

AT&T Cingular Flex® 2 User Guide

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Introduction

Thank you for purchasing your new U1030AA mobile phone. The following topics explain how best to use this guide to get the most out of your phone.

Before using your phone, read the Safety Information Guide that came with your device thoroughly for proper usage.

Note that most descriptions in this guide are based on your phone's setup at the time of purchase. Some operation descriptions may be simplified.

Your phone

Keys and connectors







OK key

- Press to confirm an option.
- Press to access the App Menu from the Home screen.

Navigation Ring

From the Home screen, use the Navigation Ring to perform shortcut functions.

- Press **Up** to access the Quick Settings, such as Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and more.
- Press **Down** to access the E-Mail app.
- Press Left to access the apps on the Home screen (Store, Internet, Google, Maps, and YouTube™).
- Press Right to access the Internet app.



Messages key

• Press to access the Messages app.



Back/Clear key

- Press to return to the previous screen, close a dialog box, or exit a menu.
- Press to delete characters when in Edit mode.



Call/Answer kev

- Press to dial or answer an incoming call.
- Press to enter the Call Log from the Home screen.


(a)	Press to end a call or return to the Home screen. Press and hold to power on/off.
	Camera key Press to access the Camera app. Press to capture a photo or shoot video in the Camera app. Press and hold along with the Volume Down key to capture a screenshot.
	Volume Up/Down key Press to adjust the earpiece or headset volume during a call. Press to adjust the media volume while listening to music or watching/streaming a video. Press to adjust the ringtone volume from the Home screen. Press to mute the ringtone of an incoming call.
	Left/Right Select key Press the Left Select key from the Home screen to access the Notifications panel. Press the Right Select key from the Home screen to access the Contacts app. Press either key from within an app to access various functions and options.

Getting started

Setup


Removing or attaching the back cover

- 1. Gently remove the back cover via the notch at the bottom left corner.
- Reattach the back cover, pressing firmly on the sides to ensure the cover snaps back into place.




Removing or installing the battery

- Insert a fingernail into the small slot and gently pull up to remove the battery.
- Insert the battery, making sure the gold contacts align. Gently push down on the battery until it clicks into place.



Inserting or removing the Nano SIM card and microSD™ card

- To insert a Nano SIM or microSD card, push the Nano SIM or microSD card into the corresponding card slot with the gold-connectors facing down.
- 2. To remove the Nano SIM or microSD card, push down the black plastic clip keeping the card in place and pull the Nano SIM or microSD card out.





Your phone only supports Nano SIM cards. Attempting to insert a Mini or Micro SIM card may damage the phone.

Charging the battery

Insert the Type-C USB cable into the phone's charging port and plug the charger into an electrical outlet.





To reduce power consumption and energy waste, disconnect your charger when the battery is fully charged and switch off Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and other wireless connections when they are not in use.

Powering your phone on

Press and hold the **End/Power** below the phone powers on.

If a SIM card is not installed, you will still be able to power your phone on, connect to a Wi-Fi network, and use some device features. You will not be able to make calls using your network without a SIM card.

If screen lock is set up, enter your passcode to access your phone. See <u>"Screen lock" on page 63</u> for details.

Note: Store your passcode in a safe place that you can access without your phone. If you do not know your passcode or have forgotten it, contact your service provider. Do not store your passcode on your phone.

Setting up your phone for the first time



- 2. Use the **Navigation Ring** to select a keypad language and press the **OK OK** key to confirm. Press the **Right Select** key to continue.
- 3. View the important notifications on network data usage. You can press the **Right Select** key to continue to the next screen after 3 seconds.
- 4. Use the Navigation Ring to select a Wi-Fi network. Press the OK ok key and enter the password (if needed), then press the Right Select key to connect. When connected, press the Right Select key to continue to the next screen. If you do not want to connect to a network, press the Right Select key to skip.
- Press the Right Select key or the Left Select key to Allow or Deny the Location Access.
 - Note: Allowing the location access will automatically set the date and time. Date & Time step will be skipped.
- 6. Press the **Right Select** key to accept the date and time and continue, or press the **OK** ok key to disable Auto Sync and manually set the date, time, time zone, clock format, and Home screen clock visibility. Press the **Right Select** key to continue. This step is available only when the location access is denied.

