
Assembly

To insert the SIM card and the memory card



- 1 Remove the battery cover.
- 2 Slide the SIM card and the memory card into the holders with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

To remove the memory card



 Remove the battery cover and press the edge of the memory card to release and remove it.

To insert the battery



- 1 Insert the battery with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.
- 2 Attach the battery cover.

Turning the phone on and off

The first time you turn on the phone, the Welcome menu appears.

To turn on the phone

- 1 Press and hold down the (1) key on the top of the phone.
- 2 Enter your SIM card PIN, if requested, and select **OK**.
- 3 At first startup, follow the instructions in the Welcome menu.
- Your PIN is supplied by your network operator. If you want to correct a mistake made while entering your SIM card PIN, press .

To turn off the phone

- 1 Press and hold () until the options menu opens.
- 2 In the options menu, tap Power off.
- 3 Tap **OK**.

To activate the screen

Press ☐ or press ① briefly.

Connect and communicate

Importing contacts from the SIM card

The first time you start your phone, a setup guide lets you import contacts from the SIM card. You can also import the SIM contacts later.

Internet and messaging settings

For most mobile phone networks and operators, settings for messaging and Internet will be preinstalled in your phone when you buy it. In some cases you will get the option to download settings the first time you turn on the phone with a SIM card inserted. It is also possible to automatically download or manually add and change Internet and network settings in your phone at any time. See *Internet and messaging settings* on page 25 for more information.

Please contact your network operator for any other information on your subscription settings.

Social web services

You can use your phone with many web-based services, for example, social networking and media sharing.

- You can set up some of your web service accounts to use them with Sony Ericsson Timescape™ and your phone contacts.
- You can share photos and videos using a number of web services. See Setting up accounts for online services on page 68.

Google™ account

You can set up a Google[™] account in your phone to use with the Google Mail[™], Google Talk[™] and Google Calendar[™] applications.

To set up a Google™ account in your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Online service accounts > Google.
- 3 Follow the registration wizard to create a Google[™] account, or sign in if you already have an account.
- 4 Your phone is now ready to use with Google Mail™, Google Talk™ and Google Calendar™.
- It is also possible to create or set up a Google[™] account from the **Welcome!** menu the first time you start the phone. You can also create a Google[™] account by going to www.google.com/accounts in the web browser of your computer.

To delete a Google™ account from your phone

- Performing this task may reset all user data in all Google™ services in your phone. You will need to sign in with your Google™ account to use these services again. Make sure you have saved and made backups of all data in your phone before you proceed. For more information on how to make a complete reset of the phone, see *Resetting the phone* on page 94.
- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Scroll down and tap Google Mail™.
- 4 Tap Clear data.
- 5 Press <□.
- 6 Scroll down and tap Google Apps.
- 7 Tap Clear data.

Synchronising and handling content

You can synchronise and transfer many types of files, documents and information between your phone, a computer or the Internet. You can, for example:


- Use a USB cable to connect your phone to a computer. You can then transfer content between the phone and the computer. See *Connecting your phone to a computer* on page 56 for more information.
- Use the Media Go[™] application to transfer and handle music, pictures and videos on your phone and PC. See the *Media Go[™]* section on page 57 for more information.
- Use the Sony Ericsson sync application to synchronise contacts and bookmarks between your phone and the web. This way, you can access the content from any computer, wherever you are. See Sony Ericsson Sync on page 45 for more information.

Charging the battery

The phone battery is partly charged when you buy the phone.



To charge the phone using the power adapter

• Connect the phone to a power outlet using the USB cable and the power adapter.

To charge the phone using a computer

 Connect the phone to a USB port on a computer using the USB cable included in the phone kit.

Maximising battery performance


You can use the following methods to improve your battery performance:

- Decrease the brightness of the screen.
- Charge your phone often. The battery lasts longer if you charge it frequently.
- If you are in an area with no coverage, your phone repeatedly scans for available networks. This consumes power. If you cannot move to an area with better coverage, turn off your phone temporarily.
- Turn off 3G, Bluetooth™ wireless technology and the Wi-Fi™ connection when you do not need these functions.
- Do not cover the phone antenna when you are engaged in a call or when transferring data.
 The antenna is located at the back of phone

Using the hardware keys



Menu Open a list of options available in the current screen or application
 Home • Go to the **Home** screen from any application or screen
 Open the recently used applications window
 Back • Go back to the previous screen
 Close the onscreen keyboard, a dialog box, an options menu, or the Notifications panel

Home screen

The **Home** screen is the starting point of your phone. You can personalise the **Home** screen by adding widgets, or by changing the wallpaper and the applications in the corners.

When you add more than one widget, the **Home** screen extends beyond the screen width. The corners on the **Home** screen are used to access applications or bookmarks quickly. You can add any application or bookmark to the corners.

- When you go to the **Home** screen, some applications may continue to run in the background. If you do not want applications to run in the background, you should exit each application you have opened before going to the **Home** screen.
- Widget is a part of an application on the **Home** screen. It displays important information from that application, for example the Sony Ericsson Timescape™ widget displays incoming messages and the Media widget allows you to start the music directly.



To view the extended Home screen

• Drag your finger to the sides to view the entire **Home** screen.

To add a Home screen item

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press \boxplus and tap **Add**.
- 2 In the Add to Home screen menu, select the item you want to add.

To move an item to an area of the extended Home screen

- 1 Touch and hold an item on the **Home** screen until it magnifies and the phone vibrates.
- 2 Drag the item to the left or right.
- 3 Release the item.

To delete a Home screen item

- 1 Touch and hold the item until 前 appears at the bottom of the screen.
- 2 Drag the item to in and hold until the bottom of the screen lights up.
- 3 Release the item.

To add a folder to the Home screen

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press :::.
- 2 Tap Add > Folder.
- 3 Select the folder type you want to add.

To add items to a folder

- 1 Touch and hold an application icon until it magnifies and the phone vibrates.
- 2 Drag the application icon over to the folder.

To rename a folder

- 1 Tap the folder to open it.
- 2 Touch and hold the folder's title bar to open the Rename folder dialog box.
- 3 Enter the **Folder name** and tap **OK**.

To add widgets to the Home screen

- 1 Touch and hold on the **Home** screen until the **Add to Home screen** menu appears.
- 2 Tap Widgets.
- 3 Select an option.

To create a shortcut from the applications screen

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Touch and hold an application until it appears on the **Home** screen.

To change the Home screen wallpaper

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press ::...
- 2 Tap Wallpaper.
- 3 Tap Pictures or Wallpaper gallery.
- 4 Tap Save or Set wallpaper.

Creatouch™ application

Mix different backgrounds, colors and shapes to create your own unique wallpapers. You can also create free-hand drawings, and add text or photos. Share your self-designed wallpapers with friends by uploading them to FacebookTM and PicasaTM.

To open Creatouch™

From the Home screen, tap the applications bar, then tap [™] Creatouch[™].

