Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

#### To add a VPN

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen.
- Tap Settings () > Connections > VPN and tap +.
- 3. Follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- 4. The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.

#### To connect/disconnect to/from a VPN

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Settings 📀 > Connections > VPN.
- 3. Tap the VPN you want to connect with.
- 4. Enter any requested credentials and tap Connect.
- To disconnect from the VPN, tap on the connected VPN and then select **Disconnect**.

#### To edit a VPN:

- 1. Tap Settings > Connections > VPN.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Tap the state next to the VPN you want to edit.
- 3. After editing, tap SAVE.

#### To delete a VPN:

Tap the icon the selected VPN, then tap FORGET to delete it.

### To take a photo

The screen acts as the viewfinder.

- 1. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder.
- 2. Tap the screen to focus, if necessary.
- Tap (a) to capture. The photo will be automatically saved.
- 4. Press and hold (a) to take burst shots.

#### To take a video

- 1. Tap VIDEO to change the camera mode to video.
- 2. Tap 💿 to start video recording.
- 3. While the recording is in progress, tap (a) to save the frame as a separate photo.
- 4. Tap () to pause video recording and tap (icon) to continue.
- Tap (
   •) to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

\* Your tablet must also be connected to a network.

## Further operations when viewing a photo/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Tap < then Gmail/Bluetooth/MMS/etc. to share the photo or video.

### Modes and settings

Slide left or right on the camera screen to switch between modes.

- VIDEO: Shoot and record videos.
- PHOTO: Take a photo.
- PANO: Use pano to capture a panoramic photo, an image with a horizontally elongated field of view. Tap the shutter button and move the tablet steadily along in the direction indicated on the screen. The photo will be saved when all the slots are filled, or when pressing the shutter button again.
- STOP MOTION: Capture a number of photos of a certain scene, then convert them into a sped-up video.

#### Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping, sharing with friends, setting as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc. Find the picture you want to work on, and tap the picture in the full-screen picture view.

Set the video FPS (frames per second) and screen size ratio.

#### Volume button function

Select function of pressing Volume key while using Camera: Shutter, Zoom or Change volume.

#### Storage

Save photos to your tablet or microSD<sup>™</sup> card.

#### Save location information

Tap the switch to activate/deactivate the function of tagging photos and videos with your location. This option is available when GPS location services and wireless network are enabled and permission is granted.

#### Shutter sound

Tap the switch to enable/disable shutter sound when taking a photo or video.

#### QR code

Tap to turn on/off QR code.

#### Reset settings

Reset camera to factory default settings.

## 13 Others.....

The applications in this section are preinstalled on your device. You can also download thousands of 3rd party applications by going to Google Play Store™ on your device. 14 Settings.....

To access this function, swipe up from Home screen and then tap the **Settings** ③

## 14.1 Wi-Fi.....

Use Wi-Fi to surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your device to the wireless network.

## 14.2 Bluetooth .....

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

For more information on Bluetooth, refer to "Connecting Bluetooth".

## 14.3 Mobile network .....

Go to **Settings > Mobile network** to enable data roaming, check the network connection you are using or create a new access point, etc.

## 14.4 Connections.....

### 14.4.1 Airplane mode

Turn on **Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

### 14.4.2 Hotspot & tethering

To share your tablet's data connection via Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and USB, or as a mobile hotspot, go to **Settings > Connections >** Hotspot & tethering to activate these functions.

### To rename or secure your mobile hotspot

When your mobile hotspot is activated, you can rename your tablet's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Tap Settings > Connections > Hotspot & tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- Tap Hotspot name to rename the network SSID or tap Security to set your network security.
- 3. Tap **OK**.



Hotspot and tethering may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

### 14.4.3 Data usage

The first time you turn on your tablet with your SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure your network service: 4G or 4G LTE.

If the network is not connected, you can turn on mobile data in **Settings > Connections > Data usage**.

#### Data saver

By enabling Data saver, you can reduce data usage by preventing some apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

#### Mobile data

If you do not need to transmit data on mobile networks, turn off **Mobile data** to avoid incurring significant charges for data use on local operator mobile networks, particularly if you do not have a mobile data agreement.



Data usage is measured by your tablet, and your operator may count differently.

### 14.4.4 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks.

For more information on VPN, refer to "Connecting to virtual private networks".

### 14.4.5 Private DNS

Tap to select private DNS mode.

### 14.4.6 Cast

This function can transmit your tablet content to a television or other device capable of supporting video over Wi-Fi connection.

- 1. Tap Settings > Connections > Cast.
- 2. Turn on Cast.
- 3. Tap the device name you want to connect.