Note: Auto Sync is not available without a Wi-Fi connection. This phone

uses cellular data for certain services, applications and functions. If not connected to Wi-Fi, standard data charges will apply. Please connect to a Wi-Fi network to limit data charges.

- 7. Press the **OK OK** key once you have read the KaiOS Anti-Theft Notice.
- Read the KaiOS License Terms and Privacy Policy and check the boxes to allow KaiOS to access and send performance data. Press the **Right Select** key to Accept and continue.

Note: You can still create a KaiOS account without allowing KaiOS to send analytics data.

- 9. Create a KaiOS account to lock the device remotely or wipe all personal information in the event of loss or theft. Press the OK ok key to create an account. Press the Right Select key to accept the KaiOS Terms and Privacy Notice, then follow the prompts to complete setup. If you do not want to create a KaiOS account, press the Right Select key to skip.

 Note: If you choose to skip, you can create a KaiOS account at any time.

 Go to Settings > Account > KaiOS account > Create Account.
- 10. Select the network to refresh background apps and press the **Right Select** key to continue.
- 11. View tutorial screens. Press the **OK** ok key access the Home screen.

Powering your phone off

Press and hold the **End/Power** key, then select **Power Off**.

Note: From the power off screen, you can also select **Clean Up Memory** to free some memory.



Home screen

View phone status and notifications in the Status & notification bar at the top of the screen. Your notifications appear at the left side of the status bar, and phone status icons appear at the right side.

Changing Home screen wallpaper

1.	From the Home screen, press the	e OK OK key to	access the	App Menu.

- 2. Use the Navigation Ring to select Display > Wallpaper. Choose from Gallery, Camera, or Wallpaper.
 - Gallery: Choose a photo from the Camera Gallery.
 - · Camera: Take a new photo to use as wallpaper.
 - Wallpaper: Choose from a variety of high-quality wallpapers.
- When choosing a photo from the Gallery, use the Navigation Ring of to select the photo you would like to use. Press the OK OK key to view the photo, then press the Right Select key to set the device wallpaper.
- 4. When taking a new photo with the Camera, aim your camera and press the OK OK key to take a photo. Press the Right Select key to use the photo, or press the Left Select key to retake the photo.
- 5. When browsing the **Wallpapers** gallery, use the **Navigation Ring** to select the wallpaper image you want to use. Press the **Right Select** key to use the image.
- 6. Your new wallpaper will be displayed on the Home screen.

Using Navigation

The **Navigation Ring** is located above the number pad and frames the **OK** ok key.

- Press Up, Down, Left, or Right on the Navigation Ring to navigate the screen.
- From the Home screen, press the OK OK key to access the App Menu.
- From other screens, press the OK OK key to make a selection.

Navigation Ring shortcut functions

From the Home screen, use the **Navigation Ring** to perform shortcut functions.

- Press Left to access shortcuts for the KaiStore, Internet, Google, Maps and YouTube.
- Press Right to access the Internet app.
- Press Up to access the quick settings for Ringtones & Alerts, Power Saving Mode, Brightness, Airplane Mode, Wi-Fi, Cellular Data and Bluetooth.
- · Press **Down** to access the Email app.



Entering texts

- When entering text, press the tey to switch between Abc (Sentence case), abc (Lower case), ABC (Caps lock), 123 (Numbers), or Predictive (Predictive text mode).
- For normal text input, press a number key (2-9) repeatedly until the desired character is displayed.
- To quickly enter a number, press and hold the corresponding number key.
- To insert a punctuation mark or special character, press the + key then select a character and press the OK OK key.
- To use Predictive text mode, press the to select the correct word. Press the OK ok key to confirm.
- To delete characters, press the **Back/Clear** key once to delete one character at a time, or press and hold to delete the entire message.



Call Log



Making a call

Dial a number using the keypad from the Home screen. Press the **Back/Clear** key to delete incorrect digits. Press the **Call/Answer** key to place the call. To hang up the call, press the **End/Power** key, or close the phone.

Calling a contact

To make a call from the **Contacts** app, select the contact you would like to call and press the **Call/Answer** key to place the call.