Creatouch™ menu overview

Choose from a variety of colors, backgrounds, shapes and elements:



- Select different shapes, numbers, text, or the free-hand paintbrush. You can also select the eraser if you want to correct something
- 2 Select which color scheme you want to use when creating your wallpaper
- 3 Set a background by choosing a photo from your camera album, or select a preset color
- 4 Upload your wallpaper to Facebook™ or Picasa™
- Clear the workspace area
 - Set the current design as wallpaper
 - Save the current wallpaper to your memory card
 - Mute the sound
 - View information about Creatouch™

To add shapes and text to your wallpaper

- 1 Touch and hold or to scroll to the left or right, and choose which home screen pane you want to start working on.
- 2 Tap the icon to open the menu.
- 3 Choose which shape or text you want to add to your wallpaper. If you tap the text icon, you also need to tap the text input field and enter the desired text.
- 4 Tap the icon to go back to the workspace.
- 5 Tap the screen to apply the shapes or text to the current pane. You can also hold and drag your finger across the screen to scatter the shapes or text.

Status bar

A status bar at the top of the screen displays phone status information and notifications. Notification icons appear on the left side of the status bar. Phone status icons appear on the right side.

To open the recently used applications window

From any application, press and hold down □.

Notification LED

The Notification LED is located at the top right corner. It provides information on the phone status and on pending notifications.

LED status

Status	Indication
Green	The battery is almost charged (90-100%)
Flashing green	You have a pending notification
Flashing red	The battery level is low. The battery is charging and the battery level is still low
Yellow	The battery is charging. The level is between low and full

The LED is turned off when charging is completed.

Sensors

Your phone has two built-in sensors – a light sensor and a proximity sensor. The light sensor is used for automatic LCD backlight control. The proximity sensor turns the touch screen off when your face touches the screen. This prevents you from unintentionally activating phone functions when you are engaged in a call.

Using the touch screen

To open or highlight an item

Tap the item.

To zoom

- When available, tap or to zoom in or out.
- You may have to drag the screen (in any direction) to make the zoom icons appear.

To pan

• When this option is available, drag the screen to pan.

To mark or unmark options

• Tap the relevant checkbox or radio button to mark or unmark an option.



Scrolling

You can scroll up or down, and on some webpages you can also scroll to the sides.

Dragging or flicking will not activate anything on the screen.

To scroll



- Drag up or down to scroll.
- Flick to scroll quickly. You can wait for the scrolling to come to a stop or you can stop it immediately by tapping the screen.

Orientation

When you turn the phone sideways, the screen orientation changes automatically between portrait and landscape view. You can also set the phone to stay in portrait orientation by disabling the automatic orientation setting.

To prevent the screen orientation from changing automatically

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Unmark the **Orientation** check box.
- Preventing the screen orientation from changing automatically means that the phone stays in portrait orientation.

To set the screen orientation to automatic

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Mark the Orientation check box.

List

Some lists have an alphabetic index on the side. Drag your finger along the index to scroll through the index letters.



To jump directly to an index letter

From any list with index letters, tap the letter you want to select on the index.

Screen lock

The screen lock prevents unwanted actions on the touch screen when you are not using your phone. When the phone is left idle for a set period of time, the screen locks automatically. You can change the direction of the screen lock path to get a better feel, depending on if you are left- or right-handed.

To lock the screen

• Press () briefly.

To unlock the screen

• Drag the screen lock arrow along the screen lock path.

To set the time interval for the automatic screen lock

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Sound & display > Screen timeout.
- 3 Select an option.

To change the direction of the screen lock path



 Touch and hold the upper part of the screen lock path, then drag it to the opposite side of the screen.

To select an input method

- 1 When you enter text, touch and hold the text bar, then tap **Input Method**.
- 2 Select an option.

To display the keyboard and enter text

• Tap the text field and the keyboard appears.

To enter numbers using the keyboard

• When you enter text, tap . A keyboard with numbers appears.

To shift between upper-case and lower-case letters

Before you enter a letter, tap

To turn on the Caps lock

To enter symbols using the keyboard

- 1 When you enter text, tap ⊚.
- 2 Select an option.

To insert a smiley

- 1 When you enter text, tap ⊚.
- 2 Select an option.

To add words to the User dictionary

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Locale & text > Standard keyboard > My words.
- 3 Press #.
- 4 Tap **Add** and tap the text bar to open the keyboard.
- 5 Write the word and tap **OK**.

To use the landscape keyboard

When the keyboard is available, turn the phone sideways.

- 5 Tap + or to adjust the date.
- 6 Tap Set.

To set the time

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time.
- 3 Unmark the Automatic checkbox, if it is marked
- 4 Tap **Set time**
- 5 Tap + or to adjust the hour and minute.
- 6 Tap **AM** to change to **PM** or vice versa.
- 7 Tap Set.
- You have to unmark Use 24-hour format if you want to change AM to PM.

To set the time zone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time.
- 3 Unmark the **Automatic** checkbox, if it is marked.
- 4 Tap Select time zone.
- 5 Select an option.

To set the hour format

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time > Use 24-hour format.
- 3 Mark the check box to shift between 12 hour or 24 hour format.

To set the date format

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time > Select date format.
- 3 Select an option.

Ringer settings

To set a phone ringtone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Phone ringtone.
- 3 Select a ringtone.

To enable touch tones

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Select the Audible touch tones or Audible selection.

To select a notification ringtone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Notification ringtone.
- 3 Select a ringtone and tap **OK**.

To set the vibrating alert

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Mark the **Phone vibrate** check box.

Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the ringtone volume for phone calls and notifications as well as for music and video playback.

To adjust the ringer volume with the volume key

Press the volume key up or down.

To adjust the media playing volume with the volume key

• When playing music or watching video, press the volume key up or down.

To set the phone to silent mode

- 1 Press and hold (1) on the top of the phone.
- 2 Tap Silent mode.

Screen settings

To adjust the screen brightness

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Brightness.
- To decrease the screen brightness, drag the slider to the left. To increase the screen brightness, drag the slider to the right.
- 4 Tap **OK**.

To adjust the idle time before the screen turns off

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Screen timeout.
- 3 Select an option.
- To turn off the screen quickly, press ().

To keep the screen on while charging the phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- 3 Mark the Stay awake check box.

Phone language

You can select a language to use in your phone.

To change the phone language

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Locale & text > Select locale.
- 3 Select an option.
- If you choose the wrong language and cannot read the menu texts, go to www.sonyericsson.com/support for help.

Airplane mode

In Airplane mode, no radio transmissions are made by the phone.

To turn on Airplane mode

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls.
- 3 Mark the Airplane mode check box.

SIM card

The SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card, which you get from your network operator, contains information about your subscription. Always turn off your phone and detach the charger before you insert or remove the SIM card.

You can save contacts on the SIM card before you remove it from your phone.