**Note:** your device need to connect Wi-Fi network first before using this function.

### 14.4.7 USB connection

With a USB cable, you can charge your device and transfer files or photos (MTP/PTP) between tablet and a computer.

#### To connect your tablet to the computer

- Use the USB cable that came with your tablet to connect the tablet to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and choose the way which you want to transfer files or tap Settings > Connections
   USB connection to select. By default, Charge this device is selected.



Before using MTP, make sure that the driver (Windows Media Player 11 or higher version) has been installed.

### 14.4.8 Printing

Tap **Printing** to activate **Print services**. You can select your **Default print service**.

### 14.4.9 Quick Share

The device location setting need to be on for Bluetooth and Wi-Fi to detect nearby devices.

## 14.5 Home screen & lock screen

With this menu, set your home apps, change your home and lock screen wallpaper, and more.

## 14.6 Display .....

### 14.6.1 Brightness level

Adjust screen brightness manually.

### 14.6.2 Adaptive brightness

Optimize brightness level for available light.

### 14.6.3 Dark mode

Set the display to darker colors, making it easier to look at your screen or read in dim light.

### 14.6.4 Eye comfort mode

**Eye comfort mode** can effectively reduce blue light radiation and adjust the color temperature to relieve eye fatigue. You can also create a custom schedule to turn it on.

### 14.6.5 Sleep

Set the inactivity duration before the screen turns off automatically.

### 14.6.6 Reading mode

Optimize the screen display to make the reading experience as comfortable as physical books.

### 14.6.7 Font size

Adjust font size manually.

### 14.6.8 Font Style

Adjust font style manually.

### 14.6.9 Auto-rotate screen

Select whether the screen rotates automatically or not.

### 14.6.10 Status bar

Set the style of the status bar:

- Allow notification icons to group in a folder
- Change how the battery percentage is displayed

## 14.7 Sound .....

Use the Sound settings to configure many aspects of ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

### 14.7.1 Notification ringtone

Set the default sound for notifications.

### 14.7.2 Alarm ringtone

Set your alarm ringtone.

### 14.7.3 Do Not Disturb

If you do not want to be disturbed by your tablet or information ringtones during work or rest, you can set the **Do Not Disturb** mode.

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel and tap  $\bigotimes$  to turn on Do Not Disturb.

### 14.7.4 Headset mode

Tap **()** to open, ringtone will only be heard from headset if it is connected.

### 14.7.5 More sound settings

Set screen locking sounds, tap sounds, Power on & off sounds etc.

Select your favorite navigation button layout.

### 14.9.3 Power key

Configure the **Power/Lock** key to Quick launch camera, enable power button to Power menu.

## 14.10 Advanced features .....

### 14.10.1 Smart landscape

When your tablet is in landscape orientation, third-party apps can be displayed and operated.

### 14.10.2 Screen Recorder

Set the video resolution, Sound and Record tap interactions. To activate Screen Recorder, tap the Automatic icon in the Quick Settings panel.

## 14.11 Smart Manager .....

Smart Manager ensures your tablet is operating in top form by automatically scanning and optimizing data usage to preserve battery levels, manage storage and protect against security threats.

Restricting auto-start apps can make the system run faster and extend battery life.

## 14.12 Security & biometrics ......

### 14.12.1 Screen lock

Enable an unlock method to keep your tablet secure. Select one method such as **Swipe**, **Pattern**, **PIN**, or **Password** to unlock the screen.

### 14.12.2 Face unlock\*

Face unlock will unlock your tablet by using the front camera to register your face. For more information, review section 1.4 Lock screen.

**NOTE:** Another screen lock method must be enabled before configuring Face unlock.

### 14.12.3 Smart Lock

With a Screen lock method enabled, your tablet will detect when it's safe with you, such as in your pocket or at your home.

### 14.12.4 Others

You can also set **Device admin apps, SIM card lock,** Encryption & credentials, Screen pinning, etc. in Settings > Security & biometrics.

## 14.13 Location.....

Tap to set whether to allow an app to access your device's location. You can set to allow continual access, or only while the app is in use.

## 14.14 Privacy.....

To protect your privacy, you can set an app to be allowed or forbidden access to your location, contacts, and other information available on your tablet.

\* Facial Recognition methods may not be as secure as Pattern, Pin, or Password locks. We may use Facial Recognition methods only for the purpose to unlock the tablet. The data collected from you through such methods will be stored in your device and will not be disclosed to any third-party.

## 14.15 Safety & emergency.....

Access Settings > Safety & emergency to set Emergency Location Service, Emergency alerts or Wireless Emergency Alerts in this interface.

## 14.16 Apps.....

Tap to view details about the applications installed on your tablet, to manage their data usage or force them to stop.

In the Special app access menu, you can set Device admin apps, Notification access, Picture-in-picture, Display over other app, Wi-Fi control, etc.