Making international calls

To dial an international call, press and hold the *+* key to enter *+* in the dial screen, then enter the international country prefix followed by the phone number. Press the Call/Answer key to place the call.

Making emergency calls

To make an emergency call, dial the emergency number and press the **Call/Answer** key. This works even without a SIM card, but requires network coverage.

Answering or declining a call

Press the **OK OK** key or the **Call/Answer** key to answer.

Press the **Right Select** key or the **End/Power** bkey to decline. To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press up or down on the **Volume** key at the side of your device.

Call options

During a call, the following options are available:

- Press the Left Select key the mute the microphone.
- Press the OK OK key to use the external speakers during the call. Press the
 OK OK key again to turn the speaker off.
- Press the Right Select key to access the following options:
 - Add call: Dial another number and make another call. The current call will be placed on hold.
 - Hold call: Place the current call on hold. To resume the call, press the Right Select key again and select Unhold call.
 - Switch to RTT: Switch the call to a Real-Time Text call.

Call waiting

If you receive a call during another call, press the **Call/Answer** key to answer or the **End/Power** key to decline. You can also press the **Right**Select key to access **Options** and select **Answer** or **Decline**. Answering the incoming call will put the current call on hold.

Calling your voicemail

Press and hold the we key from the Home screen to set up voicemail or listen to your voicemail.

Note: Contact your network operator to check service availability.



Using the Call Log


- To access the Call Log, press the Call/Answer key from the Home screen. View all calls, or use the Navigation Ring to sort by Missed,
 Dialed, and Received calls.
- Press the OK OK key to call a selected number.
- From the Call Log screen, press the Right Select key to view the following options:
 - Call information: View more information about the call(s) from the selected number. Press the Right Select key to block the number.
 - Send message: Send an SMS or MMS message to the selected number.
 - Create new contact: Create a new contact with the selected number.
 - Add to existing contact: Add the selected number to an existing contact.
 - Edit call log: Delete the selected calls from your Call Log, or clear your phone call history.



Contacts

The **Contacts </u> app provides quick and easy access to your contacts.**

To access Contacts, press the **Right Select** key from the Home screen, or press the **OK** key from the Home screen and select **Contacts** from the App Menu.



Adding a contact

- From the Contacts screen, press the Left Select key to add a new contact. You can choose to save your new contact to the Phone memory or SIM card memory.
- Use the Navigation Ring to select information fields and enter the
 contact information. Press the Right Select to access more options,
 such as adding a contact photo, adding additional phone numbers or
 e-mail addresses, and more.

Note: Editing options will vary depending on the information field selected.

3. Press the **OK OK** key to save your contact.

Editing a contact

- From the Contacts screen, select the contact you would like to edit and press the Right Select key to access Options.
- 2. Select Edit contact and make the desired changes.
- 3. Press the **OK OK** key when finished to save your edits, or press the **Left Select** key to cancel and exit the Edit Contact screen.

Deleting a contact

- From the Contacts screen, press the Right Select key to access
 Options, then select Delete contacts.
- 2. Press the **OK OK** key to select the contact(s) you wish to delete, or press the

- Left Select ____ to select all contacts.
- 3. Press the **Right Select** key to delete the selected contacts.

Sharing a contact

- 1. From the Contacts screen, select a contact you want to share.
- Press the Right Select key to access Options, then select Share. You can share the contact's vCard via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.

Useful options

From the Contacts screen, press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:

- Edit contact: Edit contact information.
- Call: Make a call to the selected contact.
- Send message: Send an SMS or MMS to the selected contact.
- **Speed dial**: Assign speed dial numbers for contacts.
- Share: Send a single contact's vCard via E-mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.
- Delete contacts: Select contacts to delete.
- Move contacts: Move contacts from the Phone memory to the SIM memory and vice versa.
- Copy contacts: Copy contacts from the Phone memory to the SIM memory and vice versa.
- Search: Go to search bar to search contacts.