PIN

You may need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) to activate the services and functions in your phone. Each PIN digit appears as *, unless it starts with emergency number digits, for example, 112 or 911. You can call an emergency number without entering a PIN.

Memory

You can save content on a memory card, in the phone memory and on the SIM card. Music, video clips and photos are saved on the memory card while applications, contacts and messages are saved in the phone memory. You can export and import contacts and messages to the memory card for backup purposes. Contacts can also be saved on the SIM card.

Memory card

You may have to purchase a memory card separately.

Your phone supports a microSD™ memory card, which is used for media content. This type of card can also be used as a portable memory card with other compatible devices.

Without a memory card you cannot use the camera, nor can you play or download music files and video clips.

Internet and messaging settings

For most mobile phone networks and operators, settings for messaging and Internet will be preinstalled in your phone when you buy it. In some cases you will get to download the settings to your phone. This is done in one step the first time you turn on the phone with a SIM card inserted, by simply accepting the download of the settings when the phone starts up. It is also possible to automatically download or manually add and change Internet and network settings in your phone at any time. If you have accidentally removed the default access point name (APN), you can reset it any time.

Please contact your network operator for any other information on your subscription settings.

To download Internet and messaging settings

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks.
- 3 Tap Auto Internet settings.

To reset the default Internet settings

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.
- 3 Press III.

To turn off the data connection

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks.
- 3 Unmark the MMS & Data checkbox.

To see the current network connection

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks.
- 3 Tap Access Point Names.
- If you have several available connections, a marked radio button to the right indicates the active network connection.

To configure Internet settings manually

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.
- 3 Press :::.
- 4 Tap New APN.
- 5 Tap **Name** and enter the name of the network profile you want to create.
- 6 Tap **APN** and enter the access point name.
- 7 Tap and enter all other information required by your network operator.
- 8 Press # and tap Save.
- Contact your network operator for detailed information about your network settings.

Data roaming

Depending on your network operator, it might be possible to allow mobile data connections via 2G/3G outside of your home network (roaming). Please note that data transmission charges may apply. Contact your network operator for more information.

Applications may sometimes use the Internet connection in your home network without any notification, for example, when sending search and synchronisation requests.

To activate data roaming

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks.
- 3 Mark the **Data roaming** checkbox.

Network settings

Your phone automatically switches between networks depending on availability. Some network operators allow you to switch networks manually, for example, if you are travelling abroad and want to use a particular network.

To save battery, you can limit your phone to only use GSM networks. Data downloads and uploads will however be slower. If you are going to download or upload large amounts of data, we recommend that you change to another network mode or connect to the Internet through a Wi-Fi[™] network.

To limit your phone to use GSM networks only

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks .
- 3 Tap Network Mode.
- 4 Select GSM only.

To select another network manually

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks > Network operators.
- 3 Tap Select manually.
- 4 Tap a network name.
- If you select a network manually, your phone will not search for another network, even if you move out of range of the manually selected network.
- Some networks may not be allowed by your network operator. If so, this is indicated by a symbol next to the network name in the list of networks.

To activate automatic network selection

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks > Network operators.
- 3 Tap Select automatically.

Calling

Emergency calls

Your phone supports international emergency numbers, for example, 112 or 911. You can normally use these numbers to make emergency calls in any country, with or without the SIM card inserted, if you are within range of a network.

To make an emergency call

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Enter the emergency number and tap Call. To delete a number, tap ...
- You can make an emergency call without a SIM card inserted.

To make an emergency call while the SIM card is locked

- 1 Tap Emergency call.
- 2 Enter the emergency number and tap Call. To delete a number, tap ...

Call handling

To make a call

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Enter the number of the recipient and tap Call. To delete a number, tap

To end a call

• Tap End call.

To make an international call

- 1 From Home screen, tap Dialer.
- 2 Touch and hold down 0 until a "+" sign appears.
- 3 Enter the country code, area code (without the first 0) and phone number, then tap **Call**.

To answer a call

- If the screen is unlocked, tap **Answer** to answer the call.
- If the screen is locked, unlock it to answer the call.
- If you are using regular headphones without a microphone, you have to remove the headphones from the headset connector to be able to answer the call.

To decline a call

Tap Decline.

To change the ear speaker volume during a call

• Press the volume key up or down.

To turn on the loudspeaker during a call

- 1 Press :::
- 2 Tap Speaker.

To mute the microphone during a call

- 1 Press #.
- 2 Tap Mute.

To activate the screen during a call

- Press □.
- Do not press (), it will end your call.

To enter numbers during a call

- 1 During a call, drag the iii icon (at the bottom of the screen) upwards. A keypad appears.
- 2 Enter numbers.

To mute the ringtone for an incoming call

• When you receive the call, press the volume key.

Recent calls

In the call log, you can view recently missed , received and dialled calls.

To view missed calls

- 1 When you have missed calls, appears in the status bar. Drag the status bar downwards.
- 2 Tap Missed call.

To call a number from the call log

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer** > **Call log**.
- 2 If you want to call a number directly, tap \(\) next to the number. If you want to edit a number before calling, touch and hold the desired number, then select the desired option.

To add a number from the call log to your contacts

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer** > **Call log**.
- 2 Tap and hold the number, then tap Add to contacts.
- 3 Tap the desired contact, or tap Create new contact.
- 4 Edit the contact details and tap **Save**.

Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voicemail message when you cannot answer a call. Usually, the voicemail number is saved on the SIM card. If not, contact your service provider to get your voicemail number. You can then enter the number manually.

To enter your voicemail number

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Settings** > **Call settings** > **Voicemail**.
- 2 Enter your voicemail number.
- 3 Tap **OK**.

To call your voicemail service

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Touch and hold down 1.

More than one call

You can handle multiple calls at the same time by switching between the calls. You can turn on a notification to sound if you receive another call during an ongoing call (call waiting). If you have activated call waiting, you will be notified by a beep if you receive another call.

To activate or deactivate call waiting

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Call settings > GSM call settings.
- 3 To activate or deactivate call waiting, tap Call waiting.

To reject a second call

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap **Busy**.

To answer a second call and end the ongoing call

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap End call & answer.

To answer a second call and put the ongoing call on hold

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap **Answer**.

To make a second call

- 1 During an ongoing call, press \(\mathbb{H} \), then tap \(\mathbb{+} \).
- 2 Enter the number of the recipient and tap Call.
- 3 If the recipient answers, the first call is put on hold.
- The same procedure applies to subsequent calls.

To switch between multiple calls

• To switch to the next call and put the current call on hold, tap Swap calls.

To end the ongoing call and return to the next call on hold

• Tap End call.

Conference calls

With a conference or multiparty call, you can have a joint conversation with two or more persons.

To start a conference call

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Dial the number to the first participant and tap Call.

