Getting started

Assembly

Before you start using your phone, you need to insert a SmartChip and the battery.

The battery must be removed before the SmartChip is inserted or removed.

To insert the SmartChip



1 Remove the battery cover.

2 Slide the SmartChip into its holder with the contacts facing down.

To insert the battery



- 1 Insert the battery with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.
- 2 Replace the battery cover.

To remove the battery

1 Remove the battery cover.

- 2 Insert your fingernail in the indentation.
- 3 Remove the battery.



Turning on the phone

To turn on the phone



- 1 Press and hold down (C_o).
- 2 Select a mode if requested:
 - Normal full functionality.
 - Flight Mode limited functionality.
- 3 Enter your SmartChip PIN, if requested.
- 4 Select a language.
- 5 Select Yes to use the setup wizard.
- If you want to correct mistake when you enter your PIN. press (C_n).

SmartChip

The SmartChip, which you get from AT&T, contains information about your subscription. Always turn off your

phone and detach the charger and the battery before you insert or remove the SmartChip.

 You can save contacts on the SmartChip before you remove it from your phone. See To copy names and numbers to the SmartChip on page 26.

PIN

You may need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) to activate the services in your phone. Your PIN is supplied by your network operator. Each PIN digit appears as *, unless it starts with emergency number digits, for example, 112 or 911. You can see and call an emergency number without entering a PIN.

To delete numbers from the display

- Press (Co).
- If you enter the wrong PIN three times in a row, PIN Blocked appears. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key). See Smartchip lock on page 56.

Flight mode

In Flight Mode the network and radio transceivers are turned off to prevent disturbance to sensitive equipment.



'_ You can use the Bluetooth™ function in Flight mode.

Standby

After you have turned your phone on and entered your PIN, the name of the network operator appears on the screen. This is called standby.

Help in your phone

Help and information is available in your phone at any time. See *Navigation* on page 15.

To use the setup wizard

- 1 From standby select Menu > Settings > the General tab > Setup Wizard.
- 2 Select an option.

To view information about functions

 Scroll to a function and select Info, if available. In some cases, Info appears under More.

Charging the battery

The phone battery is partly charged when you buy it.

To charge the battery





1 Connect the charger to the phone. It takes approximately 2.5 hours to fully charge the battery.

- 2 Remove the charger by tilting the plug upwards.
- You can use your phone while it is charging. You can charge the battery at any time and for more or less than 2.5 hours. You can interrupt the charging without damaging the battery.





Memory card

Your phone supports Memory Stick Micro™ (M2™) memory card adding more storage space to your phone. It can also be used as a portable memory card with other compatible devices

To insert a memory card



- 1 Open the memory card holder.
- 2 Insert the memory card with the gold-colored contacts facing down.
- 3 Close the memory card holder.
- 4 Slide the memory card holder to lock it.

To view memory card options

Handling files

You can move and copy files between your phone, a computer and a memory card. If a memory card is in the phone, files are saved on the memory card by default but can also be saved to the phone memory. Unrecognized files are saved in the Other folder.

You can create subfolders to move or copy files to. When you handle files, you can select more than one or all the files in a folder at the same time for all items except Games and Applications.

If the memory is full, delete some content to create space.

My Stuff tabs

My Stuff is divided into three tabs, and icons indicate where the files are saved.

- All Files all content in the phone memory and on a memory card.
- On Memory Stick all content on a memory card.

 In Phone – all content in the phone memory.

To view information about files

- 1 From standby select Menu > My Stuff.
- 2 Scroll to a folder and select Open.
- 3 Scroll to a file and select More > Information

To move a file in My Stuff

To select more than one file in a folder

- 1 From standby select Menu > My Stuff.
- 2 Scroll to a folder and select Open.

- 4 Select Mark to mark the files

To delete a file from the file manager

- 1 From standby select Menu > My Stuff.
- 2 Find the file and press (Co).

Phone language

You can select a language to use in your phone.

To change the phone language

- 2 Select an option.

Entering text

You can use multitap text input or T9™ Text Input Tg to enter text. The T9 Text Input method uses a built-in dictionary.

To change text input method

 When you enter text, press and hold down (*a/A).

To shift between capitals and lowercase letters

When you enter text, press (*a/A).

To enter numbers

 When you enter text, press and hold down (0+) - (9).

To enter punctuation

When you enter text, press (150).

To enter text using T9™ Text Input

- 1 From standby select, for example, Menu > Messaging > Write New > Message.
- 2 If 19 is not displayed, press and hold down (*a/h) to change to T9 Text Input.

- 3 Press each key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key. For example, if you want to write the word "Jane", press 5, 2, 6, 3. Write the whole word before looking at the suggestions.
- 4 Use a or to view suggestions.
 5 Press ### to accept a suggestion.