- Settings: Manage your contact settings.
 - Memory: Save the contacts to both the Phone and SIM memory, just the Phone memory, or just the SIM memory.
 - Sort contacts: Sort contacts by first name or last name.
 - Set Speed Dial Contacts: Set speed dial numbers for contacts. You can set the Speed Dial to make voice calls or RTT calls.
 - Set ICE Contacts: Add up to five contacts for In Case of Emergency calls.
 - Create Group: Create a group of contacts.
 - Block Contacts: Numbers blocked from Contacts, Messages, and the Call Log app will be listed here. Press the Left Select key to add a number to the Block Contacts list.
 - Import Contacts: Import contacts from the Memory card, Gmail, or Outlook
 - Export Contacts: Export contacts to the Memory card or via Bluetooth.
 - Add Account: Sync contacts with a Google or Activesync® account.



Messages

Use the **Messages** app to send and receive text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages.

To access Messages, press the **Messages** key on the keypad or press the **OK** key from the Home screen and select **Messages** from the App Menu.

Sending a text (SMS) message

- From the Messages screen, press the Left Select key to write a new message.
- Enter the phone number of the recipient in the To field at the top of the screen or press the Left Select key to add a contact.
- 3. Use the **Navigation Ring** to scroll down to access the Message field and type your message. See <u>"Entering texts" on page 22</u> for details on writing a message.
- 4. Press the **OK OK** key to send the message.

Note: An SMS message of more than 145 characters will be sent as multiple messages. Certain characters may count as 2 characters.

Sending a multimedia (MMS) message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, contacts, and sounds.

- 1. When writing a message, press the **Right Select** key to access the **Options** and select **Add attachment**.
- Select to add an attachment from Gallery, Video, Camera, Contacts, Music. or Recorder.
- 3. Select a file and follow the prompts to attach the file to the message.
- 4. Press the **OK OK** key to send the message.

Note: An SMS message will be converted to MMS automatically when media files are attached or e-mail addresses are added in the **To** field.

Message settings

From the Messages screen, press the **Right Select** key to access **Options**. Select **Settings** to view the following options:

- Auto retrieve messages: Automatically download multimedia messages when you receive them. This option is on by default. Select Off to disable automatic multimedia message downloading.
- WAP push: Turn WAP Push Messages On/Off.
- Group messages: Turn Group Messages On/Off.
- My phone number: View the phone number on the SIM card. If the number cannot be retrieved from the SIM card, it will need to be added manually.
- Wireless emergency alerts: View the Alert Inbox or access Emergency Alert Notification settings.

E-Mail



Compose, send, and receive e-mails with the **E-Mail** app.

Setting up an E-Mail account

- To access E-Mail, press Down on the Navigation Ring from the Home screen, or press the OK ok key from the Home screen and select E-Mail from the App Menu.
- 2. The e-mail wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an e-mail account. Press the Right Select key to begin setup. Enter the name, e-mail address, and password of the account you would like to set up. Press the Right Select key to continue.
- 3. If your e-mail service provider does not allow your phone to have quick e-mail setup, you will be prompted to enter settings manually. Press the Left Select key to access Advanced setup and input the required information for e-mail account setup.
- To add another e-mail account, press the Right Select key to access Options. Select Settings, then select Add.

Writing and sending e-mails

- From the E-Mail inbox, press the Left Select key to compose a new e-mail.
- Enter the recipient(s) e-mail address(es) in the To field, or press the Right Select key to add a contact.
- 3. When in the **Subject** or **Message** field, press the **Right Select** key to add CC/BCC, or add an attachment to the message.
- 4. Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5. Press the **Left Select** key to send the message immediately. To send the e-mail at another time, press the **Right Select** key and select **Save as draft** or **Cancel**



Camera


Take photos and record videos with the Camera



App Permission

Upon first use of the Camera, you will be asked for permission to know your location. Press the **OK** ok key for **Allow** or the **Left Select** key for **Deny**.

Note: Location permission can be changed at any time. Go to **Settings** > **Privacy & Security** > **App permissions** > **Camera** > **Geolocation**



Taking a photo

- To access the Camera, press the OK OK key from the Home screen to access the App Menu and select Camera .
- Position the camera so that the subject of the photo is in view. Press Up or Down on the Navigation Ring to zoom in or out.
- 3. Press the **OK** ok key or the **Camera** key at the right side of the device to take the photo. Photos are automatically saved to the Gallery app.
- 4. Press the **Left Select** key to view your photo.