## 14.17 Storage.....

Enter **Settings > Storage** to check the usage of storage space and free up more when necessary.

## 14.18 Accounts.....

Tap to add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control the options for how all applications send, receive and synchronize data; i.e. if this is done automatically, according to a schedule for each app, or not at all.

# 14.19 Digital Wellbeing & parental controls.....

### 14.19.1 Digital Wellbeing

Use app timers and other tools to keep track of your screen time and unplug more easily.

### 14.19.2 Parental controls

Add content restrictions and set other limitations to help your child balance their screen time.

Tap to configure your Google account and service settings.

## 14.21 Accessibility .....

## 14.22 System.....

### 14.22.1 About tablet

View basic information for your tablet such as model name, CPU, camera, resolution, etc.

You can also check legal information, build number, status and other specs.

### 14.22.2 System Update

Tap **System Update > CHECK FOR UPDATES**, and the device will search for the latest software. Your device will automatically download the update package. You can choose to install or ignore the updates.

**Note:** All personal information will be saved following the update process. We recommend you back up your personal data using Smart Suite before updating.

### 14.22.3 Languages & input

Tap to configure language settings, the on-screen keyboard, voice input settings, pointer speed, etc.

### 14.22.4Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

### 14.22.5 Backup

Turn on to back up your tablet's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your device, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new device when you sign in with your Google account.

### 14.22.6Reset

Tap to reset all network settings and app preferences, you won't lose your data with these settings.

If **Factory data reset** is selected, all data in your tablet's internal storage will be erased, please back up your data before reset.

#### 14.22.7 Users

Share your tablet by adding new users. Each user has a personal space on your tablet for custom Home screens, accounts, apps, settings, and more.

#### 14.22.8 Regulatory & safety

Tap to view product information such as **Product model**, Manufacturer name, IMEI, CU reference, Bluetooth Declaration ID, etc.

#### TRAFFIC SAFETY

During SAR testing, this is set to transmit at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands, and placed in positions that simulate RF exposure in usage near the body with the separation of 0 mm. ## 18 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the service center, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to fully charge ( ) the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your device as this may affect its performance.
- Use Erase all data and the upgrade tool to perform device formatting or software upgrading. ALL user device data: contacts, photos, messages and files, downloaded applications will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully backup the device data and profile via Android Manager before doing formatting and upgrading.

#### My device cannot be switched on or is frozen.

- When the device cannot be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed, then try to switch on again.
- If the device falls into a loop during power on-off animation and the user interface cannot be accessed, long press the Power/Lock key and then long press the Power off option to enter Safe Mode. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by 3rd party apps.
- If neither method is effective, please format the tablet by pressing the **Power/Lock** key and **Volume up** key at the same time when device is powered off.

#### My device has not responded for several minutes.

- Restart your device by pressing and holding the Power/ Lock key.
- Long press the **Power/Lock** key for 10 seconds or more to reboot.

#### My device turns off by itself.

 Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your device, and make sure the **Power/Lock** key is not miscontacted due to unlocked screen. Check the battery charge level.

#### My device cannot charge properly

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power is empty for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charger indicator on the screen.
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (32°F to +104°F).
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

# My device cannot connect to a network or "No service" is displayed.

- Try connecting in another location.
- · Verify the network coverage with your carrier.
- · Check with your carrier that your SIM card is valid.
- Try selecting the available network(s) manually.

#### My device cannot connect to the Internet.

#### I am unable to add a contact in my contacts.

 Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files in the device contacts (i.e. your professional or personal directories).

#### SIM card PIN locked.

#### I am unable to connect my device to my computer.

- · Perform USB debugging.
  - 1. To access, go to **Settings > System > About tablet**, then tap Build number 7 times.
  - 2. Then to go Settings > System > Developer options > USB debugging.
- Check that your USB driver is installed properly.
- Open the Notification panel to check if the Android Manager Agent has been activated.
- When plugging the device into a computer, select the correct USB option.
- · Make sure that you're using the right cable from the box.

#### I am unable to download new files.

- Make sure there is sufficient device memory for your download.
- · Check your subscription status with your carrier.

#### The device cannot be detected by others via Bluetooth.

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your device is visible to other users (see "7.2 Connecting with Bluetooth").
- Make sure that the two devices are within Bluetooth's detection range.

# My app cannot receive new notifications while running in the background.

 Swipe up on the Home screen, tap Settings > Notifications and activate your desired apps.

#### How to make your battery last longer.

- Make sure you follow the complete charge time (minimum 3.5 hours).
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- · Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate
- · Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.
- Exit background-running applications if they are not being used.
- · Deactivate Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or GPS when not in use.