To enter text using multitan

- 1 From standby select, for example, Menu > Messaging > Write New > Message.
- 2 If 19 is displayed, press and hold down (***) to change to multitap text input.
- 3 Press 2 9 repeatedly until the desired letter appears.
- 4 When a word is written, press (#-3) to add a space.

To add words to the built-in dictionary

- 1 When you enter text using T9 Text Input, select More > Spell Word.
- 2 Write the word using multitap input and select Insert

Walkman™ and music

Browsing files

Music files are saved and categorized.

- Artists list tracks you have transferred using Media Manager.
- Albums list tracks by album.
- Tracks list all music tracks in your phone and on a memory card.
- Playlists your own lists of tracks.

Playlists

You can create playlists to organize files in My Stuff. Files can be added to more than one playlist.

Deleting a playlist, or a file from a playlist, does not delete the file from the memory, just the reference to the file.

To create a playlist

- 1 From standby select Menu > AT&T Music > WALKMAN > More > My Music.
- 2 Scroll to Playlists and select Open.
- 3 Scroll to New playlist and select Add.
- 4 Enter a name and select OK.
- 5 Scroll to a track and select Mark.

To add files to a playlist

Calling

Making and receiving calls

You need to turn on your phone and be within range of a network.

 Do not cover the bottom of your phone
 when it is in use, as this affects call quality.

To make a call

- 1 From standby enter a phone number (with international country code and area code, if applicable).
- 2 Select Call.
- You can call numbers from the contacts and call list. See Contacts on page 25, and Call list on page 28.

To make international calls

- 2 Enter the country code, area code (without the first zero) and phone number.
- 3 Select Call.

To re-dial a number

When Retry? appears select Yes.



Do not hold your phone to your ear when waiting. When the call connects, your phone gives a loud signal.

To answer a call

- Select Answer
- · Open the flip.

To reject a call

• Select Busy.

To change the ear speaker volume during a call

Press ▲ or ▼.

To mute the microphone during a call

- 1 Press and hold down Co.
- 2 Press and hold down Co again to resume.

To turn the loudspeaker on during a call

• Select More > Turn on speaker.



Do not hold your phone to your ear when using the loudspeaker. This could damage your hearing.

Emergency calls

Your phone supports international emergency numbers, for example, 112 and 911. These numbers can normally be used to make emergency calls in any country, with or without the SmartChip inserted, if a network is within range.

In some countries, other emergency numbers may also be promoted. Your network operator may therefore have saved additional local emergency numbers on the SmartChip.

To make an emergency call

 From standby enter 112 (the international emergency number) and select Call.

To view your local emergency numbers

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Scroll to New Contact.
- 3 Select Options > Special Numbers > Emergency Nos..

Contacts

You can save names, phone numbers and personal information in Address Book. Information can be saved in the phone memory or on the SmartChip.

Default contact

You can choose which contact information – Phone Contacts or SmartChip Contacts – is shown as default

If Phone Contacts is selected as default, your contacts show all the information saved in Address Book. If you select SmartChip Contacts as default, your contacts show names and numbers saved on the SmartChip.

To select default contacts

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Scroll to New Contact and select Options > Advanced > Default Contacts.
- 3 Select an option.

Phone contacts

Phone contacts can contain names, phone numbers and personal information. They are saved in the phone memory.

To add a phone contact

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Scroll to New Contact and select Add.
- 3 Enter the name and select OK.
- 4 Enter the number and select OK.

- 5 Select a number option.
- 6 Scroll between tabs and select the fields to add information.
- 7 Select Save.

To add an item to a phone contact

 Book
- 2 Scroll to a contact and select More > Edit Contact.
- 3 Scroll between the tabs and select Add.
- 4 Select an option and an item to add.
- 5 Select Save.
- Lifyour subscription supports Calling Line Identification (CLI) service, you can assign personal ringtones to contacts.

To copy names and numbers to the SmartChip

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Select More > Options > Advanced > Copy to SmartChip.
- 3 Select an option.
- When you copy all contacts from your phone to the SmartChip, all existing SmartChip information is replaced.

To call a phone contact

1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.

- 2 Scroll to a contact and select Call
- To go directly to a contact, from standby press 2 9. See Speed dial on page 29.

To call a SmartChip contact from phone contacts

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book > More > Options > SmartChip Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to a contact and select Call.

To automatically save names and phone numbers on the SmartChip

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Select More > Options > Advanced > Auto save on Smartchip.
- 3 Select an option.

SmartChip contacts

SmartChip contacts can contain names and numbers only. They are saved on the SmartChip.

To add a SmartChip contact

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Scroll to New Contact and select Add.
- 3 Enter the name and select OK.
- 4 Enter the number and select OK.
- 5 Select a number option and add more information, if available.