Camera options

From the Camera screen, press the **Right Select** key to access **Options**. Use the **Navigation Ring** to switch between the following:

- Camera Resolution: Select Low, Standard, or High resolution.
- Self Timer: Select a 3, 5, or 10 second delay after pressing the OK ok key or the Camera key at the right side of the device.
- Grid: Add grid lines to the camera screen.
- Go to Gallery: View photos you have taken.
- Modes: Switch between Photo mode and Video mode.

Shooting a video

- 1. From the Camera screen, press **Right** on the **Navigation Ring** to switch to the Video mode.
- 2. Press **Up** or **Down** on the **Navigation Ring** to zoom in or out.
- Press the OK oK key or the Camera key at the right side of the device to record a video.
- 4. Press either key again to stop the recording. Videos will be automatically saved to the **Video** app.



View and organize your photos in one location with the **Gallery [?**] app.



To access the Gallery, press the **OK** OK key from the Home screen and select Gallery from the App Menu.



Press the Right Select key to access more Gallery options.

Individual photo options

When viewing an individual photo in the Gallery, press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:



- Delete: Delete the selected photo.
- Edit: Adjust the exposure, rotate, crop, add filters, and auto-correct the selected photo.
- Add to favorites: Add the selected photo to favorites.
- Share: Share the selected photo via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.
- File Info: View the file name, size, image type, date taken, and resolution.
- Set as: Set the selected photo as your phone wallpaper or as an existing contact's image.
- Sort and Group: Sort photos in the Gallery by Date and Time, Name, Size, or Image Type, or group photos by the date they were taken.



Video

View your recorded videos with the **Video** Dept.

To access your videos, press the **OK** ok key from the Home screen and select **Video** from the App Menu. Press the **Left Select** key to open the camera and record a video.

Available options

From the Video screen, select a video and press the **Right Select** access the following options:



- Share: Share the selected video via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.
- File info: View the file name, size, image type, date taken, and resolution.
- Delete: Delete the selected video.
- Select multiple: Select multiple videos to delete or share.

Music

Use the **Music** app to play music files stored on your phone. Music files can be downloaded from your computer to your phone using a USB cable.

To access the your music, press the **OK** oK key from the Home screen and select **Music** from the App Menu.

Listening to a song

- From the Music screen, press Right on the Navigation Ring to select the Artists, Albums, or Songs tab.
- 2. Select the artist, album, or song you wish to hear.
- 3. Press the **OK OK** key to play the selected song.

Player options

When listening to a song, press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:

- Volume: Adjust the volume of the song.
- Shuffle on: Shuffle your songs.
- Repeat all: Repeat your songs after all of them have played once.
- Add to playlist: Add the current song to an existing playlist.
- Share: Share the selected song via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.

• Save as ringtone: Save the selected song as your ringtone.

Creating a playlist

- 1. From the Music screen, press the **OK OK** key to select **My playlists**.
- 2. Press the **Right Select** key to create a new playlist.
- 3. Name your playlist and press the **Right Select** key to continue.
- 4. Press the **OK** ok key to select the songs you would like on your playlist. Press the **Left Select** key to select all of your songs. Press the **Right Select** key to create your playlist.
- 5. Press the **OK OK** key to play the selected song in your playlist.

Playlist options

From the Playlist screen, press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:

- Shuffle all: Shuffle all the songs in the selected playlist.
- Add songs: Add songs to the selected playlist.
- · Remove songs: Remove songs from the selected playlist.
- **Share**: Share the selected song via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.
- Save as ringtone: Save the selected song as your ringtone.
- **Delete**: Delete the selected playlist.
- Select multiple: Select multiple songs to delete from the playlist.




Internet

Use the **Internet** app to navigate the web.

To access the Internet, press the **OK OK** key from the Home screen and select Internet from the App Menu.

You can also access Internet via Home screen apps screen. From the Home screen, press **Left** on the **Navigation Ring** to access Home screen apps screen, and select **Internet**.




Press the **Left Select** key to access Landing Page.

Press the **Right Select** key to access options list.