To add another participant to a conference call

- 1 During the call, press \; then tap +.
- 2 Dial the number to the second participant and tap Call.
- When the second participant has answered, press \mathbb{H} , then tap \mathbb{L} .

To have a private conversation with a participant

- 1 During the call, press :; then tap \(\frac{1}{2} \).
- 2 Tap 🍇 next to the desired participant.
- 3 To return to the conference call, press \; then tap \(\frac{1}{2} \).

To release a participant

- 1 During the call, press : then tap ...
- 2 Tap next to the desired participant.

To end a conference call

• During the call, tap End call.

Call settings

Forwarding calls

You can forward calls, for example, to another phone number, or to an answering service.

To forward calls

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > GSM call settings > Call forwarding.
- 3 Select an option.
- 4 Enter the number you want to forward the calls to and tap **Enable**.

To turn off call forwarding

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > GSM call settings > Call forwarding.
- 3 Select an option.
- 4 Tap Disable.

Showing or hiding your phone number

You can select to show or hide the phone number that is displayed on call recipients' devices when you call them.

To show or hide your phone number

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > GSM call settings > Caller ID.
- 3 Select an option.

Fixed Dialing Numbers

If you have received a PIN2 code from your service provider, you can use a list of Fixed Dialing Numbers (FDN) to restrict outgoing and incoming calls.

To enable or disable fixed dialing

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > Fixed Dialing Numbers.
- 3 Tap Enable FDN or Disable FDN.
- 4 Enter your PIN2 and tap **OK**.

To access the list of accepted call recipients

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > Fixed Dialing Numbers > FDN list.

Contacts

In **Phonebook**, you can enter all your information for your personal contacts, for example, phone numbers, email adresses and web service accounts. When you view a contact, you get quick access to all communication with that contact.

To view your contacts

- From the Home screen, tap the applications bar, then tap Phonebook.
- From the Home screen, tap Dialer > Contacts
- The first time you open **Phonebook**, a setup wizard starts. You can set up your phone for synchronising contacts with an online service, and you can import contacts from your SIM card or memory card.

Managing contacts

To add a contact

- 2 Press III, then tap New contact.
- 3 Enter the name of the contact.
- 4 Enter or select the desired additional information for the contact.
- 5 When you are finished, tap **Save**.
- If you add a plus sign and the country code before a contact phone number, you can use the number for making calls from other countries.

To search for a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Enter the first few letters of the contact name in the search field. All contacts beginning with those letters appear.

To edit a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Tap the contact you want to edit.
- 3 Tap Edit.
- 4 Edit the desired information and tap Save.

To delete contacts

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Press : then tap Delete contacts.
- 3 Mark the contacts you want to delete, or tap Mark all if you want to delete all contacts.
- 4 Tap Delete.

To call a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Tap the contact.
- 3 Tap the desired phone number of the contact.
- 4 If desired, edit the number. Tap Call.

To edit contact information about yourself

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Tap My number: at the top of the contact list.
- 3 Tap Edit.
- 4 Enter the new information or make the changes you want.
- 5 When you are done, tap **Save**.

To send your business card via Bluetooth wireless technology

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Tap My number:.
- 3 Press ;; then tap Send business card.
- 4 Select a device from the list.

Favourites

You can mark a contact as a favourite. The **Favorites** list provides quick access to the contacts you have marked.

To mark a contact as a favourite

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Tap the contact you want to mark.
- 3 Tap ★.

Linking phone and web content to a contact

By using photo tags, you can link photos to a contact. You can also link a phone contact to some of the contact's web service accounts.

To add a photo to a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Tap the contact.
- 3 Tap Edit.
- 4 Tap ⊕ 1
- 5 Select **Camera roll** if you want to add a saved photo to the contact, or **Camera** if you want to take a photo and add it.
- 6 When you have added the photo, it appears next to the contact name. Tap Save to confirm.

To link a web service contact to a phone contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Tap the contact.
- 3 Tap Edit.
- 4 Tap next to Link contact.
- 5 Select a web service. A list of your contacts for that web service appears.
- 6 Select the contact you want to link to the phone contact.
- 7 Tap **Save** to confirm.

The contact information filter

When you are viewing a contact, you can tap or flick through the filter options at the bottom of the screen:

Info	Contact phone numbers and addresses
Call log	Call history for the contact
Messaging	All text and multimedia message conversations with the contact
Email	All email messages from the contact
My photos	All photos in the photo album which are linked to the contact
Twitter	All Twitter status updates for the contact. Appears if you have linked a Twitter account to the contact
Facebook	All Facebook status updates for the contact. Appears if you have linked a Facebook account to the contact

Backing up contacts

You can use the memory card and SIM card for backing up contacts. This is useful, for example, when you want to transfer the contact information to another phone.

You can also use a synchronisation service for backing up your contacts. For more information, see Synchronising and handling content on page 8.

To back up all contacts on the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Press :, then tap More > Back up contacts > Memory card.
- 3 Tap OK.

To import contacts from the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Press ::, then tap More > Import contacts > Memory card.
- A list appears showing different backup batches of all phone contacts, with the corresponding dates for when they were created. Select the desired backup.
- 4 Select Add contacts or Replace all contacts.

To back up names and numbers on the SIM card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Press :, then tap More > Back up contacts > SIM card.
- 3 Mark the contacts you want to copy, or tap Mark all.
- 4 Tap Back up.
- 5 Select Add contacts or Replace all contacts.
- If you select Replace all contacts, all existing SIM card information is replaced.
- When you copy a contact to the SIM card, only the contact name and one number is saved. This is due to limited memory on a SIM card.

To import contacts from the SIM card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Phonebook**.
- 2 Press :, then tap More > Import contacts > SIM card.

SMS and MMS

Before using SMS and MMS

You can send and receive text messages from your phone using SMS (Short Message Service). If your subscription includes MMS (Multimedia Messaging Service), you can also send and receive messages that contain media files, for example, pictures and videos. A single text message may contain up to 160 characters. Longer messages are concatenated and sent as multiple messages. You are charged for each of the messages sent.

Using SMS and MMS

To create and send a message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Tap New message.
- 3 Enter one or more recipient numbers or email addresses.
- 4 Enter your message text.
- If you want to add a photo, video or sound, press \; then tap **Attach** and select an option.
- 6 Tap Send.

To receive and read a message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread from the list.
- 3 If the received message is an multimedia message, tap **Download** if you have not enabled automatic download.
- 4 If the received message contains a music or a video, tap **▶** to play.
- When you receive a text or multimedia message, appears in the status bar. To read the message, you can also drag the status bar downwards.

To delete a message thread

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread.
- 3 Press :, then tap More > Delete thread.

To save a number in a received message to a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread.
- 3 Press : then tap More > Add to Contacts.
- 4 Tap the contact you want to add the number to, or tap Create new contact.

To save a multimedia message attachment

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread.
- 3 Touch and hold the attachment, then tap Copy attached to SD card.