6 Select Save

To copy names and numbers to phone contacts

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Select More > Options > Advanced > Copy from SmartChip.
- 3 Select an option.

To call a SmartChip contact

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Scroll to a contact and select Call.

Deleting contacts

To delete a contact

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Scroll to a contact and press C_o.

To delete all phone contacts

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Select More > Options > Advanced > Delete all contacts.

Sending contacts

To send a contact

1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.

- 2 Scroll to a contact and select More > Send Contact.
- 3 Select a transfer method.
- Make sure the receiving device supports
 the transfer method you select.

Memory status

The number of contacts you can save in your phone or on the SmartChip depends on available memory.

To view memory status

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Select More > Options > Advanced > Memory Status.

To save contacts on a memory card

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book.
- 2 Select More > Options > Advanced > Back up to M.S..

Groups

You can create a group of phone numbers and email addresses to send messages to. See *Messaging* on page 33. You can also use groups (with phone numbers) when you create accepted callers lists. See *Accept calls* on page 31.

To create a group of numbers and email addresses

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book > Options > Groups > New Group.
- 2 Enter a name for the group and select Continue
- 3 Select New to find and select a contact phone number or email address
- 4 Repeat step 3 to add more phone numbers or email addresses.
- 5 Select Done.

Call list

You can view information about most recent calls.

To call a number from the call list

- 1 From standby select Calls and scroll to a tab
- 2 Scroll to a name or a number and select Call.

To add a call list number to contacts

- 1 From standby select Calls and scroll to a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the number and select More > Save Number.
- 3 Select New Contact to create a new contact or select an existing contact to add the number to.

To clear the call list

 From standby select Calls > the All tab - More - Delete All

Speed dial

Speed dialing lets you select nine contacts that you can dial quickly. The contacts can be saved in positions 1-9

To add contacts to speed dial numbers

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book
- 2 Select Options > Delete All.
- 3 Scroll to a position number and select. Δdd
- 4 Select a contact

To speed dial

 From standby enter the position number and select Call

Noicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voicemail message when you cannot answer a call

To enter your voicemail number

1 From standby select Menu > Messaging > Settings > Voicemail Number

2 Enter the number and select OK

To call your voicemail service

 From standby press and hold down (1∞).

To edit vour voicemail number

- 1 From standby select Menu > Messaging > Settings > Voicemail Number
- 2 Edit the number and select OK

Torwarding calls

You can forward calls, for example, to an answering service.

Forward call options Standard options are:

- Always Forward forward all your calls
- Unanswered if not answered in a specified time

To forward calls

- 1 From standby select Menu > Settings > the Calls tab > Forward Calls
- 2 Scroll to a call type and forward option and select Activate
- 3 Enter the number to forward calls to and select OK.



More than one call

You can handle more than one call at the same time. For example, you can put an ongoing call on hold, while you make or answer a second call. You can also switch between the two calls You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls.

Call waiting

When call waiting is used, you hear a beep if you receive a second call.

To activate call waiting

 From standby select Menu > Settings > the Calls tab > Manage Calls > Call Waiting > Activate.

To make a second call

- 1 During the call, select More > Hold. This puts the ongoing call on hold.
- 2 Enter the number to call and select More > Call

To answer a second call

 During the call, select Answer, This puts the ongoing call on hold.

To reject a second call

 During the call, select Busy and continue with the ongoing call.

To end an ongoing call and answer a second call

 During the call, select Replace Active Call

Handling two voice calls

You can have calls ongoing and on hold at the same time

To switch between two calls

During the call, select More > Switch.

To join two calls

 During the call, select More > Join Calle

To connect two calls

 During the call, select More > Transfer Call. You are disconnected from both calls

To end an ongoing call and return to the call on hold

Select End Call > Yes.

To end both calls

Select End Call > No.

Receiving a third voice call

You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls or ioining them into a conference call.



Conference calls

With a conference call, you can have a ioint conversation with up to five people

To join the two calls

 During the call, select More > Join Calls

To add a new participant

- 1 During the call, select More > Hold. This puts the joined calls on hold.
- 2 Select More > Add Call
- Enter the number to call and select. Call
- 4 Select More > Join Calls to add the new participant.
- 5 Repeat this task to add more participants.

To release a participant

- 1 Select More > Release Party.
- 2 Select the participant to release.

To have a private conversation

1 During the call, select More > Talk to and select the participant to talk to.

- 2 To resume the conference call, select More > Join Calle
- If your subscription supports Alternate Line Service (ALS), you can make separate calls with different phone numbers

Mv numbers

You can view, add and edit your own phone numbers.

To check your phone numbers

- 1 From standby select Menu > Address Book > Options > Special Numbers > My Numbers.