Browsing the web

1. From the Internet screen, press the **Left Select** key to select the icon to access the Landing Page.



2. From the Landing Page, press the **OK OK** key or **1** 1 key to select **Search** or **enter URL** icon to access the search screen.

Note: You can also use the **Navigation Ring** or corresponding number keys to select History, KaiStore, or other preset top sites directly from the top sites screen.

3. On the Search bar, enter either search criteria or a website address. Press the **OK** ok key to search or load the website.

- 4. Use the **Navigation Ring** to scroll around the webpage, and use the **OK** key to select links when browsing the webpage.
- 5. Press the End/Power or Back/Clear key to return to the App Menu.

Useful options

From the Internet homepage, press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:

- Search or enter URL: Access the search page.
- Go back: Go back to the last viewed website.
- Go forward: Go to the next website.
- Refresh: Reload the website.
- Minimize Browser: Close the Internet app while remaining on the current website. Any information entered into the website will not be lost.
- Share: Share the current website address via E-Mail or Messages.
- Pin to: Add the current web page to your Top Sites or to your App Menu. This
 provides a shortcut to easily access your favorite sites.
- Settings:
 - Search engine: Select the default search engine.
 - Search suggestions: Enable/disable search suggestions.
- Quit browser: Exit the Internet app.
- Volume: Adjust the volume of the website.
- **Hide shortcuts tips**: Hide the shortcuts tips icon (Tips (1)) from webpages.

Calendar

Use the **Calendar** app to keep track of important meetings, events, appointments, and more.

To access the Calendar, press the **OK OK** key from the Home screen and select **Calendar** from the App Menu.

Using multimode view

You can display the Calendar in Day, Week, or Month view. Press the **Right Select** key to change your Calendar view.

Day view





Creating a new event

- 1. From any Calendar view, press the **Left Select** key to add new events.
- Fill in the event information, such as event name, location, start and end dates, and more.
- 3. When finished, press the **Right Select** key to save.

Useful options

From any Calendar view, press the **Right Select** key to view the following options:

- Go to date: Select a date to go to in the Calendar.
- Search: Search your scheduled events.
- Calendar to display: Select the account calendar you wish to view.

- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to extreme temperatures, minimum 14°F (-10°C) and maximum 113°F (45°C).
- Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.
- Do not carry your phone in your back pocket as it could break when you sit down.

Damage requiring service

Unplug the product from the electrical outlet and refer servicing to an authorized service technician or service provider under the following conditions:

- Liquid has been spilled into or an object has fallen into the product.
- The product has been exposed to rain or water.
- The product has been dropped or damaged.
- · There are noticeable signs of overheating.
- The product does not operate normally when you follow the operating instructions.

Avoid hot areas

This phone is capable of producing loud noises which may damage your hearing.

Emergency calls

This phone, like any wireless phone, operates using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you must never rely solely on any wireless phone for emergency communications.

RF Exposure Information (SAR)

This mobile phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves. This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

The highest SAR value for the model phone as reported to the FCC when tested for use at the ear is 0.67 W/kg, in hotspot mode is 1.34 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.26 W/kg (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements.).

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. For body worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets the FCC RF exposure guidelines for use with an accessory that contains no metal and positions the handset a minimum of 1.5 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. If you do not use a body-worn accessory and are not holding the phone at the ear, position the handset a minimum of 1.5 cm from your body when the phone is switched on.

Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) for Wireless Telecommunication Devices

This phone has a HAC rating of M4/T4.

What is hearing aid compatibility?

The Federal Communications Commission has implemented rules and a rating system designed to enable people who wear hearing aids to more effectively use these wireless telecommunications devices. The standard for compatibility of digital wireless phones with hearing aids is set forth in American National Standard Institute (ANSI) standard C63.19. There are two sets of ANSI standards with ratings from one to four (four being the best rating): an "M" rating for reduced interference making it easier to hear conversations on the phone when using the hearing aid microphone, and a "T" rating that enables the phone to be used with hearing aids operating in the tele-coil mode, thus reducing unwanted background noise.

How will I know which wireless phones are hearing aid compatible?

The Hearing Aid Compatibility rating is displayed on the wireless phone box. A phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for acoustic coupling (microphone mode) if it has an "M3" or "M4" rating. A digital wireless phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for inductive coupling (tele-coil mode) if it has a "T3" or "T4" rating.