To change the notification settings for messages

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press #, then tap **Settings**.
- 3 Select an option.

To change the download settings for received multimedia messages

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press :::, then tap **Settings**.
- 3 If you want received multimedia messages to be downloaded automatically, mark the **Auto-retrieve** checkbox.
- 4 If you also want received multimedia messages do be downloaded automatically when roaming, mark the **Roaming auto-retrieve** checkbox.

To back up messages on the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press ;; then tap Save to SD.

To import messages from the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press :::, then tap Import from SD.

To delete all message threads

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press ;; then tap Delete threads.

Email

You can use your phone to send and receive emails through your regular email account.

You can set up synchronisation with a Microsoft® Exchange Server by using the Moxier™ Sync application in your phone. You can then use the Moxier™ Mail application in your phone with your Microsoft® Exchange Server email account. See www.moxier.com for more information.

Setting up email

For the first email account that you set up in the **Email** setup wizard, you can view received email messages in Sony Ericsson TimescapeTM.

To set up an email account in your phone for the first time

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Tap Next.
- 3 Enter your email address and password, and tap **Done**.
- 4 Tap **Next**.
- If the phone cannot download your email account settings automatically, tap **Manual** setup and enter the account settings manually.
- 6 Enter an account name and the name you want displayed on outgoing messages. Tap **Done**.
- If you need to enter the settings manually, contact your email service provider for the correct email account settings. For example, you need to know if the account type is POP3 or IMAP.

Using email

- 6 Enter the message text.
- 7 To attach a file, press \; then tap **Add attachment** and select a file.
- 8 Tap Send.

To receive and open email messages

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 If you have several accounts, select the account you want to access.
- 3 To update the inbox with new messages, press \; then tap **Refresh**.
- 4 To open and read a message, tap the message.
- If you have changed the email settings and set an **Email checking frequency**, appears in the status bar when you receive a new message. You can drag the status bar downwards to read the message.

To save email message attachment

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select the account that received the relevant message.
- 3 Tap the message. The attachments appear in a list at the bottom of the view.
- 4 Select the attachment you want to save and tap **Save**. The attachment is saved to the memory card.

To reply to an email message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 If you have several accounts, select the account that received the relevant message.
- Tap the message you want to reply to.
- 4 Tap Reply or Reply all.
- 5 Enter text and tap **Send**.

To forward an email message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 If you have several accounts, select the account that received the relevant message.
- 3 Touch and hold the message, then tap **Forward**.
- 4 The message appears with quoted text and attachments. To remove the quoted text or attachment, tap **x**.
- 5 Enter some text, if desired, and tap **Send**.

To delete an email message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 If you have several accounts, select the account that received the relevant message.
- 3 Touch and hold the message, then tap **Delete**.

Email accounts

To change the settings for an email account

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Press :::, then tap Accounts.
- 3 Touch and hold the desired account, then tap **Account settings**.
- 4 Tap **Email checking frequency** and select a check time interval.
- Mark the **Default account** checkbox if you want to use this account for all outgoing emails.
- Mark the **Email notifications** check box if you want notifications for new email messages to appear in the status bar.

To add an extra email account in your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Press #, then tap Accounts.
- 3 Press \; then tap Add account.
- 4 Enter the email address and password, and tap Done. If you want, mark the checkbox Send email from this account by default. Tap Next. If the settings for the email account cannot be downloaded automatically, tap Manual setup and complete the setup manually.
- 5 Enter an account name and the name you want displayed on outgoing messages. Tap **Done**.

To remove an email account from your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Press :, then tap Accounts.
- 3 Touch and hold the desired account, then tap Remove account > OK.

Google Mail™

If you have a Google[™] account, you can use it with the Google Mail[™] application in your phone. When you have set up the Google[™] account in your phone, you can chat using the Google Talk[™] application and synchronise the calendar application with your Google Calendar[™].

To open Google Mail™

From the Home screen, tap the applications bar, then tap Google Mail™.



Synchronising

Synchronising between your phone and computer is an easy and practical way to share the same contacts, messages, or calendar events on both devices. It is possible to synchronise your phone in several different ways, depending on your preferred service and the content you want to synchronise.

It is possible to use Sony Ericsson Sync to synchronise contacts, and to use Google™ Sync to synchronise your Google Mail™, Google Calendar™ and Google™ contacts. You can also set up a Microsoft® Exchange Server synchronisation by using the Moxier™ application in your phone. See www.moxier.com for more information.

Sony Ericsson Sync

Use the Sony Ericsson Sync application to synchronise bookmarks and contacts between your phone and your Sony Ericsson account. At www.sonyericsson.com/user you can then access, edit and add information from any computer with an Internet connection.

A Sony Ericsson account can be created and set up from your phone, or you can create one at www.sonyericsson.com/user.

Sony Ericsson Sync can be set up to connect to any SyncML™ service.

To select Sony Ericsson sync as the default synchronisation service

- 2 Tap Settings > Data synchronisation > Select sync application.
- 3 Select Sony Ericsson.

To set up Sony Ericsson sync in your phone

Google Sync™syncing service

To select Google Sync™ as the default synchronisation service

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Data synchronisation > Select sync application.
- 3 Select Google.

To set up automatic synchronisations in Google Sync™

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Synchronise data.
- 3 Tap Google sync.
- 4 Mark the **Background data** checkbox.
- 5 Mark the **Auto-sync** checkbox.
- 6 Mark the checkboxes for the synchronisation items you want to synchronise automatically.
- 7 Press <□.
- 8 Mark the checkbox to enable automatic synchronisation for Google Mail™.

To stop a synchronisation in Google Sync™

- 1 When synchronising, press :::.
- 2 Tap Cancel sync.

Wi-FiTM

Using Wi-Fi™ you can access the Internet wirelessly with your phone.

Before using Wi-Fi™

To be able to browse the Internet using a Wi-FiTM connection you need to search for and connect to an available Wi-Fi network and then open the Internet browser. The signal strength of the Wi-Fi network may differ depending on your phone's location. Moving closer to the Wi-Fi router might enhance the signal strength.

To turn on Wi-Fi™

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls.
- 3 Mark the Wi-Fi checkbox. The phone will now scan for available Wi-Fi networks.
- It may take a few seconds before the Wi-Fi connection is enabled.

To connect to a Wi-Fi™ network

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- Available Wi-Fi networks are displayed under **Wi-Fi networks**. The available networks may be open or secured. This is indicated by a next to the Wi-Fi network name.
- 4 Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If you are trying to connect to a protected Wi-Fi network, you are asked to enter the security key for that Wi-Fi network before you can connect to it. is displayed in the status bar once you are connected.
- The next time you connect to a Wi-Fi™ network the phone will remember the security key.

To connect to another Wi-Fi™ network

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings. Detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 3 Tap another Wi-Fi network to connect to it.

Wi-Fi™ network status

When you are connected to a Wi-Fi™ network or when there are Wi-Fi networks available in your vicinity, it is possible to see the status of these Wi-Fi networks. You can also enable the phone to notify you whenever a Wi-Fi network is detected.

To enable Wi-Fi™ network notification

- 1 Make sure Wi-Fi is turned on.
- 2 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 3 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 4 Tap Network notification.

To scan for Wi-Fi™ networks manually

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Press #.
- 4 Tap Scan. The phone scans for Wi-Fi networks and displays them in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 5 Tap a Wi-Fi network in the list to connect to the network.

Advanced Wi-Fi™ settings

Before you add a Wi-FI™ network manually, you need to turn on the Wi-Fi setting in your phone.

To add a Wi-Fi™ network manually

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Tap Add Wi-Fi network.
- 4 Enter the **Network SSID** name of the Wi-Fi network you want to add.
- 5 Tap the **Security** field to select a security type for the Wi-Fi network you want to add
- 6 Enter the Wireless password for the Wi-Fi network you want to add, if required.
- 7 Tap Save.
- Contact your Wi-Fi network administrator to get the Network SSID name and Wireless password.

To view detailed information on a connected Wi-Fi™ network

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Tap the Wi-Fi network that you are currently connected to. The detailed network information will be displayed.

Wi-Fi™ sleep policy

You can choose to disable the Wi-Fi™ functionality in your phone when the screen turns off by adding a Wi-Fi sleep policy. This will maximise the phone battery performance. You can also set the phone to never turn off the Wi-Fi functionality or to never turn it off when you are charging your phone.

The phone will use a 2G/3G mobile data connection to access the Internet if you are not connected to a Wi-Fi network.

To add a Wi-Fi™ sleep policy

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Press III.
- 4 Tap Advanced.
- 5 Tap Wi-Fi sleep policy.
- 6 Select a Wi-Fi sleep policy to use.

Using a static IP address

You can set up the phone to connect to a Wi-Fi™ network using a static IP address.

To set up a static IP address

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Press :::.
- 4 Tap Advanced.
- 5 Mark the **Use static IP** checkbox.
- 6 Tap and enter the information needed for your Wi-Fi network:
 - IP address
 - Gateway
 - Netmask
 - DNS 1
 - DNS 2
- 7 Press # and tap Save.

Web browser

The web browser in your phone is fully optimised and comes with advanced functionality such as wireless web and Google Search TM .

You must have a Wi-Fi or an active 2G/3G mobile data connection to access the Internet.

Before using the Internet

Your phone allows you to access the Internet using a Wi-Fi connection, or using a 2G/3G mobile data connection. To access the Internet with your phone using a 2G/3G mobile data connection, you need a phone subscription that includes data transmission and settings to use a 2G/3G mobile data connection.

In most cases, settings for connecting to the Internet using a 2G/3G mobile data connection will be automatically downloaded to your phone the first time you turn on the phone with a SIM card inserted.

To access the Internet using a Wi-Fi connection you need to be in range of a Wi-Fi network, and granted access by the network administrator.

See *Internet and messaging settings* on page 8 for more information on how to setup a 2G/3G mobile data connection or how to connect to a Wi-Fi network.

To open the browser

• From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Browser**.

To go to a web page

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \mathbb{H} and tap **Go**.
- 2 Enter the web page address using the keyboard. As you enter the address, matching web page addresses will appear on the screen. Tap the address to go directly to that web page or continue entering the web page address.
- 3 Tap **Go**.
- If the screen orientation does not change automatically when you turn the phone sideways, mark the Orientation check box under Settings > Sound & display.

To go to the previous page while browsing

Press <□.

To exit the browser

• To close all open windows and exit the **Browser**, press \mathbb{H} and tap **Exit**.

Viewing web pages

Web browser offers advanced features that let you view web pages just like on a desktop computer.

You can open up to 8 browser windows. You can easily switch from one website to another by opening several windows.

To open a new browser window

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \blacksquare and tap **New window** while browsing a web page. A new browser window opens in the default home page.
- 2 If two or more browser windows are open, press \(\mathrm{H}\) and tap \(\mathrm{Windows} \) to add more browser windows.

To switch between browser windows

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \boxplus and tap **Windows**.
- 2 On the **Current windows** screen, tap the browser window you want to view.
- 3 To open a new web page, tap New window.
- 4 To close a browser window, tap
 on the browser window you want to close.

To zoom in or out on a web page

- Drag your finger in any direction on the screen to activate the zoom controls on the web page.
- 2 Tap a zoom icon:



To find text within a web page

- 1 When you are viewing a web page, press \mathbb{H} and tap **More** > **Find on page**.
- 2 Enter the search item. As you enter, matching characters will be highlighted in green. Tap the left or right arrow to go to the previous or next matching item.
- 3 Tap x to close the search bar.

To copy text from a web page

- 1 Open and zoom out of the web page where you want to copy text.
- 2 Locate the text you want to copy.
- 3 Press # and tap More > Select text.
- 4 Place your finger at the start of the text you want to copy and then drag to the end of the text you want to copy. Copied text is highlighted in pink.
- 5 Release your finger from the screen.
- To paste text in an email, text message or multimedia message, touch and hold the text box on a message or email and tap **Paste** in the menu.

To auto-fit the web page

• From the **Browser** screen, press \blacksquare and tap **More** > **Settings** > **Auto-fit pages**. You will now be able to view the full web page on your screen.

To adjust browser settings

• From the **Browser** screen, press \boxplus and tap **More** > **Settings**.

To allow download of web applications

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press \cong and tap **Settings** > **Applications**.
- 2 Mark the **Unknown sources** check box.

To view your downloads

• From the **Browser** screen, press \mathbb{H} and tap **More** > **Downloads**.

To manage links in web pages

- 1 Open the web page where you want to manage the links.
- 2 Tap the link to open the web page. The links get enclosed in an orange box when selected.
- 3 Touch and hold the link to open a menu that allows you to open, bookmark, save, copy to the clipboard or share the link via email.
- 4 The **Browser** also recognises some phone numbers and addresses that allow you to call the phone number or locate the address in Google Maps™.
- 5 Tap the address or the phone number to locate or call.
- Google Maps™ may not be available in every market.

Managing bookmarks and history

You can check history and store as many bookmarks on your phone as you want.

To bookmark a web page

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, go to the web page you want to bookmark.
- 2 Press # and tap **Bookmarks**. The bookmarks screen opens.
- 3 Tap Add bookmark.
- 4 Tap **Name** to change the name of the bookmark and tap **OK**.

To open a bookmark

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \boxplus and tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2 Tap the bookmark you want to open.
- 3 Touch and hold the bookmark to access the options from the menu, where you can open, edit, add a shortcut to, save, share and delete the bookmark.

To bookmark the last visited page

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \boxplus and tap **Bookmarks**. The bookmarks screen opens.
- Press \(\exists \) and tap **Bookmark last-viewed page**. The last web page you opened has now been saved to your bookmarks.