Troubleshooting

Before contacting the service center, follow the instructions below:

- Make sure your phone's battery is fully charged for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your phone, as this may affect its performance.
- Use Reset and the Software Update to perform phone formatting or software upgrading. ALL Users phone data (contacts, photos, messages and files, downloaded applications, etc.) will be permanently deleted. It is strongly advised to fully back up the phone data and profile before formatting and upgrading.

Note: This phone uses cellular data for certain services, applications and functions. If not connected to Wi-Fi, standard data charges will apply. Please connect to a Wi-Fi network to limit data charges.

If you are having the following issues:

My phone has not responded for several minutes.

- Restart your phone by pressing and holding the End/Power (1) key.
- If you are unable to turn the phone off, remove and replace the battery, then turn the phone on again.

My phone turns off by itself.

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your phone, and make sure the End/Power (b) key is not being pressed due to an unlocked screen.
- Check the battery charge level.

My phone cannot charge properly.

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery
 power is empty for a long time, it may take around 12 minutes to display the
 battery charger indicator on the screen.
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C (32°F) to 45°C (113°F)).
- · When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

My phone cannot connect to a network or "No service" is displayed.

- · Try connecting in another location.
- · Verify the network coverage with your service provider.
- Check with your service provider that your SIM card is valid.
- Try selecting the available network(s) manually.
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded.

My phone cannot connect to the Internet.

- Check that the IMEI number (press *#06#) is the same as the one printed on your warranty card or box.
- Make sure that the internet access service of your SIM card is available.
- · Check your phone's Internet connecting settings.
- Make sure you are in a place with network coverage.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

My phone says my SIM card is invalid.

Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see <u>"Inserting or removing the Nano SIM card and microSDTM card" on page 12</u>).

- Make sure the chip on your SIM card is not damaged or scratched.
- Make sure the service of your SIM card is available.

I am unable to make outgoing calls.

- Make sure the number you have dialed is correct and valid, and that you
 have pressed the Call/Answer key.
- For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.
- Check your subscription status with your service provider (credit, SIM card is valid, etc.).
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls.
- · Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

I am unable to receive incoming calls.

- Make sure your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network).
- Check your subscription status with your service provider (credit, SIM card is valid, etc.).
- · Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

The caller's name/number does not appear when a call is received.

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your service provider.
- Your caller has concealed his/her name or number.

I cannot find my contacts.

- · Make sure your SIM card is not broken.
- Make sure your SIM card is inserted properly.
- Import all contacts stored in SIM card to phone.

The sound quality of the calls is poor.

- You can adjust the volume during a call by pressing up or down on the Volume key at the side of your device.
- · Check the network strength.
- Make sure that the receiver, connector, and speaker on your phone are clean.

I am unable to use the features described in the manual.

- Check with your service provider to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure this feature does not require an accessory.

I am unable to dial a number from my contacts.

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file.
- If Make sure that you have entered the correct country prefix if calling a foreign country.

I am unable to add a contact.

 Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files in the phone contacts.

Callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail.

Contact your service provider to check service availability.

I cannot access my voicemail.

- Make sure your service provider's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voicemail number".
- Try later if the network is busy.

I am unable to send and receive MMS messages.

- · Check if your phone memory availability is full.
- Contact your service provider to check service availability and check MMS parameters.
- Verify the server center number or MMS profile with your service provider.
- The server center may be swamped, try again later.

My SIM card is PIN locked.

Contact your service provider for the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key).

I am unable to download new files.

- Make sure there is sufficient phone memory for your download.
- · Check your subscription status with your service provider.

The phone cannot be detected by others via Bluetooth.

- Make sure Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two phones are within Bluetooth's detection range.

How to make your battery last longer.

- Fully charge your phone for a minimum of 2 hours.
- Extend the e-mail auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Exit applications running in the background if they have not been used for a long time.
- Deactivate Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or Location when not in use.

The phone will become warm following prolonged calls, playing games, using the browser, or running other complex applications.

This heating is a normal consequence of the CPU handling excessive data.
 Ending above actions will make your phone return to normal temperatures.