To edit a bookmark

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \boxplus and tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2 Touch and hold the bookmark you want to edit.
- 3 Tap Edit bookmark. The edit bookmark dialog box appears.
- 4 Enter your changes and tap **OK**.

To check browsing history

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \blacksquare and tap **Bookmarks** > the **History** tab. Tap an item to open the page.
- 2 To check your most visited web pages in the past, press \boxplus and tap **Bookmarks** > the **Most visited** tab.

To clear history

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press \boxplus and tap **Bookmarks** > the **History** tab.
- 2 Press \(\text{\text{and tap Clear history}} \).

Applications and content

You can personalise and find new ways to use your phone by downloading additional applications and content. Use the PlayNow™ service, the Android™ Market application store or browse the web to find useful applications, games, dictionaries, RSS readers, or anything your imagination allows.

Using Applications

You can install applications in your phone from sources other than Android™ Market. You can view and adjust settings for your installed applications. Many applications come with a wizard that helps you to install the application.

Note: Applications downloaded from websites other than Android™ Market could be of unknown or unreliable origin. To protect your phone and personal data, only download applications from trusted sources such as the Android™ Market application store.

To view permissions for an application in your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Tap the desired application.
- 4 Scroll to and tap Permissions.

To force stop an application

- When a popup window tells you that an application is not responding, tap Force stop.
- If you do not want to force stop an application, you can wait for the application to respond by tapping Cancel.

To clear all data for an application

- Before you clear all data for an installed application, make sure you have backed up all application-related content that you want to keep, including data saved in the application.
- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Tap the desired application.
- 4 Tap Clear data.

To delete an installed application

- Before you delete an installed application, make sure you have backed up all application-related content that you want to keep, including data saved in the application. It is not possible to delete some applications.
- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Tap the desired application.
- 4 Tap Uninstall.

Android™ Market

If you open Android™ Market you will enter a world of applications and games. You can browse the applications and games through categories and top downloads. You can also rate an application or a game and send feedback on it.

Before using Android[™] Market, you need to have a Google Mail[™] account. If you do not have a Google[™] account in your phone, please see *To set up a Google[™] account in your phone* on page 8

To open Android™ Market

To reply to an instant message with Google Talk

- 1 When someone contacts you on **Google Talk**, papears in the status bar.
- 2 Drag the status bar downwards, then tap the message and begin to chat.

Connecting your phone to a computer

By connecting your phone to a computer you can transfer and handle files such as pictures and music. You may not be allowed to exchange some copyright-protected material.

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable or by using Bluetooth™ wireless technology. When connecting your phone to a computer with a USB cable you will be able to install and use the PC Companion application on your computer. With the PC Companion application you can access additional applications to transfer and organise media files, update your phone and more.

Transferring and handling content using a USB cable

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable in order to manage files on your phone. From your computer's file explorer, you can then drag and drop content between your phone and the computer. Use the Media Go™ application on your computer when you transfer music, video and pictures or any other media files, to make sure they get adapted and transferred to your phone in correct and convenient way.

If you are running an application on your phone and the application is using the memory card, you may need to close the application in order to access the memory card.

To drag and drop content between the phone and a computer

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable. If you are asked to install PC Companion, tap Cancel. PC Companion can be set up later, to help you manage your phone on your computer.
- 2 Phone: Drag the status bar downwards and tap USB connected > Mount.
- 3 **Computer**: Wait until the phone memory and memory card appear as external disks in the file explorer.
- 4 **Computer**: Drag and drop selected files between the phone and the computer.
- When the memory card is mounted to the computer, the phone cannot access the memory card. Some functionality and applications in the phone, such as the camera, may not be accessible in that case.
- You can transfer files by using a USB cable on most devices and operating systems supporting a USB Mass Storage interface.

To disconnect the USB cable safely

- Do not disconnect the USB cable when transferring content as this may corrupt the content.
- 1 **Computer**: Make sure to enable the hardware to be safely removed.
- 2 Phone: Drag the status bar downwards.
- 3 Tap Turn off USB storage.
- 4 Tap Turn Off.
- 5 Disconnect the USB cable.
- Computer instructions may vary depending on your operating system. See the documentation of your computer's operating system for more information.

PC Companion

PC Companion enables you to access and use additional features and services connected to your phone, for example, the Media Go^{TM} application, to transfer music, video and pictures. You can also update your phone to get the latest software available.

You need one of these operating systems to use the PC Companion application:

- Microsoft® Windows 7
- Microsoft® Windows Vista®
- Microsoft® Windows® XP, Service Pack 3 or higher

Connect your phone and computer with a USB cable to install and use PC Companion.

To install PC Companion

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable.
- 2 Phone: Tap Start in the PC Companion installation window.
- 3 **Computer**: PC Companion automatically starts on your computer after a few seconds. Follow the on-screen instructions to install PC Companion.

To use PC Companion

- **Phone**: Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable. If you are asked to install PC Companion, and you have already done so, tap **Cancel** and mark the checkbox to stop asking to install PC Companion.
- 2 Phone: Drag the status bar downwards and tap USB connected > Mount.
- 3 **Computer**: PC Companion automatically starts on your computer after a few seconds. You can also start it manually from the start menu of your computer.

Media Go™

The Media Go[™] computer application helps you transfer and manage media content in your phone and computer. Install the Media Go[™] application from the PC Companion application. See *PC Companion* on page 56 for more information.

To learn more about how to use the Media Go[™] application, see the help section in the main menu of the Media Go[™] application.

To transfer content using the Media Go™ application

Bluetooth™ wireless technology

The Bluetooth[™] function creates a wireless connection to other Bluetooth[™] devices, for example, handsfree devices. A range within 10 metres (33 feet), with no solid objects in between, is recommended. You must turn on the Bluetooth[™] function to communicate with other devices. You may also have to pair your phone with other Bluetooth[™] devices.

To turn on the Bluetooth™ function and make the phone visible

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls.
- 3 Mark the **Bluetooth** checkbox. 👔 will be displayed in the status bar.
- 4 Tap Bluetooth settings.
- 5 Mark the **Discoverable** checkbox. The phone will now be visible to other devices for 120 seconds.

Phone name

You can enter a name for your phone that is shown to other devices when using Bluetooth™ wireless technology.

To enter a phone name

- 1 Make sure Bluetooth is turned on.
- 2 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 3 Tap Settings > Bluetooth settings > Device name.
- 4 Enter the phone name.
- 5 Tap **OK**.

Pairing with another Bluetooth™ device

When you pair your phone with another device, you can, for example, connect your phone to a Bluetooth[™] handsfree or a Bluetooth car kit and use these devices to make and receive calls.

Once you have paired your phone with a Bluetooth device the phone will remember this pairing. When pairing the phone with a Bluetooth device, you may need to enter a passcode. Your phone will automatically try the generic passcode 0000. If this does not work, see the documentation of your Bluetooth device for the passcode used by your Bluetooth device. You do not need to re-enter the passcode the next time you connect to a paired Bluetooth device.

Some Bluetooth devices, for example, most Bluetooth headsets, require you to also create a connection to the Bluetooth device in order for it to work properly.

You can pair your phone with several Bluetooth devices, but only connect to one Bluetooth profile at the same time. The following Bluetooth profiles are supported by the phone: Headset, Handsfree, A2DP, AVRCP, and OPP/FTP.

To pair the phone with another Bluetooth™ device

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings.
- 3 Tap Scan for devices. The Bluetooth devices found will be listed under Bluetooth devices.

- 6 You can now start using the paired Bluetooth device. The status of the pairing and connection is shown below the name of the Bluetooth device in the **Bluetooth** devices list.
- Make sure that the device you want to pair your phone with has the Bluetooth™ function activated and Bluetooth visibility turned on.

Podcasts

To open the TrackID™ application

From the Home screen, tap the applications bar and tap TrackID™.

To search for track information



Tips when using the camera

Rule of thirds

Don't place your subject in the middle of the frame. By placing it a third of the way in, you achieve a better result.

Hold it steady

Avoid blurry photos by holding the camera steady. Try to steady your hand by leaning it against a solid object.

Get closer

By getting as close as possible to your subject, you can fill the viewfinder with your subject.

Consider variety

Think about different angles, and move towards the subject. Take some vertical photos. Try different positions.

Use a plain background

A plain background helps highlight your subject.

Keep your lens clean

Mobile phones are used in all kinds of weather and places, and carried in pockets and bags. This results in the camera lens becoming dirty and covered with fingerprints. Use a soft cloth to clean the lens.

- Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable. If it is the first time you start PC Companion you have to install it before moving on to the next step. Follow the on-screen instructions in the menu displayed in your phone to install PC Companion.
- Drag the status bar downwards and tap **USB connected** > **Mount**.
- Computer: Wait a few seconds for PC Companion to start. You can also start it manually from the start menu of your computer. Click Support Zone and follow the on-screen instructions to update your phone.
- While using PC Companion, you will also be automatically notified whenever there are available software updates for your phone.

Location services

There are two ways to find your location, using Mobile networks or GPS technology. Mobile networks technology determines your position fast but accuracy may vary. If you use GPS technology it may take a little longer, but it will find your exact position. You can enable both Mobile networks and GPS to benefit from both technologies when trying to find your position.

GPS

Your phone has a GPS receiver that uses satellite signals to calculate your location. Some GPS features use the Internet. Data rates and charges may apply.

When you use features that require the GPS receiver to find your location, make sure you have a clear view of the sky. If the GPS receiver does not find your location after a few minutes, you should move to another location. To help the search, stand still and do not cover the GPS antenna. The first time you use the GPS it may take up to 10 minutes before your location is found.

Assisted GPS

Assisted GPS helps calculate your location more quickly.

To enable Assisted GPS

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Location.
- 3 Mark the Assisted GPS check box.

Google Maps™

The Google Maps[™] application lets you view your current location, find other locations and calculate routes. When you start the Google Maps[™] application, your approximate location

is shown using information from nearby mobile towers. Your location is updated with a more precise position when the GPS receiver finds your location.

- Make sure you enable the location settings before trying to get your position.
- If the screen orientation does not change automatically when you turn the phone sideways, mark the Orientation check box under Settings > Sound & display.

To use Google Maps™

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Maps.
- The Google Maps™ application may not be available in every market.

To delete an alarm

- On the Alarm clock screen, tap the alarm you want to delete.
 On the Set alarm screen, press ::
- 5 Tap **Delete alarm**.

Locking and protecting your phone

IMEI number

Keep a copy of your IMEI (International Mobile Equipment Identity) number in case your phone is stolen.

To view your IMEI number



You can find the IMEI number under the battery.

SIM card protection

This lock only protects your subscription. Your phone will work with a new SIM card. If the lock is on, you have to enter a PIN (Personal Identity Number). If you enter your PIN incorrectly more times than the maximum number of attempts allowed, your SIM card will become blocked. You need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) and then a new PIN. Your PIN, PIN2 and PUK are supplied by your network operator.

To enable the SIM card PIN lock

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Security & location > Set up SIM card lock > Lock SIM card.
- 3 Enter the SIM card PIN and tap **OK**.

To change the SIM card PIN

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Security & location > Set up SIM card lock > Change SIM PIN.
- 3 Enter the old SIM card PIN and tap OK.
- 4 Enter the new SIM card PIN and tap **OK**.

To change the SIM card PIN2

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Call settings > Fixed Dialing Numbers > Change PIN2.
- 3 Enter the old SIM card PIN2 and tap **OK**.
- 4 Enter the new SIM card PIN and tap **OK**.

To unblock the locked SIM card

- 1 When Your SIM card is PUK-locked. Enter the PUK code to unlock it. appears, enter the PUK code and tap OK.
- 2 Enter a new PIN code and tap OK.
- 3 Repeat the new PIN code and tap **OK**.
- If you enter an incorrect PUK code too many times, the SIM card will be blocked. You will then need to contact your service provider to get a new SIM card.

Screen unlock pattern

You can secure data in your phone by using a screen unlock pattern every time your phone is turned on or every time it is activated from sleep mode.

It is important that you remember your screen unlock pattern. If you forget it, you have to take the phone to your local Sony Ericsson retailer.

To create a screen unlock pattern

Common questions

My phone is not working as expected

If you experience problems with your phone, check these tips before you try anything else:

- Update your phone. Regardless if you have the latest software, running Update Service can improve the software stability and solve problems. Updating your phone will also make sure you get an optimal performance and the latest enhancements. See Updating your phone on page 87 for more information.
- Reset your phone.



Be patient while restarting or resetting your phone. Removing the battery during reboot or reset may damage the phone permanently.

Resetting the phone

Resetting the phone deletes all data, including downloaded applications, and resets the phone back to its initial state, the state before you turned on the phone for the first time. Make sure to back up important data you have on the phone before you reset the phone.

To reset the phone

- 2 Tap Settings > SD card & phone storage > Factory data reset > Reset phone.
- 3 Tap Erase everything.

I cannot charge the phone or battery capacity is low

The charger is not properly connected or the battery connection is poor. Remove the battery and clean the connectors.

The battery is worn out and needs to be replaced. See Charging the battery on page 10.

No battery charging icon appears when I start charging the phone

It may take a few minutes before the battery icon appears on the screen.

I cannot transfer content between my phone and the computer, when using a USB cable

The software or the USB drivers have not been properly installed. Go to www.sonyericsson.com/support for more detailed installation instructions and troubleshooting sections.

I cannot use Internet-based services

Make sure your subscription includes data download, and that the Internet settings in your phone are correct.

Error messages

No network coverage
